





K.W. and Jeff met Tuesday and reviewed Plans. The Council Members need to approve plans so that the Architect can get bids for the Public Service Training Facility.

Approved architect plans and agreed to let architect bid out project.

COUNCIL MEETING
November 6, 2023**

The Chatsworth City Council met in regular session on Monday, November 6, 2023, at 6:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers of City Hall with Mayor K.W. Gong presiding.

PRESENT: Mayor K.W. Gong Aldermen: Fred Welch, Jeff Cloer, Rhett Griffin, and Terry Crump. Also in attendance was City Clerk, Linda Penland, and City Attorney, Steve Williams.

MINUTES:

AGENDA:

Mayor Gong called the meeting to order on November 6, 2023, at 6:00 P.M. He presented the minutes of the last meeting and the agenda of the current meeting for review. Mayor Gong asked if there are any proposed changes to the minutes or the agenda.

City Attorney Steve Williams reminded the Mayor and Council to amend the amendment to put in this Public Resolution about Opting Out the Class Action Award that is in your packet.

Alderman Welch "I make a motion we approve the minutes and the agenda for tonight's meeting with the amending the agenda to post the Resolution to the agenda." The Mayor added that the Resolution would be amended to have the Clerk's signature removed and to add the Mayor's signature to the signature line.

Alderman Griffin seconded the motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting and the amended agenda for this meeting. The motion passed unanimously 4 to 0.

OLD BUSINESS:

Approval for the date of the Street Department collecting bulk collection only on Mondays to start on November 20, 2023. The Mayor commented that this approval would be published in the paper and be placed on the City of Chatsworth's Webpage. The garbage and other scheduled pickups will continue as scheduled on the appropriate dates. An additional approval is not needed since it was previously approved in October. Alderman Welch stated that this is a change in policy.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Mayor discussed a Special Called Meeting with Carlson and Carlson about the "Public Service Training Facility" project. The Mayor continued discussing that they went over the building will be 40 X 120. The plans were gone over with a couple of minor adjustments that were proposed and the Council and I agreed to those adjustments. The Mayor and Council approved these items on October 12, 2023, during a Special Called Meeting. These items were approved:

Public Notice: The City of Chatsworth has set an Open Sealed Bid Date and Time on November 21, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. The opening of the sealed bids is located in City Hall for building the "Public Service Training Facility." City Hall is located at 400 North Third (3rd) Avenue Chatsworth, Georgia 30705. The Public is invited to attend. The Mayor stated that this is the building I was speaking of earlier. This building will be located behind the Fire Department. We have asked the Architect to send out notices to Gordon, Murray and Whitfield Counties to help local companies. Mayor Gong reiterated that the Public is invited to attend when we open the sealed bids.

Request the Approval to pay Carlson & Carlson \$18,000.00 for Architect Services out of ARPA Funds for designing the project "Public Service Training Facility." The Mayor asks that the Council look at their packets for a copy of the bill. Alderman Welch makes a motion to pay the bill out of ARPA funds. Alderman Cloer seconds the motion. The motion was voted on and passed with a vote of 4 to 0.

Request to reschedule January Council Meeting to January 8, 2024. First Monday, January 1, 2024, is New Year's Day. Alderman Crump makes a motion to reschedule the January Council meeting. Alderman Griffin seconds the motion. The motion passed unanimously by the Mayor and the Council.

The Mayor said this has been discussed for about three or four months the request to approve for the Proposed Resolution designating the alleyway of Block LL running between East Cherokee Street and East Market Street as a one-way-lane. The Mayor commented that the City is trying to "squeeze" in the paving of this alleyway. Alderman Welch makes a motion to approve the Resolution. Alderman Cloer supports the resolution with a second on the motion. The resolution with a motion and a second passes unanimously.

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 112023

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE ALLEYWAY OF BLOCK LL RUNNING BETWEEN
EAST CHEROKEE STREET AND EAST MARKET STREET AS A ONE-WAY-LANE

WHEREAS, the City of Chatsworth has been petitioned by property and business owners in Block LL with adjoining property to the alleyway between East Cherokee and East Market Streets to have the change in the flow of the traffic as one-way;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council is authorized to determine and designate one-way streets or alleys and shall place and maintain official traffic-control devices giving notice thereof;

WHEREAS, this Resolution would authorize the City to convert the City's portion of the alleyway in Block LL running parallel between East Cherokee and Street East Market Street a one-way flow of traffic;

WHEREAS, the City owns and maintains the alleyway which is of insufficient width to allow for two-way traffic; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to post one-way traffic signs and one-way "Do Not Enter" signs as appropriate to notify the motoring public of the one-way flow of traffic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council, of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, here officially designates the alleyway of Block LL running parallel between East Cherokee and East Market Streets be of One-Way flow of traffic running North to South.

2023 Stormwater update by Dolley Flood, Stormwater Administrator started with, this is an annual update that is mandated by the EPD. This is part of the implementation of the Stormwater Program. The City of Chatsworth with the support of Chatsworth Water Works and City Departments will continue to improve the Stormwater Program. Ms. Flood continued to say that the City will continue to make improvements annually. On November 9, 2023, and EPD representative will meet with our team to review the implementation and administration of the City's Stormwater Program. During this evaluation, the EPD Representative will review all the documentation as well as inspect two privately owned retention ponds and possibly a dry weather stream. During these inspections, the EPD Representative will make comments regarding these inspections. Ms. Flood continued the presentation to provide highlights to the City's Stormwater Program. She also spoke about the collaboration of Johnathan Wells and Jordan Brown to develop a system to track Erosion Control and Stormwater Permit Applications as well as plan reviews in addition to all inspections required by the EPD. The EPD Compliance Inspection will again be on November 9, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. Ms. Flood continues to keep the Mayor and Council abreast of notices sent to City Residents and City Businesses concerning Stormwater infractions. There have been no complaints concerning Stormwater infractions in 2023. Employee Training will be given on November 6, 2023. It is encouraged that Department Heads and City Officials attend this training. Ms. Flood comments that the more trainings and trainees attending these trainings gives us more credits. The Swamp will have some improvements because of changes from the EPD. Johnathan Wells is working with the EPD to implement these changes. The Mayor adds to the presentation that Johnathon is overseeing Stormwater. Mr. Wells works with Chatsworth Water Works. He charges the City to create this report that is actually an audit. It costs the City about \$20,000 dollars. Mr. Wells has the qualifications to create this report and submit it to the EPD. The Mayor asks for a motion to accept Ms. Flood's report. Alderman Welch makes a motion. Alderman Crump seconds the motion. The acceptance of the report is accepted by all Alderman with a vote of 4 to 0.

Request Approval for Holiday Closures for November 10, 2023, (Veteran's Day) and November 23, and November 24, 2023 (Thanksgiving Holidays). Alderman Griffin makes a motion to close for the Holiday Closures. Alderman Cloer seconds the motion. The Aldermen support the request with a 4 to 0 vote.

Downtown Development Authority (DDA) requests the appointments of Pam Callahan-Alexander and Tyler Hord to the Downtown Development Authority's two vacant board seats. Their terms would start on January 1, 2024. Alderman Crump made a motion to accept the appointments. Alderman Welch seconds Alderman Crump's motion. The Council supports the Downtown Development Authority's appointments with a 4 to 0 vote.

Request approval of the First Reading of the Amendment to the Code of Ordinance of the City of Chatsworth Section 14-7 to be captioned as "Multipurpose Off-highway Vehicles" by creating section 14-7 allowing said vehicles under certain conditions. Mayor Gong elaborates this is a new law the State of Georgia passed. We have delayed this amendment because the State did not have the tags to fit on the back of the ATVs/Side by Sides. These tags are to be available on December 1, 2023. The Mayor continued that these vehicles would require seat belts, tags and insurance. The City is trying to adopt an ordinance with the right procedures and the vehicles will be handled the correct way in the City of Chatsworth. Alderman Griffin makes a motion for approval for the first reading. Alderman Crump seconds Alderman's motion. The first reading was passed with a 4 to 0 vote.

The Downtown Development Authority has requested to be placed on the agenda to address the Mayor and Council. The Downtown Development Authority did not address the Mayor and City Council.

The Mayor adds the Resolution City Attorney, Steve Williams gave to the Council at this meeting. The Resolution is to opt out on some settlements. There will be a change in the Resolution, instead of the City Clerk signing the document, the Mayor will sign the document. Alderman Welch said he would entertain the motion to change the Resolution to read the Mayor instead of the City Clerk. Alderman Crump seconded the motion. The amended resolution passed with a vote of 4 to 0.

RESOLUTION NO. ____

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA TO OPT OUT AND/OR FILE A REQUEST FOR EXCLUSION FROM THE NATIONWIDE CLASS SETTLEMENTS RELATED TO PFAS

WHEREAS, there have been nationwide class settlements entered into with multiple Defendants, including 3M Company, The Chemours Company, The Chemours Company FC, LLC, DuPont de Nemours, Inc., Corteva, Inc., and E.I. DuPont de Nemours and Company, in MDL 2873 in the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina, Charleston Division, 2:18-mn-02873-RMG;

WHEREAS, the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, wishes to opt out and/or file a Request for Exclusion to the aforementioned settlements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH, GEORGIA:

Section 1. That the City of Chatsworth finds that participation in the nationwide class PFAS settlements is not in the best interests of the City of Chatsworth.

Section 2. That the City of Chatsworth hereby expresses its intention to opt out of and/or file a Request for Exclusion from the nationwide class PFAS settlements.

Section 3. That the City of Chatsworth's Mayor and General Manager of the Chatsworth

Water Works Commission are hereby expressly jointly authorized to execute the documentation necessary to opt the City of Chatsworth out of the nationwide class PFAS settlements, including but not limited to an affidavit and a Request for Exclusion.


Section 4. That the Mayor and the General Manger of the Chatsworth Water Works Commission are authorized to take such other action as necessary and appropriate to effectuate the

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City of Chatsworth's decision to opt out of and/or file a Request for Exclusion from the nationwide class PFAS settlements.
