Subject: January 2016 Budget Report

The monthly budget report will focus on the analysis of budgetary variances of the revenues and expenditures of each of the major operating funds and project the impact on available fund balance. As a benchmark for comparison, we'll bear in mind that as of the end of January, 4/12 months or 33.33% of the fiscal year has passed. For revenues and expenditures occurring evenly throughout the year, we expect to have used or collected close the 33.33% level, and to have 66.67% remaining budget for the remaining of the year.

Presented in this format are: 1) an executive summary describing current budget issues, 2) budgetary comparison schedules of each major operating fund of the city, and 3) a fiscal year to date activity summary for cash and investments.

Executive Summary

The major operating funds that are part of the annual operating budget of the city are the general, water & wastewater, refuse, and electric funds.

General Fund

Total revenues in the general fund are 41.88% collected and total expenses are 34.05%

Ad Valorem collections currently received is 73.61%. Majority of property taxes are collected in the month of January

Sales Tax current collection rate @ 33.88%.

Gas Franchise fees are collected on an annual basis. Total collected to date is 116.26%.

Municipal Court Revenues currently collected is 17.66%. Court is expecting to see increase in fine payment within the next few months.

Refuse Fund

Total revenues are 33.72% and total expenses are 28.26%.

Water & Wastewater Fund

Total revenues for the Water Fund are 33.20% Total revenues for the Wastewater Fund are 31.37%

Water expenses in Administration are 33.23%. Water Department overall expenditures are 29.71%

Wastewater expenses are 33.55%.

Electric Fund

Total revenues are 28.15%; the expenses are at 33.65% and include transfers to general fund.

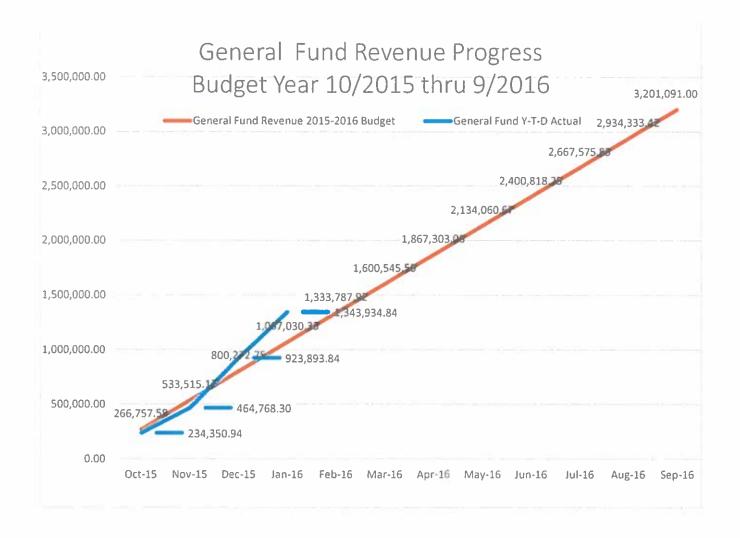

CITY OF FARMERSVILLE RESOLUTION # R-2016-0223-001

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZATION OF AGENTS EXERCISING BUSINESS FOR THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE; DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY, ADOPTING AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville wishes to use a Financial Institution as a designated depository for the funds of the City and to provide other financial accommodations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville expresses the use of certain individuals to have authorization to exercise business on behalf of the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the signatures of the agents as reflected on Exhibit "A" shall stand as conclusive evidence of their authority to act on behalf of the City. Any Agent, so long as they act in a representative capacity as an Agent of the City, is authorized to make any and all other stipulations and orders which they may deem advisable for the effective exercise of the powers given, subject to any restrictions as agreed to in writing.

WHEREAS, all contracts and agreements shall be expressed through City Council approval and written minutes of the meeting of which said contracts and agreements were approved by the City Council for action by the Agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS;

SECTION 1. The signature of an Agent on this resolution is conclusive evidence of their authority to act on behalf of the City. Any Agent, so long as they act in a representation capacity as an Agent of the City, is authorized to make any and all other contracts, agreements, stipulations and orders which they may deem advisable for the effective exercise of the powers indicated:

- 1) Endorse checks and orders for the payment of money or otherwise withdraw or transfer funds on deposit with the Financial Institution.
- 2) Enter into agreements for additional night depository, wire transfers and ACH capabilities per limits assigned as shown on Exhibit "A."
- 3) Enter into a written lease for the purpose of renting, maintaining, accessing and terminating a Safe Deposit Box in this Financial Institution.

All transactions, if any, with respect to any deposits, withdrawals, rediscounts and borrowings by or on behalf of the City with the Financial Institution prior to the adoption of this resolution are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

SECTION 2. The City agrees to the terms and conditions of any account agreement, properly opened by any Agent of the City. The City authorized the Financial Institution, at any time, to charge the City for all checks, drafts, or other orders, for the payment of

money, that are drawn on the Financial Institution, so long as they contain the required number of signatures for this purpose.

SECTION 3. The City acknowledges and agrees that the Financial Institution may furnish at its discretion automated access devices to Agents of the City to facilitate those powers authorized by this resolution or other resolutions in effect at the time of issuance. The term "automated access device" includes, but is not limited to, credit cards, automated teller machines (ATM), and debit cards.

SECTION 4. The City acknowledges and agrees that the Financial Institution may rely on alternative signature and verification codes issued to or obtained from the City. The term "alternative signature and verification codes" includes, but is not limited to, facsimile signatures on file with the Financial Institution, personal identification numbers (PIN), and digital signatures.

SECTION 5. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately from its passage. This resolution shall continue to have effect until express written notice of its rescission or modification has been received and recorded by the Financial Institution. Any and all prior resolutions adopted by the City of Farmersville and certified by the Financial Institution as governing the operation of this City's account(s), are in full force and effect, until the Financial Institution receives and acknowledges an express written notice of its revocation, modification or replacement. Any revocation, modification or replacement of a resolution must be accompanied by documentation, satisfactory to the Financial Institution, establishing the authority for the changes.

SECTION 6. All provisions of the resolutions of the City of Farmersville in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed, and all other provisions of the Resolutions of the City of Farmersville not in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, shall remain in full force and effect.

COUNTY OF COLLIN CITY OF FARMERSVILLE

ELECTION SERVICES

BY THE TERMS OF THIS CONTRACT made and entered into by and between the CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY," and BRUCE SHERBET, Elections Administrator of Collin County, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "Contracting Officer," pursuant to the authority in Subchapter D, Section 31.092, of Chapter 31, of the Texas Election Code, agree to the following particulars in regard to coordination, supervision and running of the City's May 7, 2016 General Election and a City Runoff Election, if necessary, on June 18, 2016. An additional cost estimate, early voting calendar, and Election Day polling place schedule will be prepared should a Runoff Election be necessary.

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THIS AGREEMENT is entered into in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set out. IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- I. DUTIES AND SERVICES OF CONTRACTING OFFICER. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for performing the following duties and shall furnish the following services and equipment:
- A. The Contracting Officer shall arrange for appointment, notification (including writ of election), training and compensation of all presiding judges, alternate judges, the judge of the Central Counting Station and judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board.
 - a. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for notification of each Election Day and Early Voting presiding judge and alternate judge of his or her appointment. The recommendations of the City will be the accepted guidelines for the number of clerks secured to work in each Vote Center. The presiding election judge of each Vote Center, however, will use his/her discretion to determine when additional manpower is needed during peak voting hours. The Contracting Officer will determine the number of clerks to work in the Central Counting Station and the number of clerks to work on the Ballot Board.

Election judges shall be secured by the Contracting Officer with the approval of the City.

- b. Election judges shall attend the Contracting Officer's school of instruction (Elections Seminar); calendar will be provided.
- c. Election judges shall be responsible for picking up from and returning election supplies to the county election warehouse located at 2010 Redbud Blvd., Suite 102, McKinney. Compensation for this pickup and delivery of supplies will be \$25.00.
- d. The Contracting Officer shall compensate each election judge and worker. Each judge shall receive \$12.00 per hour for services rendered. Each alternate judge and clerk shall receive \$10.00 per hour for services rendered. Overtime will be paid to each person working over 40 hours per week.
- B. The Contracting Officer shall procure, prepare, and distribute voting machines, election kits and election supplies.
 - a. The Contracting Officer shall secure election kits which include the legal documentation required to hold an election and all supplies including locks, pens, magic markers, etc.
 - b. The Contracting Officer shall secure all tables, chairs, and legal documentation required to run the Central Counting Station.
 - c. The Contracting Officer shall provide all lists of registered voters required for use on Election Day and for the early voting period required by law.
 - d. The Contracting Officer shall procure and arrange for the distribution of all election equipment and supplies required to hold an election.

- 1. Equipment includes the rental of voting machines, ADA compliance headphones and keypads (1 per site), transfer cases, voting signs and election supply cabinets.
- 2. Supplies include smart cards, sample ballots, provisional forms, maps, labels, pens, tape, markers, etc.
- C. The Contracting Officer, Bruce Sherbet, shall be appointed the Early Voting Clerk by the City.
 - a. The Contracting Officer shall supervise and conduct Early Voting by mail and in person and shall secure personnel to serve as Early Voting Deputies.
 - b. Early Voting by personal appearance for the City's May 7, 2016, General Election shall be conducted during the time period at the locations listed in Exhibit "A", attached and incorporated by reference into this contract.
 - c. All applications for an Early Voting mail ballot shall be received and processed by the Collin County Elections Administration Office,
 2010 Redbud Blvd., Suite 102, McKinney, Texas 75069.
 - 1. Application for mail ballots erroneously mailed to the City shall immediately be faxed to the Contracting Officer for timely processing. The original application shall then be forwarded to the Contracting Officer for proper retention.
 - 2. All Federal Post Card Applicants (FPCA) will be sent a mail ballot. No postage is required.
 - d. All Early Voting ballots (those cast by mail and those cast by personal appearance) shall be prepared for count by the Early Voting Ballot Board in accordance with Section 87.000 of the Texas Election

Code. The presiding judge of this Board shall be appointed by the Contracting Officer.

- D. The Contracting Officer shall arrange for the use of all Election Day Vote Centers. The City shall assume the responsibility of remitting the cost of all employee services required to provide access, provide security or provide custodial services for the Vote Centers. The Election Day Vote Centers are listed in Exhibit "B", attached and incorporated by reference into this contract.
- E. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for establishing and operating the Central Counting Station to receive and tabulate the voted ballots in accordance with Section 127.001 of the Election Code and of this agreement. Counting Station Manager and Central Count Judge shall be Bruce Sherbet. The Tabulation Supervisor shall be Patty Seals.
 - a. The Tabulation Supervisor shall prepare, test and run the county's tabulation system in accordance with statutory requirements and county policies, under the auspices of the Contracting Officer.
 - b. The Public Logic and Accuracy Test of the electronic voting system shall be conducted.
 - c. Election night reports will be available to the City at the Central Counting Station on election night. Provisional ballots will be tabulated after election night in accordance with law.
 - d. The Contracting Officer shall prepare the unofficial canvass report after all precincts have been counted, and will provide a copy of the unofficial canvass to the City as soon as possible after all returns have been tallied.
 - e. The Contracting Officer shall be appointed the custodian of the voted ballots and shall retain all election material for a period of 22 months.
 - 1. Pending no litigation and as prescribed by law, the voted ballots shall be shredded 22 months after the election.

- 2. The City can obtain the list of registered voters from the Elections Administration Office after this retention period. Pending no litigation and if the City does not request the lists, the Contracting Officer shall destroy them.
- f. The Contracting Officer shall conduct a manual count as prescribed by Section 127.201 of the Texas Election Code and submit a written report to the City in a timely manner. The Secretary of State may waive this requirement. If applicable, a written report shall be submitted to the Secretary of State as required by Section 127.201(E) of the aforementioned code.
- II. **DUTIES AND SERVICES OF THE CITY.** The City shall assume the following responsibilities:
- A. The City shall prepare the election orders, resolutions, notices, official canvass and other pertinent documents for adoption by the appropriate office or body. The City assumes the responsibility of posting all notices and likewise promoting the schedules for Early Voting and Election Day.
- B. The City shall provide the Contracting Officer with an updated map and street index of their jurisdiction in an electronic (shape file preferred) or printed format as soon as possible but no later than Friday, March 4, 2016.
- C. The City shall procure and provide the Contracting Officer with the ballot layout and Spanish interpretation in an electronic format.
 - a. The City shall deliver to the Contracting Officer as soon as possible, but no later than 5:00 PM Thursday, February 25, 2016, the official wording for the City's May 7, 2016, General Election.
 - b. The City shall approve the "blue line" ballot format prior to the final printing.
- D. The City shall post the publication of election notice by the proper methods with the proper media.

- E. The City shall compensate the Contracting Officer for any additional verified cost incurred in the process of running this election or for a manual count this election may require, consistent with charges and hourly rates shown on Exhibit "C" for required services.
- F. The City shall pay the Contracting Officer 90% of the estimated cost to run the said election prior to Friday, April 1, 2016 (the "Partial Payment"). The Contracting Officer shall place the funds in a "contract fund" as prescribed by Section 31.100 of the Texas Election Code. The Deposit should be delivered within the mandatory time frame to:

Collin County Treasury 2300 Bloomdale Rd. #3138 McKinney, Texas 75071

Made payable to: "Collin County Treasury" with the note "for election services" included with check documentation.

- G. The City shall pay the cost of conducting said election, less the Partial Payment, including the 10% administrative fee, pursuant to the Texas Election Code, Section 31.100, within 30 days from the date of final billing.
- III. COST OF SERVICES. The estimated cost to run the City's May 7, 2016, General Election including the 10% administrative fee referenced in Paragraph II.G., above, is projected as Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-Three Dollars and Sixty-Five Cents (\$8,973.65). The Partial Payment referenced in Paragraph II.F. is calculated to be Eight Thousand Seventy-Six Dollars and Twenty-Eight Cents (\$8,076.28). See Exhibit "C" for all other Cost of Services.

IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

A. Nothing contained in this contract shall authorize or permit a change in the officer with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the City's May 7, 2016, General Election is to be filed or the place at which any function is to be carried out, or any nontransferable functions specified under Section 31.096 of the Texas Election Code.

CITY OF FARMERSVILLE SEWER TAP AGREEMENT

(Mont Hendricks)

This Sewer Tap Agreement ("Agreement") is effective from and after the date of execution of the last party to sign this Agreement, by and between the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City"), a Type A general-law municipal corporation, and Mont Hendricks in his capacity as the owner of the "Property" described herein below ("Property Owner").

- WHEREAS, Mont Hendricks owns a certain tract of unplatted property containing approximately 0.068 acres of land, more or less, in the W.B. Williams Survey, Abstract No. 952, Block 4, Tract 123 in Farmersville, Collin County, Texas that is more commonly known as 1011 Old McKinney Road, Farmersville, Texas 75442 (the "Property"); and
- WHEREAS, a sewer tap was installed and connected to the City's sewer main and extended to the Property at some time prior to Property Owner's ownership of the Property; and
- WHEREAS, there exists no documentation explaining the basis for the existence of the sewer tap that was previously installed and connected to the City's sewer main and extended to the Property; and
- WHEREAS, the sewer tap on the Property was never connected to or utilized in conjunction with any past uses or then current uses on the Property; and
- WHEREAS, the City requested and the Property Owner agreed to disable and remove the unused sewer tap that was previously installed and connected to the City's sewer main and extended to the Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by each party hereto, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. All of the foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Agreement as if copied in their entirety.
- 2. City agrees to install and connect one time only, at City's sole cost and expense for labor and materials, one single sanitary sewer tap up to four inches (4") in

diameter to the City's sanitary sewer main and extend such sanitary sewer tap to the boundary line of the Property nearest to the sanitary sewer main as determined by City in City's sole discretion ("Sewer Tap"). Said Sewer Tap shall be installed in accordance with the City's then applicable design guidelines.

- 3. Property Owner agrees to provide City at least 60 days' written notice requesting the installation of the Sewer Tap to serve the Property. City will use its best efforts to install the Sewer Tap within thirty (30) days and no later than sixty (60) days following City's receipt of Property Owner's written request for the Sewer Tap.
- 4. Property Owner specifically understands and agrees that Property Owner shall be solely responsible for all costs, expenses and fees associated with the design and construction of any service line(s) connected to said Sewer Tap and that said Sewer Tap shall be used by only one sewer customer of City.
- 5. If Property Owner desires a larger sanitary sewer tap than the Sewer Tap described in Paragraph 2, above, City shall, instead of connecting and installing the Sewer Tap, provide Property Owner a one-time credit of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) against the then applicable cost of installing and connecting the size of sanitary sewer tap Property Owner requests in accordance with Paragraph 3, above. Property Owner specifically understands and agrees that City's grant of such Six Hundred Dollar (\$600) credit to Property Owner shall relieve City of all further responsibility under this Agreement; and, that Property Owner shall be solely responsible for all costs and expenses in excess of such Six Hundred Dollar (\$600) credit as may be required to install and connect the size sanitary sewer tap requested by Property Owner.
- 6. Property Owner agrees that all coordination required with public and/or private utility agencies to eliminate conflicts with proposed street grades or underground improvements for any work performed by Property Owner on or about the Property shall be the responsibility of Property Owner. Likewise, coordination for any work performed by Property Owner on or about the Property with agencies requiring special conditions (i.e., railroads and the Texas Department of Transportation) shall be the responsibility of Property Owner.
- 7. Property Owner expressly acknowledges that by entering into this Agreement, Property Owner together with its successors, assigns, vendors, grantees, and/or trustees, shall not construe any language contained herein or in any exhibits hereto as waiving any of the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance or Subdivision Ordinance or any other ordinance of the City except as herein specifically identified and agreed.
- 8. Property Owner further expressly acknowledges the Property shall be developed in accordance with the standards as set forth in City of Farmersville's zoning, subdivision and land development ordinances including, but not limited to, provisions as to drainage, erosion control, pro rata payments, storm water, tree

- preservation, park land dedication, hike and bike trails, impact fees, Street Design Standards, Public Improvements Policy and construction standards.
- 9. This Agreement shall be a covenant running with the land, and be binding upon Property Owner, its successors, heirs, assigns, grantees, vendors, trustees, representatives, and all others holding any interest now or in the future.
- 10. This Agreement shall not be assignable by Property Owner without the prior written consent of the City, and such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.
- 11. This Agreement has been duly authorized by the respective governing bodies of the parties hereto and the undersigned officer is the duly authorized officer of each entity to execute this Agreement.
- 12. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective legal representatives and successors.
- 13. This Agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior understandings or oral agreements between the parties respecting the subject matter.
