Presentation of the second reading of an amendment to the City of Chatsworth "Solid Waste Collection."  
The ordinance reads as follows:

To amend Chapter 8 of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, captioned "Solid Waste Collection" by repealing existing Chapter 8 in its entirety and replacing there within a restated Chapter 8, still to be entitled Solid Waste Collection which shall constitute a

comprehensive Solid Waste Collection Ordinance for the City of Chatsworth; and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth and by the authority of same, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED as follows:

1. Repeal existing Chapter 8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, in its entirety replacing therewith a re-stated Chapter 8, still to be entitled "Solid Waste Collection", as follows:

SO ORDAINED, this 5th Day of April, 2021.

The foregoing ordinance received a first reading on March 1, 2021 and a second reading on April 5, 2021, upon section reading, a Motion for Passage of the Ordinance was made by Councilman Terry Crump, second by Councilman Jeff Cloer, and upon the question the vote is 4 ayes, and 0 nays, and the Ordinance is adopted.

The City reserves the right to increase or decrease rate as it feels necessary to recover cost of operations. The city may increase or decrease rates without prior notice.

#### DIVISION 16. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

##### Sec. 8-79.6 Pretreatment charges and fees.

The city may adopt reasonable fees for reimbursement of costs of setting up and operating the city's pretreatment program which may include:

- (1) Fees for wastewater discharge permit applications including the cost of processing such applications;
- (2) Fees for monitoring, inspection, and surveillance procedures including the cost of collection and analyzing a user's discharge, and reviewing monitoring reports submitted by users;
- (3) Fees for reviewing and responding to accidental discharge procedures and construction;
- (4) Fees for filing appeals; and
- (5) Other fees as the city may deem necessary to carry out the requirements contained herein. These fees relate solely to the matters covered by this article and are separate from all other fees, fines, and penalties chargeable by the city.

##### Sec. 8-79-7. Severability.

If any provision of this article is invalidated by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall not be effected and shall continue in full force and effect.

#### ARTICLE III. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION \*

##### Division 17 - Generally

##### Sec. 8-89 - Deposit of refuse on public or private property; use of city garbage containers; penalty.

- a. Generally. No person within the City shall throw or dispose of any paper, trash, fruit, fruit peelings, food scrapes or any other garbage or refuse of any kind on the streets, sidewalks, or other public roads or public places nor shall any of such things be left open and exposed on the premises of any person. Except as provided in section 8-92 herein, all such garbage must be placed in a garbage container provided by the city to be disposed of as provided in this section.
- b. Ownership and Use: Such garbage containers are and shall remain property of the city. It shall be unlawful to remove any such garbage container from the address to which it is assigned without the written permission from the director of public works. It shall be unlawful for the owner of the property to which any such garbage container is assigned to allow such garbage container to remain on the curbside later than midnight on the day of garbage collection or to deposit such garbage container on the curbside of the property earlier than 5:00 p.m. of the day immediately preceding the next scheduled garbage pickup. The garbage container shall be stored by the property owner when not on the curbside in such a manner that it is not visible from the curbside of the property.
- c. Penalty: Any person who shall violate this section shall be subject to the general penalty as set forth in section 10-17 of the code book. The director of public works and the chief of police and/or their designee are authorized and directed to make inspection for the orderly compliance with this section and to issue citations for any violation of this section.
- d. For the purposes of this section, only household garbage shall be placed in such garbage/receptacle containers.

##### Sec. 8-80. Definitions

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the respective meanings ascribed to them.

**Biomedical waste:** all waste defined as biomedical waste by the Solid Waste Management Act, or by rule and regulations promulgated by the Environmental Protection Division under the authority of that Act. It also includes wastes such as human tissues, organs, and body parts and fluids that are removed during surgery or autopsy, or other medical procedures and specimens of body fluids and their containers. The City of Chatsworth prohibits the pickup of this type of refuse collection.

**Bulky Waste:** Such items as large household appliances (i.e., washing machines, clothes dryers, water heaters, stove refrigerators, and dishwasher), furniture, tree stumps, larger timer, large bodies of carpet waste, large packing containers, tanks, and other items whose volumes are not significantly reduced through normal compaction methods.

**Business Day:** A calendar day other than Saturday, Sunday, or public and legal holiday as set forth in O.C.G.A.\* 1-4-1.

**Collection of refuse from residential property:** The term "refuse" is defined as follows: Refuse shall consist of nonhousehold garbage and shall include but not be limited to tree limbs, yard trimmings, leaves and other yard debris; carpet related waste; metal and metal goods; white goods; and paint and paint-related products. Construction or demolition waste means all waste defined as construction or demolition waste by the Solid Waste Management Act; or by the rules and regulations promulgated by Environmental Protection Division under the authority of that Act.

**Day:** A calendar day, unless otherwise specified

**Disposal or Dispose:** The discharge, deposit, discard, injection, dumping, spilling, leaking, throwing, or placing of any solid waste or hazardous waste into or on any land or body of water.

**Disposal Site:** The location where the final deposition of solid waste occurs.

**Dump:** To throw, discard, place deposit, discharge, bury, burn, or dispose, of a substance.

**Environmental Protection Agency:** The Environmental Protection Division of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, including but not limited to its director, and any successor entity or entities.

**Hazardous Waste:** All waste defined as hazardous waste by the Hazardous Waste Management Act, or by the rules and regulations promulgated by the Environmental Protection Division under the authority of that act.

**Hazardous Waste Management Act:** The Georgia Hazardous Waste Management Act, codified at O.C.G.A. \*\* 12-8-60 through 12-8-83, as the same has been heretofore or may be hereafter amended.

**Household Hazardous Waste:** Hazardous waste used or generated in the household or similar source or any item, product or material containing or contaminated by any household.

**Municipal Solid Waste:** Any solid waste derived from households, including garbage, trash, and sanitary waste from single family residences.

**Other Wastes:** Animal, fowl and fish excrement, entrails, bones, carcasses in whole or part of dead animals. City of Chatsworth prohibits the dumping of this type of waste.

**Putrescible Waste:** Wastes that are capable of being quickly decomposed by microorganisms. Examples of putrescible wastes include, but are not necessarily limited to, kitchen waste, animal manure, offal, and garbage.

**Recycling:** The process by which reclaimed resources are transformed into new products in such a manner that the original products may lose their identity.

**Refuse:** Shall consist of nonhousehold garbage and shall include but not be limited to tree limbs, scrub trimmings, leaves, and other yard debris, carpet related waste, and metal goods, appliances, and interior and exterior related products.

**Solid Waste:** Putrescible and nonputrescible waste except water-carried body waste and materials destined for recycling, and shall include garbage, ashes, street refuse, dead animals, animal manures, commercial waste, and demolition waste, food processing waste, yard trimmings and any other waste material in a solid or semi-solid state not otherwise defined in the division.

**Trash:** Yard wastes such as weeds, grass, leaves, small brush, small limbs and similar objects.

**Yard Trimmings/Refuse:** Leaves, brush, grass clippings, shrub and small tree pruning's, discarded Christmas trees, nursery and greenhouse vegetative residuals, and vegetative matter, resulting from landscaping development and maintenance other than agricultural, and silvicultural operations.

#### Sec. 8-81. Disposal of construction materials.

Contractors shall be responsible for disposing of any and all debris resulting from remodeling, roofing, repairing, demolition or construction of any type.

#### Sec. 8-82. Garbage Containers.

The City will not furnish any garbage container to commercial establishments and shall only empty garbage containers from residential property owners.

**Sec. 8-83. New residential containers**

The city public works director shall assign each new resident with a numbered garbage container. The garbage container shall be issued to the address of the residential property. Garbage picked up by the city must be bagged and placed within the garbage containers.

**Sec. 8-84. Condo Complex (Garbage)**

Units that have public street access, the city shall pickup single garbage containers with mechanical arm truck. Units located with the private street network of a condo complex, the homeowners association shall provide garbage service for the complex.

**Sec. 8-85. Occupants of business premises and multi-family residential**

Each business owner and multi-family establishments shall be responsible for trash service or the placement of a liter receptacle or private garbage container installed on such property, and such receptacle or garbage container shall be self contained or with openings that can be opened and closed. The City of Chatsworth shall not be responsible for picking up the self contained receptacles or privately owned garbage containers.

**Sec. 8-86-8-87. Reserved****Sec. 8-88. Garbage or trash from outside the city.**

It shall be unlawful for anyone to bring garbage or trash from outside the city and deposit it into trash containers inside the city limits.

**Sec. 8-89. On-Site burial of waste prohibited.**

The burial on a construction site of construction and demolition waste, litter, tree trunks, logs, limbs, and tops is prohibited.

**Sec. 8-90. Collected Items.**

The public works department shall collect items of refuse upon the following conditions:

1. Refuse shall be collected from residential property wholly within the corporate limits.
2. The refuse shall be generated wholly by the residential property owner or his/her lessee.
3. Refuse shall be placed upon the residential property on the curbside where the property and the and the right-of-way shall meet and shall not be placed upon any city street, alley, or right-of-way.
4. The maximum volume per collection pick-up shall be one truck load per weekly pickup days per resident.
5. Tree limbs, yard trinnings, leaves and other refuse. Provided, however, tree limbs, trunks, branches or cuttings shall not exceed eight feet or 200 pounds in weight in the units to be handled, and shall be stacked separately with the butt end parallel to the the center line of the street. ~~Use of the street.~~
6. Leaves, yard trimmings, limbs and other yard debris shall be separate into separate piles and and placed curbside. Yearly, leave pickup routes will begin on October 1st and ending the second week in February.
7. Carpet-related waste, metal and appliances shall be separated from other refuse.

**A. Limitations.**

The public works department shall not collect the following items of refuse.

1. Tires.
2. Paint and paint related products in liquid form.
3. Construction debris, demolition debris that were not from the residential dwelling.
4. Refuse generated from commercial activity.
5. Brush, stumps, tree trunks, and rock and concrete which result from ground clearing, grading and other activities involving the use of heavy equipment and machinery.

**B. Schedule.**

Refuse shall be collected from residents on weekly business days of Monday and Thursday, exceptions of holiday schedules.

**Sec. 8-91. Yard Trimmings.**

(a) Yard trimmings disposal regulations. Definitions:

Commercial solid waste: All types of solid waste generated by stores, offices, restaurants, warehouses and other non-manufacturing activities, excluding residential and industrial wastes.

Composting. The controlled biological decomposition of organic matter into a stable, odor-free humus.

Leachate collection system. A system at a landfill for collection of leachate which may percolate through the waste and into the soils surrounding the landfill.

**Municipal solid waste.** Any solid waste derived from households, including garbage, trash and sanitary waste in septic tanks and includes solid waste from single-family and multi-family residences, hotels and motels, bunkhouses, campgrounds, picnic grounds, and day use recreation areas. The term includes yard trimmings and commercial solid waste but does not include solid waste from mining, agriculture or silvaculture operations or industrial processes or operations.

**Municipal solid waste disposal facility.** Any facility or locations where the final deposition of any amount of municipal solid waste occurs, whether or not mixed with or including commercial or industrial solid waste, including but not limited to municipal solid waste landfills.

**Municipal solid waste landfill.** A disposal facility where any amount of municipal solid waste, whether or not mixed with or including commercial waste, industrial waste, nonhazardous sludge's or small quantity generator hazardous waste, is disposed of by means of placing an approved cover thereon.

**Yard trimmings.** Leaves, brush grass clippings, shrub and tree pruning's discarded Christmas trees, nursery and green house vegetative residuals, and vegetative matter resulting from landscaping development and maintenance, other than mining, agricultural and silvacultural operations.

(b) Placement and disposal of yard trimmings: Prohibitions.

(1) It shall be unlawful to place or mix yard trimmings and municipal solid waste within the city.

(2) Yard trimmings shall not be disposed at any municipal solid waste disposal facility having a liner and leachate collection system or requiring vertical expansion owned in full or part by the city.

(c) Sorting, storing, composting and collection yard trimmings. Yard trimmings shall be sorted and stored in separate sections from household garbage.

Sec. 8-92-8-100. Reserved.

#### ARTICLE IV. CROSS-CONNECTIONS, AUXILIARY INTAKE, BY-PASSES AND INTER-CONNECTIONS

Sec. 8-101. Definitions.

That the following definitions and terms shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this article.

**Auxiliary intake.** Any piping connection or other device whereby water may be secured from a source other than that normally used.

**By-pass:** Any system or piping or other arrangement whereby the water may be diverted around any part or portion of a water purification plant.

**Cross-connection.** Any physical connection whereby the public water supply is connected with any other water supply system, whether public or private, either inside or outside of any building or buildings, in such manner that a flow of water into the public water supply is possible either through the manipulation of valves or because of ineffective check or back-pressure valves; or because of any other arrangement.

**Inter-connection.** Any system or piping or other arrangement whereby the public water supply is connected directly with a sewer, drain, conduit, pool, storage reservoir, or other device which does or may contain sewerage or other waste or liquid which would be capable of imparting contamination to the public water supply.

**Person.** Any and all persons, natural or artificial, including, any individual firm or association, and any municipal corporation organized or existing under the laws of this or any other state or country.

**Public water supply.** The waterworks system furnishing water to the City of Chatsworth for general use and which supply is recognized as the public water supply by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources/Environmental Protection Division.

Terry, "I make a motion we adopt this as the second reading." Jeff seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Elizabeth Gould of DDA wished to address the council regarding facade grants and a strategic plan.

Ms. Gould presented the strategic plan survey which was made possible by a grant from Georgia Power. The team reached out to Dalton State and the Wright School of Business and provided the team that did the survey for us. Ms. Gould went over the highlights of the survey process and the results which was coordinated by Michelle Coneman and Dalton State.

The DDA is planning a festival in coordination with the Historical Society for the second weekend in June (June 12-13) called the Summerfest. Somewhere in the future we are looking at a facade grant program policy and street scape.

Willie Winkler of the Maddox Farm Development wishes to address the council.

Mr. Winkler was not present. Mayor Gong advised that when the development was approved, it was approved as condominiums and the change requested is to change it to townhouses.

Fred, "I make a recommendation we change the wording to townhouses." Terry seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

The Chatsworth Housing Authority requests the re-appointment of Rhett Griffin for a five year term.

(2021-2026)

Fred, "I make a motion we make the re-appointment." Terry seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 3 to 0. Rhett abstained.

Discussion proceeded regarding the Keep Chatsworth Murray Beautiful location on First Avenue designated as an outdoor classroom. It was discussed to take the property back due to lack of use and neglect. It was agreed to give them thirty (30) days to remove any of their property they choose to keep.

Fred, "I make a motion we proceed with this process." Jeff seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.

Mayor Gong called for a motion to adjourn.

Fred, "I so move." Terry seconded and the motion passed by a vote of 4 to 0.
