Alderman Abel Reyna made a motion to approve D&H Spraying and Landscape and Fiber Wave August Account Payables. Alderman James Parkhill seconded. VOTE: 5-0 in favor, motion passed.

B. Ordinance 09-2022 Setting the Tax Rate and Levying a Tax for the Year 2023 on All Taxable Real and Personal Property Located in the City of Crosbyton

Alderman Kevin Fry made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 09-2022 and that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of 0.653482 per one hundred dollars of assessed value, which is effectively a 3.98% increase in the tax rate. 
9. Adjourn
