Presentation of an amendment to the Chatsworth Zoning Ordinance for second reading. The amendment reads as follows:

AMENDMENT TO THE CITY OF CHATSWORTH ZONING ORDINANCE

ARTICLE XIV: SECTION (F) ADMINISTRATION

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth has determined that it is in the best interest of the public to amend the Chatsworth Zoning Ordinance Regulations.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth and the authority of same,

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED as follows:

Amend Article XIV - Section F. Maximum Number of Permits, The Zoning Administrator shall neither provide nor approve more than ten (10) permit applications to any one (1) applicant within a ninety (90) day period absent proof that the requested activity shall commence within the the ninety (90) day period. For purposes of this section, one (1) applicant shall constitute any person, corporation, partnerships, proprietorship, limited liability company, or other business organization and shall include any immediate family member such person and/or any other principal within any business organization with which such person is affiliated.

By striking Section F. Maximum Number of Permits and removing it in its entirety and repealing

Section F in its entirety from Article XIV - Administration.

This Amendment shall become effective following its enactment by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth, the public health, safety, and welfare requiring it. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clause, of this ordinance are severable and if any section shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or validity shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrase herein,

SO ORDAINED, this 4th day of January, 2021.

The foregoing Ordinance received its first reading on December 7, 2020 and a second reading on January 4, 2021. Upon section reading, a motion for passage of councilman Rhett Griffin, and upon the question, the vote is 4 ayes, 0 nays, and the Ordinance is adopted.

Presentation of an amendment to the sign ordinance for second reading. The ordinance reads as follows:

ORDINANCE

To amend Article IV, Section 4-6; Billboard Signs, of the Sign Ordinance of the City of Chatsworth, Captioned "Billboard Signs" by repealing subsection 4.6 in its entirety and replacing therewith a new subsection 4.6-1 through 4.6-7, still to be captioned Article IV and Section 4.6 Billboard Signs, and for other purposes

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Chatsworth, Georgia, and by the authority of the same, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED as follows:

1. Strike section 4-6 of the Code of the City of Chatsworth in its entirety and replace herewith as follows:

Sec. 4.6 Billboard Signs and General requirements

4.6-1 Billboard signs are only allowed on commercial (C-2 and C-3) or Industrial (M-1 and M-2) zoned parcels with the following corridors:

- a. U. S. Highway 411 south of its Intersection with Smyrna Church Road;
- b. U.S. Highway 411 north of its intersection with Old Federal Road;
- c. Industrial Boulevard;
- d. Duvall Road south of its Intersection with Industrial Boulevard;
- e. G. I. Maddox Parkway west of the Intersection of Duvall Road; and Treadwell Road,

- 4.6-2 (a) All billboard sign permit applications shall be submitted with property survey, property lease agreement, if applicable, engineered drawings and an approved Georgia Department of Transportation sign permit.
- (b) No billboard may be located on top of, cantilvered over, or otherwise suspended above any building or structure.
- (c) No billboard, if illuminated, shall be located with 500 feet of a residential structure or zoned district, if not illuminated the billboard shall not be located within 300 feet of a residential structure or zoned district.
- (d) No billboard shall be located within 500 feet in any direction of a public park, public playground, public recreation area, public forest, scenic area or cemetery unless the sign is separated by buildings or other obstructions so that the sign located within the 500 foot zone is not visible from the public park, public playground, public recreation area, scenic area, or cemetery.

4.6-3 The display area and/or the trim of a billboard sign shall not protrude into the right-of-way or the set back line and shall not exceed twelve (12) feet in height and twenty-five (25) feet in length, nor a display area in excess of three hundred (300) square feet. If the adjacent property has an existing sign, the billboard shall not unduly obstruct the visibility of the adjacent sign.

4.6-4 Billboards shall not be less than ten (10) feet from any property or right-of-wayline and shall be spaced a minimum of one thousand (1000) feet apart measured on the same side of the highway/roadway surface.

4.6-5 Two signs in the same location (back-to-back or "V" formation) shall be same height above the

adjacent roadway surface.

4.6-6 All billboards shall be a minimum of ten (10) feet above adjacent highway/roadway pavement measuring from the lower portion of the sign face. The maximum height of any billboard sign shall be forty (40) feet, measured from the grade of the adjacent highway/roadway.

4.6-7 Billboard signs shall not be placed side by side or stacked.

The foregoing ordinance received a first reading on December 7, 2020 and a second reading on January 4, 2021, upon second reading, a motion for passage of the ordinance was made by councilman Fred Welch, second by councilman Terry Crump, and the ordinance is adopted.

NAMING A DESIGNATED OFFICER FOR ALL RELATED PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, Georgia Code O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15 as amended in 2018, authorizes the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Revenue (hereinafter the "DOR Commissioner") to provide certain confidential sales tax information to the "designated finance officer or taxing official" of local governments; and

WHEREAS, more specifically, O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15(d.1) authorizes the DOR Commissioner to provide to a local government's designated officer, upon request, certain information relating to vendors that have submitted sales tax reports within the period of time set forth in that request; and

WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. §48-2-15(d.1) further allows the local government's designated officer to request that the DOR Commissioner validate, from time to time, the political subdivision to which sales taxes are being remitted by tax payers with a business location within that local government's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chatsworth desires to obtain the sales tax information described in the above Georgia Code Section;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Chatsworth, as follows:

1. The City Council hereby designates the following finance or tax official as Chatsworth's Designated Officer for all purposes described in O.C.G.A. §48 2-15(d.1)§

2. The City Council hereby request that the DOR Commissioner (orhis/her designee) furnish to the above-named Designated Officer all vendor sales tax information described in O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15 (d.1)(1) for Chatsworth for the time period commencing on January 1, 2020 and ending on December 31, 2020.
3. In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15(d.1)(2)(B) and following receipt of the information described in Paragraph 2, above, the Designated Officer is hereby authorized to request validation by the DOR Commissioner of the political subdivision to which one or more vendors/taxpayers with a business location in Chatsworth have remitted sales taxes for the designated period, with such validation request to contain the business name and location address of each such vendor/taxpayer and such other information as may assist the DOR commissioner in responding to such validation request;
4. The Designated Officer shall use such information only in the discharge of his/her duties and shall maintain the confidentiality of such inforamtion as required by O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15(d.1); and
5. The City Council shall comply with all confidentiality requirements of O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15(d.1), including, but limited to, the requirements that (1) such information may only be discussed by the members of the City Council in executive session and (2) members of the City Council shall recuse themselves from such executive session discussion in the event of a conflict of interest as described in the above Georgia Code Section.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective upon its approval by the Chatsworth City Council, and the official named above shall remain Chatsworth City's Designated Officer under O.C.G.A. § 48-2-15(d.1) until further action of the Board of Commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chatsworth City Clerk is hereby directed to provide a certified copy of this Resolution to the Georgia Department of Revenue via email (public.disclosure@dor.ga.gov) or to otherwise transmit a copy of this Resolution as may be directed by the Georgia Department of Revenue.
