### CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE O-2012-0522-001

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 77. ENTITLED "ZONING," THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, "ZONING DISTRICTS," BY AMENDING SUBPARAGRAPH (2) OF SECTION 77-91, "CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT," TO LIMIT RESIDENTIAL USES ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF A BUILDING IN THE CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT TO 40% OF THE OVERALL SQUARE FOOTAGE OF THE FIRST FLOOR OF A BUILDING LOCATED IN THE CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT: REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY: PROVIDING FOR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY: **PROVIDING** FOR **INJUNCTIONS: PROVIDING** FOR NOTICE AND IMPLEMENTATION: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** the City desires to make available the opportunity to have residences in the Central Area District; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that all prerequisites to the adoption of this Ordinance have been met; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to allow residential living spaces on the first floor in the Central Area District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

#### SECTION 1. INCORPORATION OF FINDINGS

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 77, ENTITLED "ZONING," BY AMENDING SUBPARAGRAPH (2) OF SECTION 77-91, "CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT," TO LIMIT RESIDENTIAL USES ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF A BUILDING IN THE CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT TO 40% OF THE OVERALL SQUARE FOOTAGE OF THE FIRST FLOOR OF A BUILDING LOCATED IN THE CENTRAL AREA DISTRICT.

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Section 77-91, entitled "Central Area District," is hereby amended by deleting Subparagraph (2) in its entirety and replacing it with a new Subparagraph (2) to read as follows:

"(2) A building in the CA District may be used for residential purposes provided however that such residential use shall be limited solely to:

- (a) a maximum of forty percent (40%) of the overall square footage of the first floor and placed on that portion of the first floor at the farthest portion of the building away from the building's store front with the remaining sixty percent (60%) of the first floor actually being used for retail or other commercial use; and
- (b) the second floor and above of the building."

#### **SECTION 3. CUMULATIVE REPEALER**

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such Ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance. Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time this Ordinance shall take effect and that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent with this Ordinance. Provided however, that any complaint, action, claim or lawsuit which has been initiated shall continue to be governed by the provisions of such Ordinance and for that purpose the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

#### **SECTION 4. SAVINGS**

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

#### **SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY**

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Farmersville that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by valid judgment or final decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

#### SECTION 6. GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY

All of the regulations provided in this ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, acting for the City of Farmersville in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

#### **SECTION 7. INJUNCTIONS**

Any violation of this ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

#### **SECTION 8. ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT**

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

#### **SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after it passage and publication of the caption as required by law.

#### **Dear City Council Members:**

Having attended the Planning and Zoning Meeting on April 16, 2012, I addressed the board of my concerns and thoughts on the Amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance O-2012-0327-001 by amending Section 77-91 to allow residential living quarters on the first floor in the Central Area District. I will also address my concerns to you.

While I understand the council and the boards' questions on allowing living quarters on the first floor I have to reiterate that in order for Farmersville to grow the city should not restrict business owners on how they use their property. The Council has put in codes, ordinances, bylaws and the type of business they can have. Permits, special permits, zoning, revised zoning, ordinances and the list continues. While these are all needed for the safety of our citizens and visitors there comes a point when the business owner's voice needs to be heard.

In 1881 Farmersville had seven grocery stores, three dry good, three general merchandise firms, two saloons, two leather and harness shops and eight private schools. How many of these types of stores are in existent today? In 1885 brought the first bank. It has taken 127 years to get another bank. Then in the 1920's and 1930's there was onions. In 1935 the governor of Texas, James W Allred attended the first onion festival and through this two day event a total of 30,000 people attended. In 1980 the first Old Time Saturday was started as a fund raiser. Some 31 years later did we have 30,000 attend? In the 1950's National Sports wear employed 62 but closed. Is this the destiny for the rest of Farmersville? How could a thriving town with so many businesses slowly close? Work took them elsewhere in order to make a living. Now in the 21st century the City of Farmersville has the opportunity to grow and be prosperous again by not restricting the revenue producing businesses the opportunity to make their own choices of where they live. With the price of gas and the cost of land in Collin County the dream of owning a business is slowly fading so to put more regulations, codes, special permits, and undue hardship on current and potential new businesses seems unfair and troublesome. If Farmersville is to grow and prosper in this economy the business owners should be allowed to live in part of their business quarters, if not there are other towns that would and will welcome new businesses. If codes, rules and ordinances are needed for businesses, then Council should address the issue of the disarray that some of the businesses are in downtown, boarded up, paper covered windows and vacant buildings and facades that need to be repaired and / or painted. The Central District Area buildings are the first thing that is noticed when you drive or walk downtown. Is the best first impression Farmersville has to offer? Does it make sense to not allow owners of businesses to not live in part of their building when we have buildings that could probably be condemned for safety, not to mention the appearance of the outside?

Vacant buildings that are mere storage units, dirty windows, peeling paint and rotten boards would seem to be of more concern than if an owner lives in the back of their building.

### CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # O-2012-0522-002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. 2007-08 AS AMENDED, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 62, ENTITLED "STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES" AND CHAPTER 65 ENTITLED "SUBDIVISIONS"; PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville, Texas, has recommended the amendment of Chapter 62 of the Code of Ordinances, entitled "Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places" and Chapter 65 of the Code of Ordinances, entitled "Subdivisions" to clarify that public sidewalks are to provide a safe area for pedestrians and to set out set requirements for sidewalk construction; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this recommended text amendment coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, after notice and public hearing as required by law and upon due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, the City Council is of the opinion and finds that the change of such zoning text will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or general welfare of the citizens of the City, and will promote the best and most orderly development of the property affected thereby, and as well the owners and occupants thereof, and the City generally;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS:

**SECTION 1:** That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance Chapter 62 of the Code of Ordinances, entitled "Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places" and Chapter 65 of the Code of Ordinances, entitled "Subdivisions" Ordinance #2007-08 as amended, of the City of Farmersville, Texas, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

## CHAPTER 62: STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES, ARTICLE V

**DIVISION 1.** Pedestrian concrete walkways (sidewalks) shall meet the following conditions and shall be provided along both sides of newly constructed streets as follows:

- (1) MAJOR THOROUGHFARE SIDEWALK PLACEMENT The sidewalk shall be no less than five (5) feet wide on both sides of the street as shown by Exhibit "A";
- (2) SECONDARY THOROUGHFARE SIDEWALK PLACEMENT The sidewalk shall be no less than five (5) feet wide on both sides of the street as shown by Exhibit "B";
- (3) COLLECTOR ROADWAY SIDEWALK PLACEMENT The sidewalk shall be no less than four (4) feet wide on both sides of the street as shown by Exhibit "C";
- (4) RESIDENTIAL STREET SIDEWALK PLACEMENT The sidewalk shall be no less than four (4) feet wide on both sides of the street as shown by Exhibit "D";
- (5) RESIDENTIAL ESTATE STREET SIDEWALK PLACEMENT The sidewalk shall be no less than four (4) feet wide on both sides of the street as shown by Exhibit "E";

#### Division 2.

- a) Concrete sidewalks on residential streets will have a width of not less than four (4) feet and thickness of not less than four inches and will be constructed of 3,500 psi concrete on both sides of all streets.
- b) Sidewalks will be constructed not less than one foot from the street right-of-way line and will extend along the street frontage including the side lot corner lots and block ends.
- c) All concrete for sidewalks will be placed on a two-inch sand cushion and will be reinforced with number three (3) reinforcing steel bars placed at 18 inches on center each way.
- d) The developer may petition for a determination to the Chief Planning Official in the form of a written variance request when the sidewalk construction is either not feasible or inappropriate at the time of subdivision construction. If any funds are expended for engineering or other qualified opinions, the developer will be responsible for reimbursing the City for all charges incurred. If determined to be inappropriate at the time of construction by the City, funds for such construction shall be placed in escrow with the City by the developer. The sidewalk escrow rate will be approved by resolution by the City Council.
- e) Construction standards for sidewalks shall be set forth in the City of Farmersville's Design Standards.

#### Division 3. Appeals

- 1) Appeals shall be made to the Board of Adjustment regarding a decision made by the Chief Planning Official under this ordinance. Such appeal shall be taken within 15 days after the decision has been rendered by the Chief Planning Official, by filing with the City Secretary from whom the appeal is taken and with the Board of Adjustment, a notice of appeal specifying the grounds thereof. The City Secretary from whom the appeal is taken shall forthwith transmit to the Board of all the papers constituting the record upon which the action appeal from was taken.
- 2) An appeal shall stay all proceedings of the action appealed from unless the Chief Planning Officer from whom the appeal is taken certifies to the Board of Adjustment, after the notice of appeal shall have been filed with him that by reason of facts stated in the certificate, a stay would, in his opinion, cause imminent peril to life In such case, proceedings shall not be stayed or property. otherwise than by a restraining order which may be granted by the Board of Adjustment or by a Court of Record on application and notice to the Chief Planning Officer from whom the appeal is taken and due cause shown. The Board of Adjustment shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of an appeal, give the public notice thereof by posting such notice in the mail addressed to all owners of real property located within 200 feet of the property to which the appeal applies and by publishing notice of such hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the City. Both the posted and published notice shall be given at least ten days prior to the date set for the hearing. At the hearing, any party may appear in person or by attorney or by agent.
- 3) When in its judgment, the public convenience and welfare will be substantially served and the appropriate use of the neighboring property will not be substantially or permanently injured, the Board of Adjustment may, in specific cases, after public notice and public hearing, and subject to appropriate conditions and safeguards, authorize the following special exception to the regulations herein established.
  - a) Permit the reconstruction, extension or enlargement of a sidewalk by a non conforming use of the lot or tract, provided such reconstruction does not prevent the return of such property to a conforming use.
  - b) Permit such modifications as may be necessary to secure appropriate development of a parcel of land which differs from other parcels in the district by being of such restricted area,

- shape or slope that it cannot be appropriately developed without such modification.
- c) Require the discontinuance of nonconforming uses of land under any plan whereby the full value can be amortized within a definite period of time, taking into consideration the general character of the neighborhood and the necessity for all property to conform to the regulations of this article. All actions to discontinue a nonconforming use of land shall be taken with due regard for the property rights of the persons affected when considered in the light of the public welfare and the character of the area surrounding the designated nonconforming use and the conservation and preservation of the property. The Board shall, from time to time, on its own motion or upon cause presented by interested property owners, inquire in to the existence, continuation or maintenance of any nonconforming use within the City.

**SECTION 2:** That it is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance, since same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

**SECTION 3:** That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance, any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of the City of Farmersville Sign Code as amended hereby shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction in the municipal court of the City of Farmersville, Texas, shall be subject to a penalty of a fine not to exceed the sum of two thousand (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day any such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.

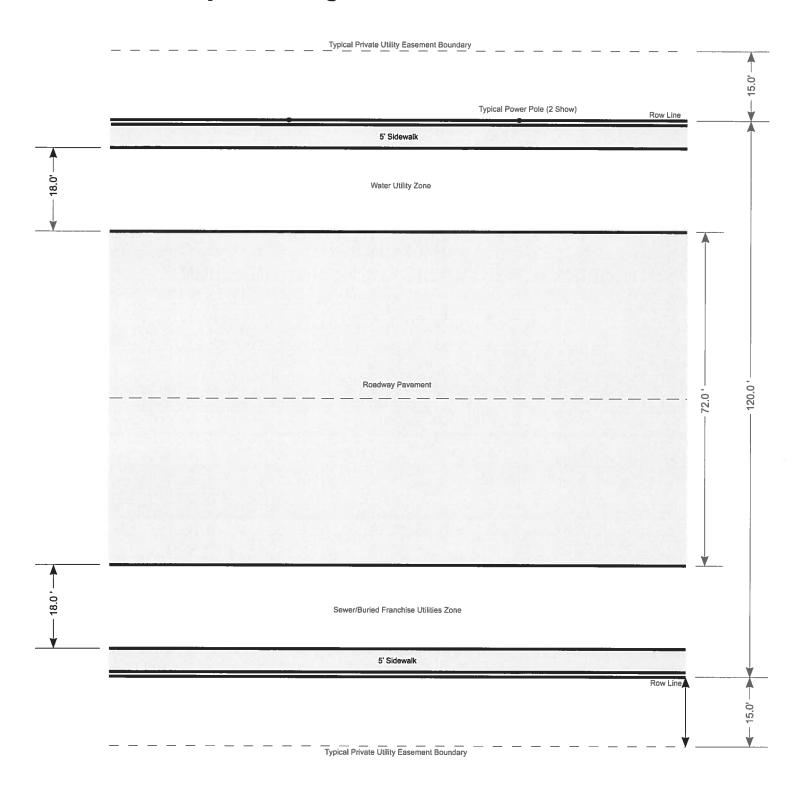
**SECTION 4**: That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance, all previously adopted ordinances, orders or resolutions heretofore passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be, and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.

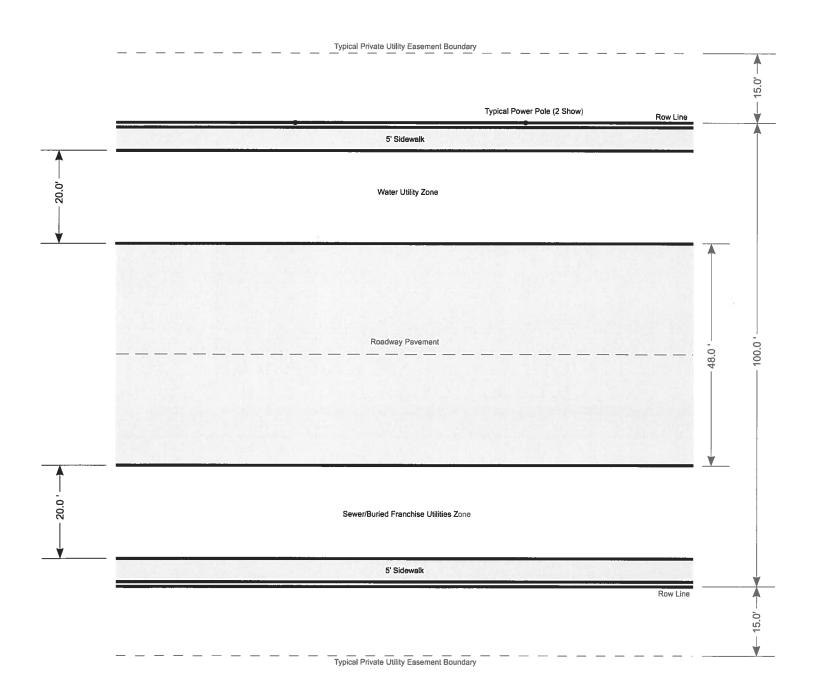

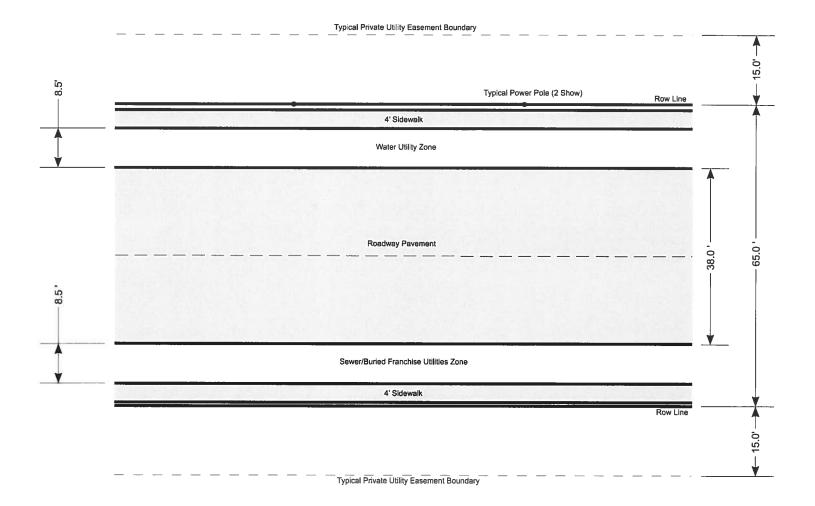
## **Exhibit A Major Thoroughfare Sidewalk Placement**



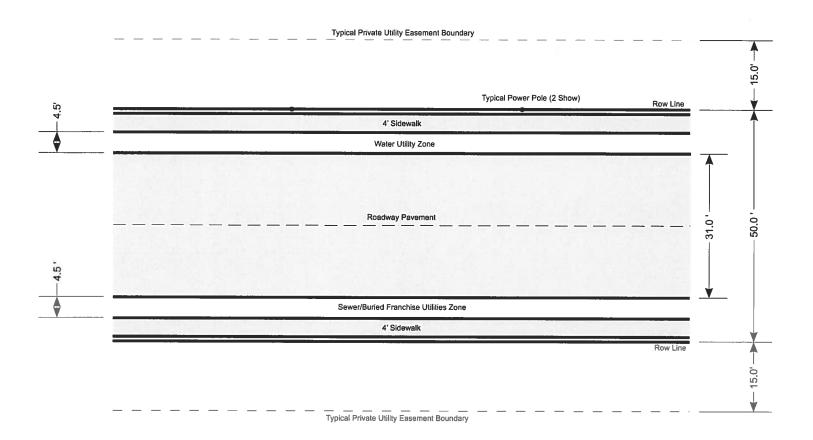
## **Exhibit B Secondary Thoroughfare Sidewalk Placement**



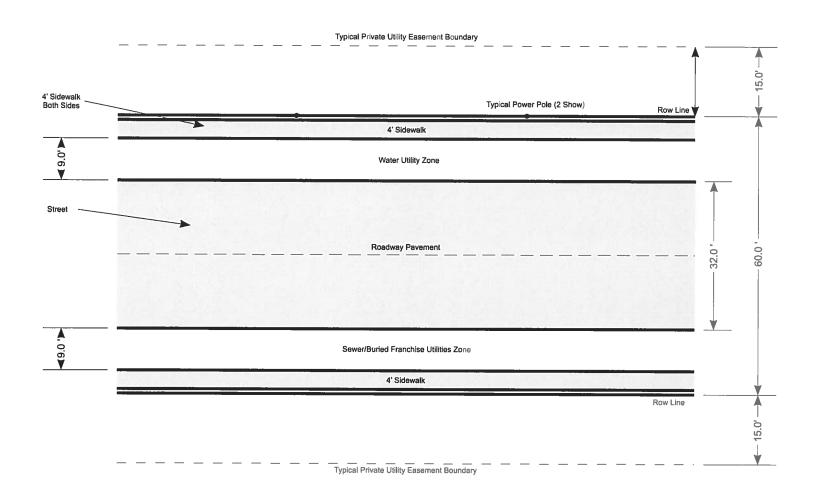
## Exhibit C Collector Roadway Sidewalk Placement

### CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # O-2012-0612-001

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING FARMERSVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES AMENDING APPENDIX A, "MASTER FEE SCHEDULE," AMENDING ARTICLE II, "ELECTRICITY, WATER, SEWER AND REFUSE," SECTION 2-7 RECYCLING FEES; ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4-2, "FACILITY RENTALS"; AMENDING ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7-1, "MISCELLANEOUS FEES" REGARDING FAXING AND COPY FEES; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND SETTING AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS:

#### SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

That should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.

#### **SECTION 5. REPEALER CLAUSE**

That all ordinances of the City of Farmersville, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

**SECTION 6:** This Ordinance shall take effect after approval and adoption by City Council and with publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.

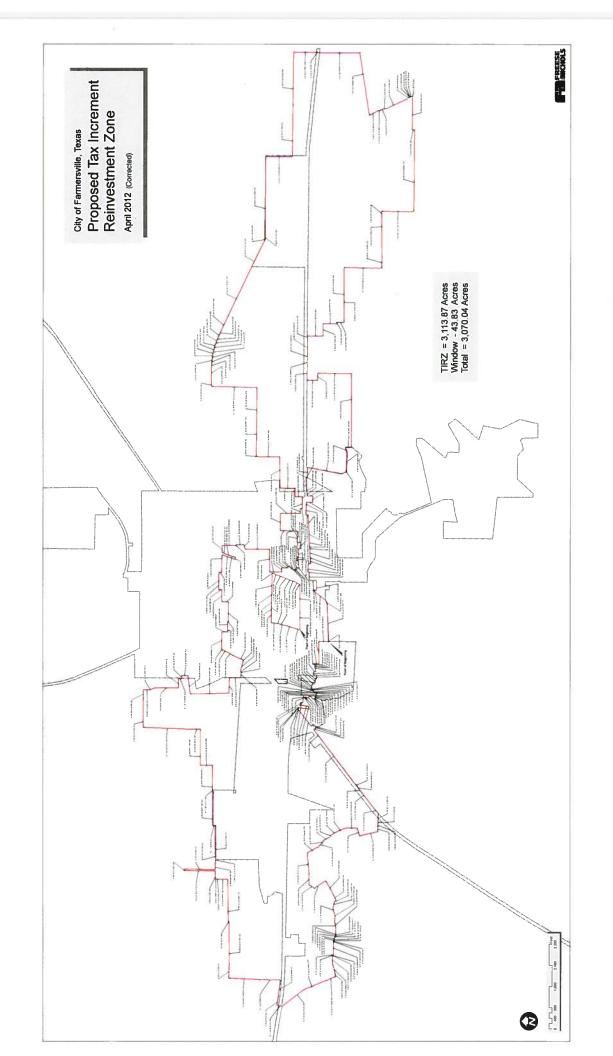

## CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # 2012-0612-003

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING SECTION 74-188 TO ADOPT LANSCAPING AND IRRIGATION REGULATIONS; AND AMENDING SECTION 74-160 TO ADOPT ENFORCEMENT FOR THE WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Farmersville, Texas (the "City") recognizes its Water Management Plan as the official policy for the conservation of water;

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the adoption of its Water Management Plan should allow for the repeal of any preceding Plans;

**WHEREAS,** the City has determined the need to modify the existing ordinances regarding landscaping and irrigation regulations which will be effective with the Water Management Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has determined the need to provide a fine per each offense.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS:

**SECTION 1.** That Chapter 74, Section 177 is hereby amended to read as follows: That there is hereby approved and adopted by reference, the same as if fully copied herein, the Water Management Plan dated March 2012. The City of Farmersville commits to implement the requirements and procedures set forth in the adopted plan. Any provision of this Code of Ordinances in conflict with the Plan is hereby repealed."

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The City and all City water connection users will adhere to the regulations as stipulated in the Water Management Plan regarding landscape water management measures under Section 4.8.4, Section 5.5.2, Section 5.5.3 and Section 5.5.4 of the Water Management Plan under each stage of drought contingency and water emergency preparedness.

**SECTION 3**. That Chapter 74, Section 160 is hereby supplemented by adding the additional statements as follows:

a. Chapter 74, Section 160 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 "No person shall knowingly allow the use of water from the city for residential, commercial, industrial, public, wholesale or any other purpose in a manner

contrary to any provision of this plan, or in an amount in excess of that permitted by the water emergency response stage in effect at the time, pursuant to action taken by the city manager, or his designee, in accordance with provisions of this plan.

b. Mandatory water use restrictions shall be imposed in stage 2, stage 3 and stage 4 drought contingency and water emergency response stages as defined in the Water Management Plan. The penalties associated with the mandatory water use restrictions are stated below:

1 <sup>st</sup> Issue	Warning
2 <sup>nd</sup> Issue	Final Warning
1 <sup>st</sup> Offense	\$50.00
2 <sup>nd</sup> Offense	\$100.00
3 <sup>rd</sup> Offense	\$200.00
4 <sup>th</sup> Offense	\$400.00

Further issues will require service to be disconnected.

C. When Water Emergency Response Stage 4 has been implemented, irrigation of new landscaping using treated water is prohibited. As such, new construction where a Landscape Plan has been approved will be placed on hold until such time that Stage 4 restrictions have been lifted. The City shall agree to accept escrow deposits in lieu of landscaping construction due to Stage 4 drought conditions. The property owner or developer shall deposit in escrow with the City an amount equal to 120 percent of the costs of design, construction, permits, reviews and approvals, inspections, insurance, and any additional costs incurred for the installation of landscaping. The escrow deposit shall be a non-interest bearing line item within the City's accounting. Once the escrow has been successfully arranged, the property owner/developer may proceed with attaining the Certificate of Occupancy. Once Water Emergency Response Stage 4 has been lifted, landscaping that was placed on hold may then be installed. Any remaining funds after the landscaping has been installed and inspected shall be returned to the property owner/developer.

#### **SECTION 4.** Severability Clause.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining words,

phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation of any such unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

# **SECTION 5.** Savings Clause.

The Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

### **SECTION 6.** Repealer Clause.

Any provision of any prior ordinance of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which is in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance, is hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict, but all other provisions of the ordinances of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which are not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

# **SECTION 7.** Penalty Clause.

Any customer, defined pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 291, failing to comply with the provisions of the Plan shall be subject to a fine of up to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per day and/or discontinuance of water service by the City. Proof of a culpable mental state is not required for a conviction of an offense under this section. Each day a customer fails to comply with the Plan is a separate violation. The City's authority to seek injunctive or other civil relief available under the law is not limited by this section.

### **SECTION 8.** Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.

**PASSED** on first reading on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May, 2012, and second reading on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2012 at properly scheduled meetings of the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas, there being a quorum present, and approved by the Mayor on the date set out below.
