## Letter from the Chair

Dear Residents,

Your Berlin Township's trustees have been working diligently on many issues that are important to you, but are sometimes not readily apparent. This includes building maintenance, road safety, cemetery attractiveness, and ease of communications and responsiveness.

In the Township Hall, we have recently installed new carpet, added new doors, upgraded our safety and security systems, and made minor repairs. These improvements, with the previous work of inside painting, new lighting and restroom fixtures, allow us to hold meetings and provide for gatherings in an attractive, safe environment. The fire station also has maintenance needs. As the fire station ages, (built in 2007) we will invest time and money in its maintenance, especially regarding the roof. Lastly regarding buildings, the trustees are planning another building for Road Maintenance equipment. It will likely be built to the east of the current building at 3271 Cheshire Road. This building is needed to keep our road equipment in a ready-to-use mode and to reduce maintenance costs that arise from being left outdoors.

We seek to ensure that our roads are safe, long-lasting and efficient. We completed the widening of Piatt Road which allows us to focus more of our budget on the maintenance of our roads this year. Delaware County has also been busy in Berlin Township constructing a single lane peanut-shaped roundabout next to Berlin High School. Projected completion date of this project is August 26. We have asked the County, and they have been gracious to write an article in this newsletter about accessing this roundabout once it is completed.

Communication is important to every successful entity. We continue to work on improving the efficacy in our communications system both internally and externally. It is expensive and time consuming, yet the trustees know that it is imperative that we continually improve in this. In this newsletter, we are seeking your input regarding Parks and Trails through a survey. Please let us know what you feel about these possible services. It is important that you fill out each question. Also, let us know in what other ways we may improve our communication with you.

The Roads and Maintenance department has done a great job with utilizing cemetery grant money to fix headstones at Fairview Cemetery. Also, Cheshire Cemetery continues to be one the nicest maintained cemeteries in all of Delaware County thanks the continued great efforts of long-time Cemetery Sexton Larry Buell..

**Civic Opportunities.** As the township continues to grow so to does our need for continued growth in our staff and volunteers. We are looking to expand the Roads Department, Cemetery, and Zoning over the next term with a variety of positions available. Berlin Township has a contract agreement with Rumpke services, who has expanded services to include additional recyclables over the last year. Also, all township residents can take advantage of the Delaware, Knox, Marion, and Morrow (DKMM) Solid Waste District. ## Roads Update

As we head into Fall, the projects of the 2022 season will be coming to a close. Asphalt and protective coatings throughout selective neighborhoods have turned out good with very few issues. Safety on our Township roadways have all ways been at the top of our priority list even more now that we have so much new building and construction. Please always slow down through these work areas and watch for all distractions.

Berlin Township road crews not only take care of road issues but also take care of maintenance in the Township Cemeteries. This year the Township was awarded a grant to begin to straightening and leveling the flush mounted headstones in the Fairview Cemetery. The Road crew was able to fix 77 stones of misalignment which took about one week to accomplish. Berlin Township will be applying for more grant money in order to keep up with the maintenance of the Fairview Cemetery.

Moving forward we would ask our community to please put trash cans at the end of driveways or in the street lawn area. Having a trash can in the street creates hazards for the motoring public and has created quite an issue for snow plowing in the winter. When plow drivers have to navigate around trash cans it slows down the over all response time we have for each neighborhood.

#### **ROUNDABOUT INFORMATION**

The new peanut-shaped roundabout is under construction at the Berlin Station Road/Piatt Road intersection. Despite its unique shape, it operates the same as a circular roundabout. Here are some DOs and DON'Ts for vehicles to safely navigate this intersection.

**DO** - Turn right to enter the roundabout DON'T - Attempt to turn left (you'll be going the wrong way!)


**DO** - Yield to traffic already in the roundabout DON'T - Stop in the roundabout **DO** - Travel around the roundabout counterclockwise

**DO** - Clear the roundabout for emergency vehicles (Do not stop in the roundabout).**DO** - Yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk.

#### For pedestrians:

**DO** - use the designated crosswalks and paths

**DO** - yield the right-of-way to all vehicles when outside the designated crosswalk


### From the Fire Chief's Desk
