

### CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # O-2016-0426-001

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES. CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED. THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 35. "HUMAN RELATIONS." BY AMENDING ARTICLE II - "FAIR HOUSING." BY AMENDING SECTION 35-19 BY INSERTING DEFINITIONS FOR THE PHRASES "HANDICAP" AND "FAMILIAL STATUS" INTO SAID SECTION, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 35-21(a), 35-21(b), 35-22(1) THROUGH 35-22(5), 35-23(1) AND 35-23(2), 35-24, AND 35-25(c) BY REPLACING EACH OCCURRENCE OF THE PHRASE "RACE, COLOR, SEX, RELIGION OR NATIONAL ORIGIN" WITH THE PHRASE "RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, SEX, HANDICAP, FAMILIAL STATUS, OR NATIONAL ORIGIN" TO CONFORM TO REVISIONS IN UNITED STATES LAW: REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIONS; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION: PROVIDING FOR ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT: PROVIDING A PENALTY OR FINE NOT TO **EXCEED THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH** OFFENSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City Council"), pursuant to Texas Local Government Code, Sections 51.001 and 51.012, is authorized to adopt an ordinance, not inconsistent with state law, that is for the good government, interest, welfare, peace, or order of the City of Farmersville ("City"), and that is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City Council") finds and determines that amending Chapter 35, "Human Relations," by amending Article II — "Fair Housing," by amending Section 35-19 by inserting definitions for the phrases "Handicap" and "Familial Status" into said Section, and by amending Sections 35-21(a), 35-21(b), 35-22(1) through 35-22(5), 35-23(1) and 35-23(2), 35-24, and 35-25(c) by replacing each occurrence of the phrase "race, color, sex, religion or national origin" within each of said Sections 35-21(a), 35-21(b), 35-22(1) through 35-22(5), 35-23(1) and 35-23(2), 35-24, and 35-25(c) with the phrase "race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status, or national origin" to conform to revisions in United States law is in the best interest and public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Farmersville, Texas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

#### **SECTION 1: INCORPORATION OF FINDINGS**

The findings set forth above are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance and made a part hereof for all purposes as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: AMENDING CHAPTER 35, "HUMAN RELATIONS," BY AMENDING ARTICLE II – "FAIR HOUSING," BY AMENDING SECTION 35-19 BY INSERTING DEFINITIONS FOR THE PHRASES "HANDICAP" AND "FAMILIAL STATUS" INTO SAID SECTION

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 35, "Human Relations," is hereby amended by amending Article II – "Fair Housing," by amending Section 35-19 by inserting definitions for the phrases "Handicap" and "Familial Status" into the current list of definitions in said section in alphabetical order to read as follows:

"Familial status means one or more individuals (who have not attained the age of 18 years) being domiciled with --

- (1) a parent or another person having legal custody of such individual or individuals; or
- (2) the designee of such parent or other person having such custody, with the written permission of such parent or other person.

The protections afforded against discrimination on the basis of familial status shall apply to any person who is pregnant or is in the process of securing legal custody of any individual who has not attained the age of 18 years."

and

"Handicap means, with respect to a person --

- (1) a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more of such person's major life activities,
- (2) a record of having such an impairment, or
- (3) being regarded as having such an impairment, but such term does not include current, illegal use of or addiction to a controlled substance (as defined in section 102 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 802))."

SECTION 3: AMENDING CHAPTER 35, "HUMAN RELATIONS," BY AMENDING ARTICLE II - "FAIR HOUSING," BY AMENDING SECTIONS 35-21(a),

35-21(b), 35-22(1) THROUGH 35-22(5), 35-23(1) AND 35-23(2), 35-24, AND 35-25(c) BY REPLACING EACH OCCURRENCE OF THE PHRASE "RACE, COLOR, SEX, RELIGION OR NATIONAL ORIGIN" WITH THE PHRASE "RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, SEX, HANDICAP, FAMILIAL STATUS, OR NATIONAL ORIGIN" TO CONFORM TO REVISIONS IN UNITED STATES LAW

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 35, "Human Relations," is hereby amended by amending Article II – "Fair Housing," by amending Sections 35-21(a), 35-21(b), 35-22(1) through 35-22(5), 35-23(1) and 35-23(2), 35-24, and 35-25(c) by replacing each occurrence of the phrase "race, color, sex, religion or national origin" within each of said Sections 35-21(a), 35-21(b), 35-22(1) through 35-22(5), 35-23(1) and 35-23(2), 35-24, and 35-25(c), respectively, with the phrase: "race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status, or national origin".

#### <u>SECTION 4.</u> CUMULATIVE REPEALER

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such Ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance. Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time this Ordinance shall take effect and that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent with this Ordinance. Provided however, that any complaint, action, claim or lawsuit which has been initiated shall continue to be governed by the provisions of such Ordinance and for that purpose the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

#### SECTION 5. SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

#### SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Farmersville that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by valid judgment or final decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same

would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

#### <u>SECTION 7</u>. GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY

All of the regulations provided in this ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, acting for the City of Farmersville in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

#### **SECTION 8. INJUNCTIONS**

Any violation of this ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

#### **SECTION 9: PUBLICATION**

The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official Newspaper of the City of Farmersville the Caption, Penalty, and Effective Date Clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Local Government Code.

#### SECTION 10. ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

#### **SECTION 11. PENALTY**

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this Ordinance or of the Code of Ordinances as amended hereby, shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmersville, as previously amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each violation. Each day a violation continues, after the passage of 75 days from the date of filing of the initial complaint with the administrator, shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

# **SECTION 12. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after it passage and publication of the caption as required by law.

Mayor and City Council, attached is Exhibit (A) for budget/revision (3) 04-20-2106. City Hall did budget for a generator for the City Hall Building during budget year 2014-2015. Due to time restraints, this did not happen. Staff is currently working on making this happen for budget year 2015-2016.

During previous City Council discussions, the City Manager has asked to be allowed to use the Refuse Fund Franchise Fee that the City collects as funding for street improvements. Currently the City of Farmersville has a balance of \$127,766.84 in reserves. The attached budget/revision (3) 04-20-2016 requesting to move those funds to the General Fund Street Construction expense account will permit the City to continue with the efforts to improve our City streets.

#### CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # O-2016-0426-002

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2015 – 2016 IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS, APPROPRIATING THE VARIOUS AMOUNTS HEREIN; REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES AND ACTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville, Texas is a Type A General-Law Municipality located in Collin County, established in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Texas Local Government Code, and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Manager of the City of Farmersville has reviewed the budget that was adopted by the City Council for the Fiscal Year 2015 – 2016 ("Budget"); and

WHEREAS, the City Manager of the City of Farmersville believes the Budget requires certain amendments and has submitted to the Mayor and the City Council proposed amendment(s) to the Budget regarding the revenues and expenditures of conducting the affairs of said City, and providing a complete financial plan for the Fiscal Year 2015 – 2016; and,

# SECTION 2. MASTER FEE SCHEDULE AMENDED BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, "ELECTRICITY, WATER, SEWER AND REFUSE," BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 2-9 ENTITLED "FARMERSVILLE UTILITIES AVERAGE BILLING AND PAYMENT PLAN"

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the Master Fee Schedule is hereby amended, in part, by adding a new Section 2-9 entitled "Farmersville Utilities Average Billing and Payment Plan" to read as follows:

# "Sec. 2-9. - Farmersville Utilities Average Billing and Payment Plan

An average utility billing and payment option is available to qualifying residential customers, only, who desire to avoid monthly fluctuations in their utility billings due to seasonal changes; and, who desire to pay the average cost of their annual usage of utilities over a one-year period in 12 equal monthly payments. See Farmersville Ordinance § 74-95 for program details."

"Sec. 74-95. - Farmersville Utilities Average Billing and Payment Plan.

- Farmersville Utilities Average Billing and Payment Plan ("Program") is available to qualifying residential customers who desire to avoid monthly fluctuations in their utility billings due to seasonal changes; and, who desire to pay the average cost of their annual usage of utilities over a one-year period in 12 equal monthly payments.
- 2. To participate in the Program, all of the following conditions shall be met:
  - a. The Program is available to residential customers for residential consumption only.
  - b. Residential customers shall submit an application to be considered for participation in the Program.
  - c. Residential customers must have at least twelve months of billing history on their residential account to participate in the Program.
  - c. Current account balance(s) must be zero.
  - d. No more than two delinquent payments may have occurred during the previous 12 month period.
  - e. No cut-off notices may have been issued during the previous 12 month period.
  - f. Program for
- 3. The average monthly billing and payment shall be determined by averaging the total cost of all utilities used by the residential customer during the most recent 12 months of billing history up to and including the date of application. This calculation establishes the amount of the average fixed billing statement ("Program Billing Statement") that will be issued to the

- residential customer for 12 months (the "Program Period").
- 4. The calculation described in the immediately preceding paragraph shall be repeated at the end of each Program Period for each residential customer participating in the Program and the Program Billing Statement attributed to the residential customer shall be adjusted up or down to reflect the residential customer's actual usage during the immediately preceding Program Period.
- If a residential customer participating in the Program uses more or less utility services than reflected in the Program Billing Statement during the Program Period, the residential customer shall not be obligated to pay the amount of any underpayment or entitled to reimbursement of any overpayment at the end of the then current Program Period.
- 6. At the end of each Program Period, the amount of any residential customer overpayment or underpayment in an expiring Program Period shall be applied to the calculation of the Program Billing Statement for that residential customer for the following Program Period.
- 7. Farmersville Utilities shall monitor the balances in each residential customer's account as the Program Period progresses. Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph 5, above, the City Manager or designee shall have the authority to request customer payment, administer customer refunds, and/or change the average billing and payment amount in cases where the Program Billing Statement was incorrectly calculated and/or if correctly calculated the customer reserve account balance is improperly funded due to some spike in utility usage by the residential customer.
- 8. Terms of the Program require that all payments shall be made on time. If payments are not received on or before the due date, the residential customer's participation in the Program shall be subject to termination. If a residential customer's participation in the Program is terminated, all balances are due and payable at the time of such termination and the

- residential customer shall return to an actual usage billing and payment basis.
- 9. The Program shall automatically renew as to any residential customer participating in the Program unless the residential customer requests removal from the Program at least thirty (30) days prior to the conclusion of the then current Program Period.

Subject: March 2016 Budget Report

The monthly budget report will focus on the analysis of budgetary variances of the revenues and expenditures of each of the major operating funds and project the impact on available fund balance. As a benchmark for comparison, we'll bear in mind that as of the end of March, 6/12 months or 50% of the fiscal year has passed. For revenues and expenditures occurring evenly throughout the year, we expect to have used or collected close the 50% level, and to have 50% remaining budget for the remaining of the year.

Presented in this format are: 1) an executive summary describing current budget issues, 2) budgetary comparison schedules of each major operating fund of the city, and 3) a fiscal year to date activity summary for cash and investments.

#### **Executive Summary**

The major operating funds that are part of the annual operating budget of the city are the general, water & wastewater, refuse, and electric funds.

#### General Fund

Total revenues in the general fund are 58.67% collected and total expenses are 50.62%

Ad Valorem collections currently received is 101.04%.

Sales Tax current collection rate @ 51.64%.

Municipal Court Revenues currently collected is 31.98%. Court is expecting to see increase in fine payment within the next few months.

Interest Earned is up from last year. We are currently have exceeded expectations and budget amendments will follow to allow for changes.

#### Refuse Fund

Total revenues are 50.50 and total expenses are 39.29%. Expenses are down due to outstanding invoices awaiting processing.

#### Water & Wastewater Fund

Total revenues for the Water Fund are 48.29% Total revenues for the Wastewater Fund are 47.33%

Water expenses in Administration are 49.37%. Water Department overall expenditures are 45.43%




#### 2. Miscellaneous Provisions:

Texas law prohibits city and governmental units from awarding contracts to a non-resident bidder/proposer unless the amount of such bid is lower than the lowest bid by a Texas resident by the amount a Texas resident would be required to underbid the non-resident bidder/proposer on a bid/proposal for goods and services in the non-resident bidder's state.
- 23. <u>DELINQUENT TAXES</u>: Any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears to the City for delinquent taxes or otherwise, will not be recommended for award of any bid/proposal until the arrearage has been cleared in writing. If a contractor or vendor becomes delinquent while a contract is in force, payment for goods or

services provided to the City under said contract or purchase order may be withheld until the arrearage has been cleared in writing.

- 24. <u>MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR RESPONSIBILITY</u>: A prospective vendor must affirmatively demonstrate responsibility. The City may request representation and other information sufficient to determine respondent's ability to meet the minimum standards including but not limited to:
  - A. Have adequate financial resources, or the ability to obtain such resources as required;
  - B. Ability to comply with the required or proposed delivery schedule;
  - C. Have a satisfactory record of performance;
  - D. Have a satisfactory record of integrity and ethics; and
  - E. Be otherwise qualified and eligible to receive an award.
- **25. AWARD OF CONTRACT**: The City reserves the right to award single or multiple contracts for the goods or services as stated herein. Furthermore, the City reserves the right to take administration costs into consideration when awarding to multiple vendors.

The City may award bids/proposals to the lowest responsive responsible vendor(s), or to the vendor(s) who provides goods or services at the best value to the City. If using the best value method, the selection criteria will be clearly identified in the bid/proposal document. The best value method may take into consideration, in whole or in part, by way of illustration and not limitation, the following criteria:

- A. The purchase price;
- B. The reputation of the respondent and of the respondent's goods or services;
- C. The quality of the respondent's goods or services;
- D. The extent to which the goods or services meet the City's needs;
- E. The respondent's past relationship with the City;
- F. The total long-term cost to the City to acquire the respondent's goods or services; and/or
- G. Any relevant criteria specifically listed herein.
- 26. ACCEPTANCE: Respondent agrees that acceptance of any or all items by the City, within a reasonable period of time, not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) days following the date and time designated for the receipt of the bid/proposal, shall be binding upon respondent. Respondent shall thereafter execute all documents necessary to enter into a contract in a form acceptable to and properly executed by the City to provide such goods and services.
- 27. CONTRACT PERIOD: Unless otherwise stated in the specifications contained herein, the contract period for this bid/proposal will be for one (1) year upon City approval, with up to four (4) optional one-year renewal periods if agreeable to both parties and unless either party has provided the other party thirty (30) days' written notice of intent to terminate or not renew the agreement. Renewal periods will be subject to the City's availability of funds.

- **FUNDING**: The City is a Type A general law municipal corporation operated and funded on a fiscal year basis from October 1 to September 30. Accordingly, the City reserves the right to terminate at any time, without liability to the City, any contract for which funding is not available in a subsequent fiscal year.
- **29. ASSIGNMENT**: The successful vendor shall not sell, assign, transfer or convey any contract, in whole or in part, to any other person or party without the prior written consent of the City.
- 30. <a href="INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT">INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT</a>: The successful vendor agrees to extend prices for goods and services under the same terms and conditions of this bid/proposal to all governmental entities that have entered into, or may hereafter enter into, interlocal cooperative purchasing agreements with the City.
- 31. <a href="CHANGE ORDER">CHANGE ORDER</a>: The City reserves the right to modify or change plans and specifications as deemed necessary after the performance of the contract has commenced, to decrease or increase the quantity of work to be performed, materials, equipment or supplies to be furnished, or address other provisions of the contract as approved by the City Manager or City Council, and as appropriate under state law. No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise change, or affect the terms, conditions or specifications stated in the contract. All change orders or modifications to the contract shall be documented in written form by the City and acknowledged by the contracted vendor. All change orders and modifications to the contract shall be processed through the City Secretary only.
- 32. <u>DELIVERY PROMISE PENALTIES</u>: Where indicated, respondents must provide the number of calendar days required to deliver goods or services to the City after receipt of order (ARO). **Do not quote shipping dates**. When a delivery delay can be foreseen, the vendor shall provide advance notice to the City Manager or Purchasing Agent, who shall have the right to extend the delivery date if the reasons for delay are acceptable. Default in promised delivery, without acceptable reason(s), or failure to meet specifications as contained herein or in the contract documents, authorizes the City to purchase goods or services from an alternate source. The defaulting vendor may be subject to re-procurement costs.
- 33. <u>DELIVERY TIMES</u>: Unless otherwise specified herein, deliveries will only be accepted during normal working hours at the designated City location(s).
- 34. <a href="INSPECTION">INSPECTION</a>: Upon receipt of goods or services, the same will be inspected for compliance with the specifications contained herein or in the contract documents. If the goods or services do not pass inspection, the vendor will be required to remedy the situation at the vendor's sole expense. The vendor will be required to retrieve the rejected goods at the delivery point and provide the necessary repairs of or replacement and return of the goods in new condition to the original point of delivery; or re-perform services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract and to the City's satisfaction.
- **35.** <u>INVOICES</u>: Invoices shall be submitted to: City of Farmersville, Attention Paula Jackson, 205 South Main Street, Farmersville, Texas 75442, or electronically to p.jackson@farmersvilletx.com.
- **26.** PAYMENT TERMS: Payment terms are net 30 days, unless otherwise specified by the City in the bid/proposal document.

- 37. <u>AUDIT</u>: The City shall have access to, and the right to examine, monitor and audit all records, documents, conditions and activities related to contracts awarded by the City. It shall be the responsibility of the vendor to maintain records associated with this procurement for a period of three (3) years after completion of the contract, or in the event of litigation, a claim or audit, the records shall be retained until the resolution of such litigation, claim or audit.
- 38. <u>INSURANCE</u>: The City requires vendor(s) to carry the minimum insurance as required by the greater of the requirements contained in state laws or the insurance requirements contained in the contract documents.
- 39. PRICE ESCALATION: Unless otherwise stated in the specifications herein, prices must remain firm for the initial term of the contract. The contracted vendor may request an adjustment at the time of contract renewal by submitting a request in written form to the City. Basis for price escalation should be the Consumer Price Index for the most recent twelve-month period reported for the Dallas-Fort Worth area. The contracted vendor shall provide the City with copies of the appropriate indices for verification purposes. The City reserves the right to approve or reject any and all requests for price escalations.
- **PRICE REDUCTION**: If during the life of the contract, the contracted vendor's net prices to other customers for the same goods or services are lower than the City's contracted prices, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the contract price in favor of the City.
- 41. INDEMNITY: The bidder shall defend, indemnify and hold the City of Farmersville, its officers, agents and employees harmless from and against any and all costs, expenses, suits, demands, claims, liabilities, liens, encumbrances or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of suit, of any character, name and description, incurred or resulting from any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons or property on account of any intentional wrongful conduct or negligent act, omission, or fault of the successful bidder, or of any agent, employee, subcontractor or supplier for which the successful bidder is responsible in the execution of, or performance under, any contract which may result from bid award and the bidder so agrees upon the submission of the bid. The bidder shall deliver, if so requested by the City of Farmersville, a written release of all liens or other proper evidence of same, to the satisfaction of the City prior to the issuance of final payment by the City.
- 42. <u>PATENT RIGHTS</u>: The bidder/proposer agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Farmersville from and against any and all claims involving patent right infringement or copyright infringement on goods or services supplied to the City pursuant to the contract documents.
- 43. PROTESTS: All protests regarding the solicitation process must be submitted in written form to the City within five (5) working days following the opening of bids/proposals. This includes all protests relating to legal advertisements, deadlines, bid/proposal openings, and all other related procedures under the Local Government Code, as well as any protests relating to alleged improprieties or ambiguities in the specifications contained herein or in the contract documents.

Post-award protests must be submitted in written form to the City within five (5) working days after award.

The protest must include, at a minimum, the name of the protester, bid/proposal number or description of goods or services, and a statement of the grounds for the protest. The City, having authority to make the final determination, will respond within ten (10) working days to each substantive issue raised in the protest. Allowances for reconsiderations shall be made only if data becomes available that was not previously known, or if there has been an error of law or regulation.

- 44. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT: The City reserves the right to enforce the performance of the contract in any manner prescribed by law and deemed to be in the best interest of the City in the event of breach or default of the contract. The City reserves the right to terminate the contract immediately in the event the contracted vendor fails to meet delivery schedules, or otherwise perform in accordance with the specifications contained herein or in the contract documents. Breach of contract or default authorizes the City to award the contract to another vendor, or purchase from an alternate source, and charge the full increase in cost plus any additional administrative costs incurred by the City to the defaulting contracted vendor.
- **REMEDIES**: The successful vendor and the City agree that each party may have rights, duties, and remedies available as stated in the Uniform Commercial Code and any other available remedy, whether in law or equity.
- **VENUE**: The validity of the contract and of any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties hereunder or the contract documents, shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any legal action shall lie in Collin County, Texas.

### I. Introduction

The City of Farmersville ("City") is soliciting proposals for the maintenance of parkland and rights-of-way located within the City, as described in the following specifications. The initial term of the contract will be one (1) year, with up to four (4) optional, one-year renewal periods if agreeable to both parties and unless either party has provided the other party thirty (30) days' written notice of intent to terminate or not renew the agreement. The contract will be awarded to the vendor(s) providing the best value to the City, as determined by the evaluation criteria as stated herein.

The City reserves the right to award any or all line items, in whole or in part, to one or more vendors. The cycle frequencies stated herein are an accurate reflection of the City's anticipated needs. However, due to budget contingencies or weather conditions cycle frequencies may be adjusted prior to award, or at any time during the contract period. At no time will adjustments to the prices offered be imposed on the City. Prices will be held firm during the contract period.

The successful vendor(s) will be required to execute a service contract. A sample contract is available for viewing upon request at the City.

### II. Pre-Proposal Conference and/or Site Visits

### A. Pre-Proposal Conference

### B. Site Visit

A pre-proposal site visit will be conducted as part of the pre-proposal conference. Each vendor is strongly encouraged to tour the service locations at this time in order to gain a clear understanding of the service locations and the associated scope of work.

Prior to award of contract, a mandatory site visit will be conducted with the recommended vendor to ensure a clear understanding of the scope of services and service locations.

### III. Scope of Services

The successful vendor(s) shall perform all services in accordance with the following conditions:

### A. Lawn and Flower Bed Maintenance

- Mow all turf areas as follows below and as indicated in Attachments A and B:
  - a. The successful vendor(s) shall set mowing equipment to the height indicated during the mandatory site visit, unless otherwise instructed by the Public Works Director or his designee. All changes in the mowing height are to be approved by the Public Works Director.
  - b. Mower blades shall be maintained sharp to produce a clean cut.
  - c. In an effort not to bag lawn clippings, mulching mowers are required.
  - d. All turf areas mowed weekly (unless otherwise indicated) during the growing season.
  - e. Mowing areas will be determined as indicated by yellow boundaries on each location map (refer to Attachment B).
  - f. Grass clippings shall be blown from all concrete and asphalt surfaces, and shall not remain onsite after mowing in visible piles/rows. The successful vendor(s) shall not simply blow grass clippings into the streets or other property.
  - g. Removal of all litter and debris from the entire property, and hauling such litter and debris away.
    - i. All litter and debris must be removed from turf prior to mowing.
    - ii. Areas serviced will have a finished appearance with drives, parking areas, walks, and curb areas appearing to have been swept. The successful vendor(s) shall not simply blow litter, leaves, clippings, etc. into the streets or other property.

### 2. Edging and Trimming

- a. Edge and trim all turf along walks (including paver and tracks), curbs, walls, plant beds, signs, utility poles and other fixtures at each mowing.
- b. Vegetation shall be trimmed out of cracks in concrete and asphalt.
- c. Where grandstands are involved, it is acceptable to spray herbicide under the stands to minimize mechanical edging/trimming.

### 3. Flower Bed Maintenance

- a. Flower beds shall be maintained weed-free at each mowing cycle.
- b. Hedges in flower beds shall be trimmed to maintain an "as designed" appearance.

### B. Other Conditions

- Wildflower areas shall be strictly enforced as non-mowing zones during certain times of the year as indicated by the Public Works Director or his designee. Some areas may not be shown on the provided maps.
- 2. For the purposes of this proposal the growing season will start the first full week in March and continue until the last full week in October.
- All lawn maintenance, trimming, edging, and flower bed maintenance is to be accomplished Monday through Saturday, between the hours of 8am to 7pm, weather permitting. It will be considered a breach of the contract if the schedule is repeatedly missed.
- 4. Unless otherwise instructed, the successful vendor(s) shall accomplish all tasks listed on a regular schedule, as agreed upon by the proposer and the Public Works Director or his

- designee. Any variance from the prescribed schedule will require a minimum of twenty-four (24) hour advance notification to the Public Works Director or his designee.
- 5. The successful vendor(s) will be required to send a facsimile or e-mail to Public Works Director (Ben White, b.white@farmersvilletx.com) or his designee to report proposed schedules and work accomplished every week that maintenance is accomplished under this agreement.
- 6. The successful vendor(s) shall be responsible for any damage done to plant material or other property during the maintenance operation. The successful vendor(s) shall be responsible for replacement of all trees, shrubs, ground covers, plant bed areas, and irrigation equipment destroyed by the successful vendor(s) and employees or agents of the successful vendor(s) during maintenance operations including labor costs associated with the repair(s). Trees and shrubs must not be bumped or marked by mowing or edging equipment. Mulch rings shall be reshaped within twenty-four hours when dislodged by mowing equipment. The successful vendor(s) must report damage immediately to the Public Works Director. Damage to trees or tree collars will be assessed at \$20.00 for each instance.
- 7. The successful vendor(s) shall furnish all supplies, tools, and equipment to be used on the job.
- 8. No chemicals, herbicides (weed killers), insecticides, fungicides, or fertilizers are to be used without the prior written approval of the Public Works Director or his designee.
- 9. The successful vendor(s) shall comply with all applicable governmental laws and regulations.
- 10. The City shall not be liable for any loss or damage sustained by the successful vendor(s). The successful vendor(s) shall save the City whole and harmless from and against any and all claims for liability or damage of whatsoever nature and kind, including costs of court and attorney's fees, suffered or asserted to have been suffered by any person or to any property of any person whomsoever, growing out of or resulting from or in any way connected with the performance of work under this agreement by the successful vendor(s). The successful vendor(s) shall exercise every necessary precaution for the safety of work site and the protection of any and all persons and/or property located adjacent to or making passage through the work site.
- 11. The successful vendor(s) shall fill out invoice forms for weekly or monthly payments. Invoices shall be itemized and grouped in accordance with the descriptions and groupings given in Attachment A. Groups shall be subtotaled on the invoice and an overall total shall be indicated.
- 12. The successful vendor(s) shall operate as an independent contractor and not as an agent, representative, partner, or employee of the City, and shall control the operations at the work site, and be solely responsible for the acts of omissions of the successful vendor(s) employees or agents.
- 13. Unit prices are to reflect the charges for mowing and associated tasks at each location.
- 14. Submission of a proposal constitutes understanding and acceptance of all terms, conditions, instruction, glossary, specifications, forms and statements contained in this proposal document.
- 15. The Public Works Director or his designee reserves the right to reduce or increase the number of mowing cycles at each individual location, based upon need, prevailing weather conditions, and available funding.
- 16. The service will be monitored by the Public Works Director or his designee. Contact information will be provided to the successful vendor(s).

- 17. Responses shall include a complete "list of machinery and equipment available" in order to determine whether or not the vendor can adequately perform the necessary work. All equipment the vendor anticipates committing to this contract, if awarded, should be included on the Machinery and Equipment Worksheet (Attachment E). Past experience has shown that it is absolutely essential to have adequate back-up equipment in reserve to allow for breakdowns.
  - Insufficient and/or inadequate equipment as determined by the City is cause for rejection of a proposal.
  - b. Contractor equipment must be maintained in good operating condition and in sufficient quantities to adequately perform all services.
  - c. The contractor is responsible for performing scheduled maintenance on all equipment used on the contract.

### 18. Supervision of Work Crew

- a. Each work crew shall have a designated person on the work site that has the authority to respond to inquiries about work details or priorities in English.
- b. The successful vendor(s) shall provide the Public Works Director or his designee with the name and phone number of a designated contact person available during normal business hours.

### IV. Insurance

ALL RESPONDENTS must submit, with the bid, proof of insurance coverage as stipulated in Attachment C. Any provisions outlined in Attachment C will be required of the successful firm only. This insurance shall be effective for the contract duration and renewal certificates shall also be supplied upon expiration.

- C. Sufficient staffing, 20%.








