Public Comment on Agenda Items

The City Council, to ensure a participatory and open government, will generally allow public comment on each agenda item. After the agenda item has been introduced and discussed by the City Council, the Mayor will ask for public comment on the agenda item. This may be the only opportunity to comment publicly on an agenda item. If you wish to comment, please raise your hand. When the Mayor recognizes you, go to the podium, state your name for the record, and make your comment. The City Council will discuss the item again and offer a motion and decision.
