

















Station 1: About You!





The focus of this station was for participants to place a dot on the topic that prevents them from using the parks in Farmersville.





This station asked participants to determine using dots what four amenities they value most in parks.





The focus of this station was for participants to place a dot on the topic that prevents them from using the trails in Farmersville.





Priority Topics

Priority 1: Trails - New trail connections, lighting, trailheads, bike paths, wayfinding

Priority 2: Land Acquisitions - Acquiring new parkland for future open space and parks.

Priority 3: Indoor Amenities - Multigenerational center, senior center, gym, recreation facility

Priority 4: Parks - Building new parks

Priority 5: Programs and Outdoor Amenities - Sports courts, outdoor gyms, yoga in the park, birdwatching walks

Priority 6: Special Facilities - Constructing specialized outdoor facilities such as skate parks, frisbee golf courses, BMX courses, community gardens, etc.

Priority 7: Water Features - Building splash pads, water playgrounds, fountains, and pools.

Priority 8: Maintenance and Preservation of Existing Parks and Trails - maintaining existing park assets to ensure their longevity and continued enjoyment

Priority 9: Access and Inclusivity - All inclusive playgrounds, ADA accessible parks and trails

Priority 10: Preservation of Open Space - Aquire and conserve land to maintain countryside








Station 8: Existing Parks- City Park

This station had participants provide feedback on City Park. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the park should look like.









This station had participants provide feedback on Rambler Park. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the park should look like.








- 1. More Inter-Activity

This station had participants provide feedback on J.W. Spain Athletic Complex. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the park should look like.








- 1. Define use for new 20 acres

- 3. 276 kids use it now will triple in 3–5 years
- 4. Class A facility
- 5. Make all 5 fields playable for little league and youth sports- we don't need HS/College level dimensions

- 7. Ability to lease/rent fields off season for private/public events
- 8. Improve fields, add hiking trails north of Chaparral Trail
- 9. Make this a "destination" facility, state of the art, turf, shoot for the stars
- 10. Make facility to be proud of
- 11. Well funded
- 12. Mix use with shops and restarunts
- 13. Add playground structure near seating
- 14. Add rec center and outdoor water park, not just a splash pad
- 15. Add outdoor sports "square" i.e. cornhole, courts, sand volleyball

This station had participants provide feedback on Southlake Park. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the park should look like.








- 1. Easier access to fish from along the banks
- 2. Greater parking at initial field and at boat ramp
- 3. Additional hiking/biking trails
- 4. More docks to fish off of
- 5. Boat ramp improvements
- 6. Rec center, Interpretive center for native prairie
- 7. Access from 380 to stop traffic jams/ neighborhood interruption during events
- 8. Manage fish/grass
- 9. Make TXDOT change their plans, work with Texas prairie partners to turn the hilltop prairie, along with park access into the most sought after nature retreat in North Texas, mountain bike trail around the lake.
- 10. Updated playground areas
- 11. Take care of the native prairie
- 12. Additional trails around the lake that allow for a preserve of natural areas around the lake
- 13. Updated covered playground + add trail system
- 14. Parking closer to facilities + better bathroom

This station had participants provide feedback on Northlake Park. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the park should look like.









This station had participants provide feedback on Chaparral Trail. Participants rated the quality of the facility and provided their overall vision of what the trail should look like.








