She asked why it stops before it gets to the road and why many developments are required to build MUTs when they appear to be incomplete. Trustee Raehll said this is something the committee should discuss. This may be a good opportunity for grant funds. An issue may be that even though the township approves the construction of the few feet of trail it takes to meet the road, a maintenance agreement with Berlin Farms may be needed in order to keep that portion in good condition. Trustee Raehll explained how increases in state funding grants could be used to do smaller projects like this throughout the township. She suggested Ms. Cerny and other concerned residents initiate a conversation with the developer to complete construction of this particular trail. Ms. Littleton asked if situations like this could be addressed in the CLUP (Comprehensive Land Use Plan). Trustee Raehll said it could be something to consider.	
83 84 85 86 87 88	She hopes the Parks and Trails Master Plan will be complete before the CLUP is updated. This way developers will understand our MUT expectations. She believes our biggest challenge will be constructing trails through yards of established home owners. When Ms. Lucas spoke with Paul from Genoa Township, he said that was a challenge they encountered as well. They spoke with individual home owners, where they eventually reached an agreement on plantings to screen the homes from the trail.
