

### FARMERSVILLE CITY COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION MINUTES For January 10, 2017, 6:00 P.M.

### I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

- Mayor Piwko called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members John Klostermann, Michael Hesse, Donny Mason, Mike Hurst, and Leaca Caspari were all present. City staff members Ben White, Paula Jackson, Sandra Green, Kim Morris, Rick Ranspot, Daphne Hamlin, Adah Leah Wolf, Mike Sullivan, and City Attorney, Alan Lathrom, were also present.
- Prayer was led by Chief Kim Morris with the City of Farmersville Fire
   Department followed by the pledges to the United States flag and Texas flag.
- Mayor Piwko stated that the City offices would be closed on Monday, January 16<sup>th</sup> in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

- Mayor Piwko asked to pull the City Council Minutes, Public Works Report, and City Manager's Report for discussion.
  - Motion made to approve reports B-F, and I by Michael Hesse
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was made by Leaca Caspari
  - All council members voted in favor
- Mayor Piwko indicated on page 9 of the City Council Minutes it showed no
  action was taken in regards to the possible regulation of personal property
  and other materials placed or left in the areas open to the public view,
  including, but not necessarily limited to, carports. Mayor Piwko stated the
  "no action taken" needed to be removed because Council directed Alan
  Lathrom to draft an ordinance for Council to review at a future meeting.
- Leaca Caspari stated that on page 11 were it stated "Leaca Caspari asked
  if the donation was a gift" could be removed because it was a ret oracle
  question. Also, on page 12 the name of the landowner was incorrectly
  spelled.
  - Motion to approve City Council Minutes with changes made by Leaca Caspari
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was made by Donny Mason
  - All council members voted in favor
- Mayor Piwko indicated she wanted an explanation on the two recent water leaks that were shown in the Public Works report under Water System, item 2. She wanted information on the leak under the railroad tracks and how the report indicated that it could be very costly.
- Ben White stated the City has a cast iron line that was installed in 1922 and
  it has started to leak. Old cast iron lines leak and the new construction is
  on top of the leak. There is some belief the new construction could have
  caused the leak. The leak is small in nature, but it does cause a great deal
  of concern for the Railroad Company. What the City has told the Railroad
  Company is that the City will work quickly to fix the leak.
- Mayor Piwko asked if the leak was going to require the pulling up of the recently completed road.
- Ben White indicated no and the City is going to bore under the railroad tracks and move the line to alleviate more damage. The City may move it 100 feet to 200 feet to the north and that will get it away from being right underneath the railroad crossing.
- Mayor Piwko asked why Ben White was alerting the Council that it may be more expensive to fix this leak.
- Ben White explained that it is costly to bore. He felt like Council should know of the possible costs upfront.

- Michael Hesse inquired if the City would have to have the area inspected to check for a sink hole.
- Ben White stated that the Railroad Company's Engineer is in charge of that and makes those calls. He has not indicated that it is an issue.
- Mike Hurst inquired if the line ran adjacent or parallel to the railroad tracks and would it be necessary to make a bore or could the City just kill the line on both sides and make the line go where the City wanted it to go.
- Ben White explained that the City can kill the line, but that would be limiting
  the amount of crossings the City conducts between two halves of the
  hydraulic plan. The City needs that crossing in case something goes
  wrong with the water system.
- Michael Hess inquired if Ben White had any idea what the cost would be.
- Ben White indicated it could be tens of thousands of dollars.
- Mayor Piwko asked when they started the process of reconstructing the railroad crossing eight to ten years ago was there an inspection of the line then.
- Ben White stated in 1922 water lines were not incased and the City did not know. It could have continued to work fine for several more year and never caused a problem.
- Mayor Piwko continued and asked about the second water leak and wanted to know how the house became flooded.
- Ben White stated when a water leak happens in a main it can be major and could shoot up 50 feet in to the air. That is how the house was flooded.
   This is an example of why the City does not build mains by structures. It is worse than a rain storm. It comes in like a hard wind gust at an angle. Ben stated he assumed the windows did not form a perfect seal.
- Mayor Piwko asked if the house had major or minor damage.
- Ben White explained that it had minor water infiltration into the home.
- Paula Jackson stated that she spoke to the home owner and she was happy with Servpro drying her carpet.
- Mayor Piwko indicated that she was wanting to make sure the home owner was taken care of.
- Ben White stated that the City did take care of house.
- Donny Mason asked about the progress on Hamilton Street from McKinney Street to U.S. Highway 380.
- Ben White stated the project is still in engineering.
- Mayor Piwko stated she noticed the same thing on the page for General Obligation Bonds and inquired if the start date needed to be moved.
- Ben White explained that an adjustment could be made on the start date.
   The Engineers have the alignment completed, but they made the decision to not concrete all the way to U.S. Highway 380. There is interaction with the church as to whether we could straighten out the intersection so

Hamilton Street going across to the south side could be aligned at that point. The way to move forward is to create an S curve at the church now and hope to solve the alignment issue in the future. Then, work the concrete section from there going north. It will prevent digging up the concrete in five or six years.

- Mayor Piwko asked if the alignment that was determined is even for widening the road on both sides. She also asked if the City was going to come closer to the houses on the east side.
- Ben White indicated that the City was trying to go to the west side but there
  are some issues with alignment on the south side and right-of-way
  acquisitions. There have been decisions made with regards to realigning
  the north side and connecting with the existing Hamilton Street at
  McKinney Street. All issues are being worked, even if progress is slow.
- Mike Hurst inquired about the progress on Jackson Street.
- Ben White stated the proctor test was not met so forms had to removed that were put in for curbs and gutters. The City has explained to the contractor to stop using the base material they are using, because the City will not allow them to go forward until they meet the proctor test. The proctor test for density is there to ensure a stable base is in place before concrete is poured. It delays the project when the contractors do not want to follow the rules.
- Mike Hurst asked if the City requires a performance bond on jobs that penalize the contractors if the job is not completed by a certain date.
- Ben White stated that the City has a performance bond on every job.
   Every time the contractors have to rip something out they get further and further behind and they stop making money. Later down the road, people tend to do funny things and take short cuts. But, the City is holding them to the letter of the law.
- Mike Hurst stated the contractors cannot just quit and leave and the bond just pick that up.
- Ben White explained that it has happened where the contractor went into bankruptcy and they were going to execute a performance bond. At that point, another contractor would be chosen to perform the job. The City would work with the insurance company to ensure the contractor would perform and do the job as stated.
- Leaca Caspari inquired about N. Washington Street and the pool of water that was there.
- Ben White stated that the City patched the street as much as possible but the street has a dip in it causing the standing water to stay in that area.
   The City would have to fix the dip to prevent water from standing. The drainage area located at the end of the Street by the school has been worked on.

- Leaca Caspari explained that it is someone's perspective that the work the City has done there over the past several years has exasperated the problem.
- Ben White answered by stating that he does not believe that is what has happened. The City did re-work some of the drainage at the end of the street so it would drain better. The City would have to change the grade of half of the street to fix the problem. The problem has existed a very long time and it has not become worse. Unless City Council directs staff to reconstruct the street now, then it will stay the way it is until the City can reconstruct it later.

- Mayor Piwko asked about the Planning Engineer information on the City Manager's Report. Mayor Piwko read the report regarding the Planning Engineer and how there were six packets submitted for review. Then, the next step would be to present to 4A and then Council for approval. She explained that it was her understanding the team the City set up would choose the top three. Then, the three selected would present to Council and then Council would choose from those along with recommendations.
- Ben White explained that 4A is providing the money so the City wanted to
  give them the courtesy to see the process occur. The 4A Board may
  down select to the company they recommend, but Council will make the
  final selection. All three choices will be brought in to present to Council.
  The Council will get the selection team recommendation, the 4A Board
  recommendation, and then Council will make a decision based on the
  input from those groups.
- Mayor Piwko asked if the City knew if the 4A Board was going to make their selection at the January 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- Daphne Hamiln, 4A Board staff liaison, stated it was on the next agenda.
- Ben White explained that it will be on the next City Council meeting agenda.

### V. <u>REGULAR AGENDA</u>

- A. Consider, discuss and act upon filing appeal of the North Texas Municipal Water District water rates with the Public Utility Commission.
  - Ben White addressed Council and stated that in the packet was paperwork from Plano, Richardson, Mesquite, and Garland regarding their filing with the Public Utility Commission to have the method which is being used by North Texas Municipal Water District revamped to determine rates. Those cities believe the methods are unfair and they are going in front of the Public Utility Commission to make changes to the rules. Member cities have a contract with North Texas Municipal Water District that was created in the 1950's and the contract has been updated in a minor way since then, but the basics have stayed in place for a very long time. The City of Wylie and the City of Princeton filed a Motion to Intervene. The basis of their beliefs is the contract is decent and the contract has served every city well. The bigger cities are built out, but they are a huge percentage of the water usage in the system right now. The City of Farmersville is one of the growing cities. If the rules were changed it might hurt the City. Our rates have not gone up. except 5 years ago there was an increase. The growing cities are taking one view point and the non-growing cities are taking a different view point. Ben recommends the City of Farmersville join the City of Wylie and the City of Princeton and file a Motion to Intervene. The motion does not put the City at the table, but the judge or the body that is making the decision will take the City of Farmersville's information in to account when decisions are made. The larger cities have a long road to prove that North Texas Municipal Water District is applying unfair rates. Ben stated all cities are applied the same rate. Ben said he believes North Texas Municipal Water District has not done anything but what is responsible for the upkeep and care of the water system. The rates are expensive, but they are not out of line with national or Texas averages.

The City of Farmersville is definitely not the highest when it comes to charging water fees. Ben indicated that he believes the North Texas Municipal Water District is doing a good job at supplying the City water at the lowest cost. The North Texas Municipal Water District has had a lot of things against them lately. The zebra mussels and drought have had an effect on the water system. Also, along with a drought comes the use of water. People have to conserve, but the price of water still remains the same. The rates are hurt because of this. North Texas Municipal Water District manages the system well. Ben recommended to Council that they advise the City Attorney, Alan Lathrom, to file a Motion to Intervene.

- Mike Hurst asked how much the rates differed from city to city.
- Ben White explained all cities are charged the same rates from the North Texas Municipal Water District. Every city charges a little different and it is hard to compare. The City of Farmersville is in the medium to high middle in regards to rates. The cities involved are all over the place in comparison to the City of Farmersville rates. Everyone is on a sliding scale.
- Mike Hurst asked if the other cities' impact fees take care of the cost of water rates. For example, those cities that have big subdivisions, do they base their impact fees in order to help overcome the rates.
- Ben White explained that impact fees are used for line increases, pump stations, or a water tower. It does not go to the North Texas Municipal Water District for them to take care of water treatment. Impact fees are applied to take care of our local costs.
- Mike Hurst asked if the rates will fluctuate up at all.
- Ben White stated if there was growth all of a sudden the City would start
  collecting more impact fees, and those fees would take care of the
  growth. The assumption is that the impact fee is set correctly to offset
  the cost of growth. The City has to stay above the curve and have pump
  stations and water towers in place to take care of that.
- Leaca Caspari stated that she believed impact fees are for the structural improvements that will need to be made.
- Alan Lathrom answered by saying that is what they are designed for.
- Ben White stated they help with lines, ground storage tanks, and elevated storage tanks.
- Alan Lathrom indicated all the member cities pay the same rate for the
  water. The contract between the member cities requires those cities to
  pay for all the water they have taken in their largest year of usage. If
  they do not use that amount of water every year they still have to pay
  that amount. The four cities that have filed the rate case have had the
  benefit of having the cities that are now growing help fund the

infrastructure that the North Texas Municipal Water District has built since the 1980's. The larger cities have been paying their money, but they do not want to pay those rates anymore because they are built out. North Texas Municipal Water District still has to address the needs of all the cities that are entering into the growth phase. The larger cities are upset because they are still paying the rates for their highest usage point. The City of Farmersville impact fees are used to help with infrastructure that will service new development. For example, oversized lines, transmission lines, ground storage tanks, water towers, and how the City gets water to our residents are just a few. The cost that North Texas Municipal Water District runs into are things like the new reservoir they are building and cost for pumping water from Lake Texoma to east Texas and back over to all the member cities. Those costs are built into the rate they charge each city. So, this is not a rate case. It is to force a change in the contract because it takes every member city to agree on the change.

- Ben White stated that unknown to Council there have been talks in the background among City Managers to change wording in the contract, but they are not there yet. The City of Plano had set a deadline before the end of the year, but when the wording was not agreed on Plano decided to file for the rate change. It is a take or pay issue for those four cities. For the City of Farmersville, we want the ability to grow. Based on the current contract, we are not meeting our take or pay right now. The City is paying more per gallon, but the City structure is going to change soon. The City will be going over that amount and that is why it has not be recommended to join or fight the take or pay issue.
- Mike Hurst stated that once the City reaches that point that is when it is going to be a take or pay the next year.
- Ben White explained that by contract the North Texas Municipal Water
  District will have to give us the water we need. All the cities will be
  paying for that, just like the City of Farmersville helped pay for the City of
  Plano's growth. The City did not want to invoke anything to raise our
  rates.
- Mayor Piwko commented on how the press releases that were put out were purposely inflammatory with ignoring things like the 70% increase in rates is mainly attributed to the new water line because of the zebra mussels.
- Ben White explained they were trying to negotiate, so their best foot would be forward in regards to their own view point.
- Mayor Piwko stated that the City has two examples of the Motion to Intervene. The City of Wylie and the City of Princeton's motions are almost word for word and then the one from Rockwall was a little

- different. Mayor Piwko asked Alan Lathrom if he had a recommendation of one being better than the other.
- Alan Lathrom stated that he had not review them to determine which would be better.
- Mayor Piwko indicated she liked The City of Rockwall motion because it appeared to lay out how it impacted the cities and was more detailed.
- Ben White stated that the City just has to get our Motion to Intervene filed.
- Alan Lathrom explained the Council can make a motion for direction since it would be to intervene in the lawsuit.
  - Motion to direct Alan Lathrom to prepare a Motion to Intervene made by Leaca Caspari
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was made by Mike Hurst
  - All council members voted in favor
- B. Consider, discuss and act upon Resolution #R-2017-0110-001 readopting and reaffirming City of Farmersville investment policy and related investment strategies adopted by and through Resolution #R-2015-0623-001.
  - Ben White explained the Resolution is a policy the City already has in place. It is required that it be reaffirmed and if statements are worded appropriate to the Council it can be approve, or if it requires changes that can be done. The review has to be completed annually and it is a good financial process and the auditors recommend it.
  - Alan Lathrom explained that Texas Government Code 22.56 requires it to be reviewed every year, but you do not want an expiration date on the document in case it is not presented to Council before the expiration date.
  - Mike Hurst stated it seemed pretty conservative.
  - Ben White explained the types of investments the City is doing are conservative in regards to tax payer's money.
    - Motion to adopt the policy made by Leaca Caspari
    - o 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was made by John Klostermann
    - o All council members voted in favor
- C. Consider, discuss and act upon approval of the Final Plat for Lots 1 & 2, Block 1 of the Beech Addition.
  - Mayor Piwko stated that the plat had been pulled from the agenda because it should have had a public hearing. But, Ben White could sign it since it is a minor plat. Minor plats do not require a public hearing.
  - Ben White explained he can approve a minor plat at any time, but he chooses to put it in front of council. Planning & Zoning has conducted a public hearing but it was not put on the Council agenda. The City could wait, but staff did not want to hold up owners. Since Planning &

- Zoning and the City Engineer has approved the plat, he feels comfortable signing it.
- Donny Mason explained he went by and looked at the lots. They were cleaned up and he believes it will be an improvement to the land.
- Ben White indicated that the plat meets all the city requirements and it will be an improvement.
  - O No action taken, Ben White will sign plat.
- D. Consider, discuss and act upon approval of the Final Plat for Lot 1, Block 1 of the Wiley Orange Addition.
  - Mayor Piwko asked if there was anyone in the audience who wanted to speak about the plat.
  - The Keller Williams realtor, Stephanie Hibbitts, spoke and stated the new owner was in the audience.
  - Ben White indicated that Daniel & Brown, Inc. approved the plat. The
    property had never been platted and that is why it does not require a
    public hearing.
  - Alan Lathrom added it is a matter of state law. State law mandates
    that if you have someone come in to replat property it means the
    property has been previously platted. If it has been previously platted
    and it is either deed restricted or zoned for residential use of two or
    fewer residences per lot, then state law mandates you have a public
    hearing. This law is in place to protect residential neighborhoods. The
    State says if the plat meets all the conditions of the Subdivision
    Ordinance then it has to be approved anyway.
  - Stephanie Hibbitts wanted to clarify that it is going from two lots to one.
  - Alan Lathrom stated that it does not make a difference.
    - Motion to approve the Final Plat made by Mike Hurst
    - o 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was made by Leaca Caspari
    - All council members voted in favor.
- E. Consider, discuss and act upon approval of annual Interlocal Agreements between Collin County and the City of Farmersville regarding dispatch services.
  - Mayor Piwko stated the Council was reviewing an annual renewal of the document.
  - Mike Sullivan, Police Chief, explained that he met with the Sheriff and he was very encouraged about his opinions about how everyone is in it together. The Sheriff is about to conduct a huge renovation of the dispatch center to handle the growth. All the cities committed to staying with the Collin County dispatch system. For the City to take on their own dispatch services would cost a significant amount. The Chief indicated that he is a part of a committee that is going to look at the

overall cost. They have a meeting on the 20<sup>th</sup> and he wants the City to be prepared that the amount of \$37,000 that the City is currently paying is going to increase a lot.

- Leaca Caspari asked Mike Sullivan if the issue from last year is okay.
- Mike Sullivan indicated that it was.
- Mayor Piwko asked if the County was breaking down the cost per call.
- Mike Sullivan stated that is what the committee is going to discuss. They are going to build a model that captures the cost and they will have to consider the cost of employees and consoles. All of that equipment is expensive. The City is due to go live on the new system. The County is joining the Palm system (Plano, Allen, Wylie, and Murphy) and they already have the basic infrastructure in place, but they are going to install towers. One of the towers is going to be located in Farmersville.
- Ben White explained that the City is planning on putting the towers by AFI, by City Hall, or by the waste water treatment plant.
- Mike Sullivan stated the City would have to try and fix things. For example when officers are in big box stores with all the metal, radios will not reach out. There are some cities that are requiring those stores to install antennas so officers are able to radio for assistance. The City has to build those requirements in ordinances. In the future the City will know the cost. No matter what, it will be cheaper to use the County.
- Ben White explained the City did have a radio for dispatch a long time ago and it is easier and cheaper for the City to go through the County
- John Klostermann asked if this will be a part of the new radio system the Police Department is transitioning to.
- Mike Sullivan responded that it would be and the officer's will be able
  to plug into other cities and a lot have GPS capabilities. If an officer is
  chasing someone in the field and is not answering the radio they would
  be able to find them.
- Ben White indicated a lot came from the 9-11 incident. The cities are a lot more powerful together.
- Mike Hurst stated that when he went to the annual conference in Austin regarding an active shooter it was suggested that training take place. The Chief of Police in Wylie would like to come here and conduct training since he is an alert trainer.
- Mike Sullivan indicated that they have spoken and it is about putting schedules together and getting it done.
- Mike Hurst stated that what concerns him is if someone gets caught in an active shooter situation then officer's need to know how to proceed.
   He wants to make sure everyone is protected and questioned whether

the training is something the City can do without a lot of expensive.

- Mike Sullivan stated that he has had training, but he would like all of his staff to have the training as well.

Subject: December 2016 Budget Report

The monthly budget report will focus on the analysis of budgetary variances of the revenues and expenditures of each of the major operating funds and project the impact on available fund balance. As a benchmark for comparison, we'll bear in mind that as of the end of December, 3/12 months or 25% of the fiscal year has passed. For revenues and expenditures occurring evenly throughout the year, we expect to have used or collected close the 25% level, and to have 75% remaining budget for the remaining of the year.

Presented in this format are: 1) an executive summary describing current budget issues, 2) budgetary comparison schedules of each major operating fund of the city, and 3) a fiscal year to date activity summary for cash and investments.

### **Executive Summary**

The major operating funds that are part of the annual operating budget of the city are the general, water & wastewater, refuse, and electric funds.

### General Fund

Total revenues in the general fund are 31.08% collected and total expenses are 26.97%.

Ad Valorem collections currently received is 43.56%. Delinquent Ad Valorem received is 40.44% Tax collections will increase in December 2016 and January 2017

Sales Tax current collection rate of 33.94%. Sales Tax exceeded expectations.

Municipal Court Revenues current collection rate of 22.41%.

Interest Earned is slowly on the rebound, still exceeding expectations, current collection rate 101.77%

### Refuse Fund

Total revenues are 29.05% and total expenses are 25.18%.

### Water & Wastewater Fund

Total revenues for the Water Fund are 24.37% Water expenses in Administration are 24.67%. Water Department overall expenditures are 21.84%

Total revenues for the Wastewater Fund are 23.95%Wastewater expenses are 21.52%.

### Electric Fund

Total revenues are 20.71%; the expenses are at 24.97%, includes transfers to general fund.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE. OBJECTING TO AND OPPOSING THE PLANNING. CONVERSION. CONSTRUCTION AND DESIGNATION OF U.S. HIGHWAY 380 A/K/A AUDIE MURPHY PARKWAY AND STATE HIGHWAY 78 AS LIMITED ACCESS ROADWAYS AND FURTHER REQUESTING THAT COMMISSIONERS COURT OF COLLIN COUNTY RECONSIDER AND RESCIND COURT ORDER NO. 2016-089-02-01, WHICH ORDER SEEKS THE SUPPORT OF THE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL AND THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO MAKE THOSE PORTIONS OF U.S. HIGHWAY 380 AND STATE HIGHWAY 78 LOCATED WITHIN AND ABOUT THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE INTO LIMITED ACCESS ROADWAYS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City Council") recently learned about Court Order No. 2016-089-02-01 adopted by the Commissioners Court of Collin County, Texas ("Commissioners Court") on February 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court through its adoption of Court Order No. 2016-089-02-01 seeks to make those portions of U.S. Highway 380 a/k/a Audie Murphy Parkway ("US 380") and State Highway 78 ("SH 78") located within Collin County into limited access roadways; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, the residents and stakeholders having an interest in the areas adjacent to and surrounding US 380 and SH 78 within and about City of Farmersville, Texas were not consulted regarding the decision of the Commissioners Court to make those portions of US 380 and SH 78 located within and about Farmersville into limited access roadways; and

WHEREAS, the City Council understands that limited access roadways are necessary to improve mobility in, about and through Collin County; however, significant study and due process need to be observed through the participation of persons and communities most impacted by the location of such limited access roadways being invited and encouraged to participate in the process to find the best route; and

WHEREAS, the City Council understands the need for improved mobility throughout Collin County, but believes converting those portions of US 380 and SH 78 located within and about Farmersville into limited access roadways is the wrong approach to improving mobility in the wrong location and bears too high an economic cost without a corresponding benefit to the public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council also understands that making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 located within Collin County into limited access roadways has not been

embraced by the governing bodies of all of the cities and adjoining counties through which parts of US 380 and SH 78 pass; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the potentially positive and negative aspects of making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways and finds the negative attributes of such a change far outwelgh any positive attributes hoped for by the Commissioners Court; and

WHEREAS, US 380 and SH 78, which highways currently intersect within the corporate limits of the City of Farmersville, geographically divide the City into quadrants around such intersection and further bisect the City along the axis of each such highway; and

WHEREAS, US 380 and SH 78 are currently readily accessible to and easily traveled and crossed by residents, business owners and operators, visitors, travelers and pedestrians at numerous roadway crossings along and about the length of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that making limited access roadways of those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within the City of Farmersville will totally divide and fragment the City of Farmersville into four distinct quadrants immediately adjacent to their intersection and totally bisect the City along the axis of each such highway because the existing accessibility to, upon, over and across US 380 and SH 78 within the City of Farmersville will be entirely eliminated when the walls and barriers required to make those portions of US 380 and SH 78 into limited access roadways are constructed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways will also negatively impact the businesses situated along both sides of US 380 and SH 78 through the anticipated taking of a portion of their property to make US 380 and SH 78 into limited access roadways, which acquisition may also render any number of parcels of land or lots on which businesses and their respective structures, signs and parking areas are situated nonconforming and subject to closure or otherwise make it impossible for a number of businesses to continue operating within the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways will also negatively impact the ability of residents and the customers of businesses to continue to frequent the businesses situated along both sides of US 380 and SH 78 because of the walls and barriers that must be constructed to make those highways into limited access roadways; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways will also

negatively impact the residents and other owners of property situated along US 380 and SH 78 through the taking of a portion of their property to make US 380 and SH 78 limited access roadways as well as the disruptions arising out of any required construction and the interruption and interference with the usual traffic and travel patterns of such residents caused by the walls and barriers established with a limited access roadways; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways: will, at a minimum interrupt, delay and change anticipated development; may interfere with and limit the City's ability to provide necessary municipal services; may interfere with the City's ability to provide emergency services; may possibly eliminate the planned expansion of a new Collin College campus into the City of Farmersville that will serve the residents in the eastern portion of Collin County; and will be injurious to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Farmersville, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas voted unanimously to object to and oppose making those portions of U.S. Highway 380 a/k/a Audie Murphy Parkway and State Highway 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS THAT:

<u>Section 1:</u> All of the above premises are found to be true and correct factual and legislative determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Resolution as if copied in their entirety.

Section 2: The City of Farmersville is opposed to and objects to planning, designing, converting, constructing, designating and making those portions of U.S. Highway 380 a/k/a Audie Murphy Parkway and State Highway 78 located within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways.

<u>Section 3:</u> The City of Farmersville respectfully requests that the Commissioners Court of Collin County reconsider and rescind Court Order No. 2016-089-02-01, which Order seeks the support of the Regional Transportation Council and the Texas Department of Transportation to make those portions of U.S. 380 and SH 78 located within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways.

Section 4: The City of Farmersville respectfully requests that the Commissioners Court of Collin County, after consultation with the residents of the City of Farmersville, Texas and other residents, business owners and operators, property owners and stakeholders along and about US 380 and SH 78 identify other options to improve mobility through Collin County that do not involve making those portions of US 380 and SH 78 within and about the City of Farmersville into limited access roadways.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, CALLING A GENERAL ELECTION FOR MAY 6, 2017 TO ELECT A COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 1, COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 3, AND COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 5, PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR DESIGNATING POLLING PLACES; PROVIDING FOR EARLY VOTING, NOTICES AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO SAID ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 3.004 of the Texas Election Code mandates that the governing body of a city with elective officers should order the general election for those officers; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 3.005 of the Texas Election Code mandates that an election on a uniform date shall be ordered not later than the 78<sup>th</sup> day before election day.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. In accordance with Texas Election Code § 3.004, this ordinance constitutes the City Council's ordering of an election to be held on Saturday, May 6, 2017, to elect the following officials for the City of Farmersville ("City"): Councilmember Place 1; Councilmember Place 3; and, Councilmember Place 5, all for two-year terms. The Order of General Election attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby approved and adopted by the City Council of the City of Farmersville as the Order for the General Election to be held on May 6, 2017.

<u>Section 2.</u> All independent candidates for the General Election to be held on May 6, 2017, for the above mentioned offices shall file their applications with the City Secretary at City Hall, 205 South Main Street, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, beginning January 18, 2017 and ending February 17, 2017. All applications shall be on a form as prescribed by Section 141.031 of the Texas Election Code. All applications shall become public information immediately upon filing.

<u>Section 3.</u> Should all candidates for a particular office in the General Election fail to receive a plurality vote, in that event it shall be the duty of the City Council to order a runoff election for every office in the regular municipal election to which no one was elected.

Section 4. The polling place for Election Day, May 6, 2017, shall be as follows:

Farmersville City Hall 205 S. Main Street Farmersville, TX 75442

<u>Section 5</u>. The poll at the above designated polling place shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Section 6. Early Voting by personal appearance for the election shall commence on April 24, 2017, at 8:00 a.m. and end at 7:00 p.m. on May 2, 2017. Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted during regular business hours from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., except for the final two days of the early voting period. On the final two days of early voting by personal appearance, which days are Monday, May 1, 2017, and Tuesday, May 2, 2017, the hours are hereby designated as 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.

<u>Section 7.</u> The polling place for Early Voting, April 24, 2017 through May 2, 2017, shall be in the Council Chambers in Farmersville City Hall, 205 S. Main St., Farmersville, TX.

<u>Section 8</u>. Collin County Elections Administrator is designated as the Early Voting Clerk. Qualified voters may mail applications for a voting mail-in ballot only from January 1, 2017 until the close of business on April 25, 2017. Requests for applications must be mailed to:

## Section 9. The City Secretary is ordered to do the following:

- Coordinate with the Collin County Elections Department, Bruce Sherbet, Elections Administrator, to hold the May 6, 2017 City of Farmersville General Election. Direct recording electronic voting machines shall be used for voting at the foregoing election polling place and electronic counting devices and equipment shall be used for counting the ballots at said election.
- 2. Provide and publish notice of the elections ordered in this resolution in accordance with the Texas Election Code.
- Coordinate with the Collin County Elections Department, Bruce Sherbet, Elections Administrator, to hold a runoff election conducted in accordance with the Texas Elections Code if no candidate receives a majority of the votes.

<u>Section 10</u>. The City Council shall give notice of this election in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 4 of the Texas Election Code, and the City Council shall issue all necessary orders and writs for said election.

<u>Section 11</u>. The Collin County Elections Administrator shall be responsible for establishing and operating the Central Counting Station to receive and tabulate the electronic voted ballots in accordance with Section 127.001 of the Texas Election Code. Counting Station Manager and Central Count Judge shall be Bruce Sherbet.

<u>Section 12</u>. Notice of Election shall be published in both English and Spanish in accordance with the Texas Election Code. Returns of said election shall be made to the Council immediately after closing of the polls.

<u>Section 13</u>. Should any part, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase contained in this resolution be held to be unconstitutional or of no force and effect, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this resolution, but in all respect said remaining portion shall be and remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 14</u>. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.


