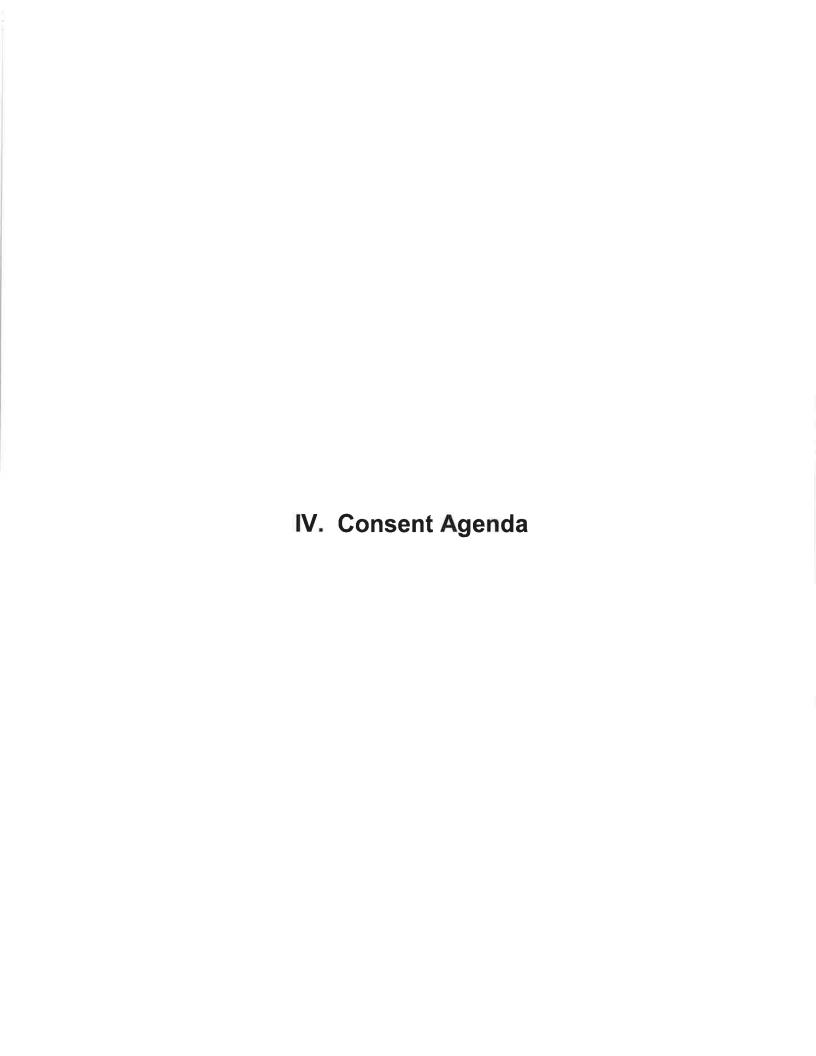

- Ben White stated this item included a Quitclaim Deed for the 8.1 miles in Hunt County that would extend the trail to the city limits of Celeste. The NETT is asking the city to put a surface on the 8.1 mile trail portion within 7 years.
- Craig Overstreet asked if the \$100,000.00 that 4B set aside was for this
  new part of the trail and if the city would have liability insurance for that
  portion of the trail.
- Ben White stated yes the money was set aside for a grant to get from the Texas Parks & Wildlife. He explained the liability insurance would be added if the Council approves this item.
- Steve Caspari, who is a representative of the 4B board, stated that he has confirmed the Rails to Trails have a grant writer that will take the \$50,000.00 and will get matched \$200,000.00.
- Craig Overstreet asked if they would do an overall study on what the trail needed.
- Steve Caspari stated the clearing of brush and bridges have already been completed. They are just wanting us to resurface it.
- Dwain Mathers said the grading and removal of brush has been done all the way up to Celeste.
- Mike Henry asked what the cost of maintenance would be for the mowing.
- Ben White stated it would be approximately \$20,000.00 a year for mowing
  of the new edition. Right now our public works crew are mowing the
  current trail, but they are tasked with other things and would be able to
  keep up with it.
- Craig Overstreet asked if there have been any issues with vandalism on the trail.
- Chief Sullivan stated they get phone calls that ask for more police presence on the trail, but he stated that there has been no vandalism calls or any other calls within the past two years.
- Leaca Caspari, who resides at 405 Summit Street, stated she has spoken
  with the gentleman who takes care of the trail right now and he stated that
  he maintains the 8.1 miles plus a few more within a day. She said that he
  indicated if the weeds and poison ivy are sprayed and keep back away
  from the trail it makes it easier to maintain. They are planning to have a
  non-profit group, Friends of the Trail, help take care of the trail.
- Mike Henry asked about the liability of the trail and how much that would cost the city.
- Daphne Hamlin stated it would probably be less than \$1,000.00 a year.
- Craig Overstreet asked if the police department would patrol the trail on bikes.

- Chief Sullivan stated they do not have an overtime budget and they have a limited staff.
- Dwain Mathers asked how they would handle special events on the trail.
- Chief Sullivan stated special event applicants have to pay the police officers on their own.
- Mayor Wiebold asked if there was a way we can get the county to put up more signs when the trail gets close to County Roads.
- Dwain Mathers stated that signs are already in place.
- Jim Hemby asked if someone got hurt on the trail how would fire and EMS respond.
- Chief Morris stated that the ambulance service, AMR, responds to both Collin and Hunt County areas. He stated that the fire department on the Hunt County side of the trail would be Celeste Fire Department more than likely.
  - Motion to approve made by Mike Henry
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was Terry Williams
  - All council members voted in favor
- H. Consider, discuss and act upon allowing restaurants/businesses to extend seating onto the walkway and street because of the 50% occupancy limit due to Covid-19.
  - Dwain Mathers stated other cities are using parking spaces to extend the dining area outside to help with expanding restaurants capacity, but one of the concerns is selling alcohol in these areas.
  - Alan Lathrom stated there is a prohibition to consume alcoholic beverage in the open in the Central Area District. Businesses on the square have a problem because of the sidewalk area and because of ADA issues. Under the regulations by TABC, the property has to be directly adjacent to the area and the sidewalk prohibits that. The area would have to be sectioned off and it would have to be an extension of the restaurant. He stated the City of McKinney requires the restaurants have to have an agreement with the city to allow them to use the sidewalks since it is in the right-of-way. He explained they would also have to have liability insurance that named the City as an additional insured.
  - Mayor Wiebold asked who would be responsible for the parking spaces in front of the businesses downtown.
  - Alan Lathrom stated it would be TxDOT because McKinney Street is an extension of Business 78.

- Ben White stated that cars would still go up and down the street and the barrier would have to keep any traffic from veering off and hurting people.
- Mayor Wiebold asked if the city could just allow restaurants to go to 75% occupancy.
- Alan Lathrom stated no because of the Governor's Order. The restaurants can already sell alcoholic beverages to go because TABC has allowed that due to Covid.
- Craig Overstreet wanted to know if there was a recommendation from the City Manager, Chamber of Commerce, and even the Main Street Manager concerning the issue.
- Alan Lathrom stated if the restaurant was using a space that is not adjacent to the restaurant they would have the extra expense of obtaining a catering permit.
- Jim Hemby stated the area would have to be leveled out and the barrier would have to be pretty significant to protect patrons.
- Mike Henry asked how many business this would affect.
- Dwain Mathers stated it would affect four and safety was a valid concern.
- Ben White suggested using the back of the restaurants instead of the front.
   He stated the Main Street Manager could look in to it further and bring a recommendation back to Council at another meeting.

  - All council members voted in favor

#### I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

- A. Call to order: The Meeting of the Farmersville 4B meeting was called to order at 6:02 P.M. by Richard Holbrook, President.
- **B.** Roll Call: The Following board members were present: Richard Holbrook, Stephen Caspari, Tonya Mercer, Jesse Nelsen. Melody Hudson and Blake Mounger showed up while the meeting was in process. City staff members Ben White; Daphne Hamlin, and Audrey Rubadue were also present.

#### II. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Miranda Martin stated she would like a budget amendment to move money from Music in the Park 2019 to the Rambler Park swing 2020/2021 budget. She explained she felt like there are plenty of benches in the downtown and park areas. She stated an additional 16 benches is a lot to squeeze in a small area and seems excessive.
- Alison Mathers stated when she was on the Main Street Board she walked around with Billie Goldstein and they found about 11 places for benches but she thinks they would need approval from the business owners first. She stated she believes 20 benches would be too much. She stated any CARES Act money to help downtown businesses would have to be used by December. She stated the city needed a lighted billboard in Princeton to help bring business to Farmersville.
- Jason Acevedo stated he is on Main Street Board and came to the meeting to request \$15,000.00 from the board to purchase 14 new benches and 6 new trash cans for the downtown area.
- Donna Williams stated she was concerned about budget requests that are being asked of 4B. She stated she
  was looking at the budget and it is already over by 10%. She suggested getting back to what 4B is legally able
  to fund.

## III. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

#### A. Consider for approval July 2020 Meeting Minutes

## B. Consider for approval June and July 2020 Financial Statements

- Stephen Caspari requested an explanation of the \$19,000 paid out in June to the Main Street Manager.
- Daphne Hamlin stated the \$19,000.00 was reimbursement for salary, retirement, and other benefits for the first quarter for the Main Street Manager.
- Stephen Caspari stated the billboard cost for the year looked like it was over budget.
- Daphne Hamlin stated monthly payments for the billboards are \$750 for the Reiss Group and \$200 for the Brown Group. Apparently, all the bills from the Reiss Group were going to the Main Street Manager and were just now forwarded to her. That put the payment of an additional \$3,000.00 above the original budget of \$10,000.00.
- Richard Holbrook asked about double payment for fireworks.
- Daphne Hamlin stated the city reimburses the Fire Department. She paid the Fire Department and then
  paid the city. She stated she fixed the payment so it is now correct.
  - o Tonya Mercer made motion,
  - Seconded by Jesse Nelsen,
  - All approved

## C. Consider, discuss, take action on resolution for TexPool Authorized Representative

- Daphne Hamlin said this removes all the past board members from list of signatures and replace with the new members. When the funds get to high in the account at Independent Bank she moves the money to the TexPool account which has a little higher interest rate.
  - Stephen Caspari made motion,
  - Seconded by Jesse Nelsen,
  - All approved

## D. Consider for approval monthly payments July 2020

- Daphne Hamlin stated the payments are pretty basic, but they needed to do an amendment for billboards because they were over budget.
- Tonya Mercer asked how many billboards there are.
- Daphne Hamlin stated there were three total.
  - Jesse Nelsen made motion,
  - Seconded by Tonya Mercer,
  - All Approved
- Richard Holbrook asked about the budget amendment for billboards.
- Daphne Hamlin stated they need to add an additional \$2,300.00 towards billboard payments.
- Motion to amend billboards payment with an additional \$2,300.00.
  - o Stephen Caspari made motion,
  - Seconded by Jesse Nelsen,
  - All approved

## E. Discuss Texas Economic of Council training virtual class

- Stephen Caspari stated the Economic Development Sales Tax workshop cost is \$125 per person and he
  would like to discuss getting this fee reimbursed by the city.
- Ben White stated find out how many spaces are wanted then request reimbursement.

## F. Discuss needing receipts from all civic organizations receiving funds from 4B

- Richard Holbrook stated 4B will now require receipts from all civic organizations that requested money from the board.
- Daphne Hamlin stated she needed receipts to be able to show proof to our auditors.

#### G. Budget Workshop Meeting

- Ben White stated funding of the Main Street Manager is not listed. But it would need to be included in the budget. In the past it was listed to be \$89,364.00 which included personnel salary, supplies, training dues etc. He believes the amount needed to go up by \$3,000.00. Main Street downtown projects have been in a holding pattern due to the public works crew being slammed with different projects through the year and have not moved forward with the gazebo this year. He requested that money be moved over to the next budget year. The FCDC reimburses the city for accounting services with \$1,000.00, and that is in the budget every year. The Mays building taxes comes up every year and will continue to show on the budget. Regarding the Christmas décor, the Mayor has asked that the amount go up from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00 so that lights and decorations are added down Farmersville Parkway. The Rambler Park upgrades are moving forward. The swing sets have been ordered and paid for, but they will still need to be installed.
- Ben White stated the billboard payment is a repeat item on the budget and so was the sound system.
   The sound system funds will go down. He stated a few other items they might see in the budget as well.
- Richard Holbrook asked how the board would know how much money they would be working with.
- Daphne Hamlin stated taxes would be \$275,000.00 for next year.
- Richard Holbrook asked if there was anything we should not be funding.
- Ben White stated 4B has helped fund the sound system, Chamber of Commerce, Sparks of Freedom, the Heritage Museum, Cops and Rodders, the Parks and Recreation's ADA surfacing and Music in the Park. He said they may get involved with the Texas Wildlife Park Program to apply for a grant of \$50,000.00 to extend the Chaparral Trail. He stated they will also ask for street signs for the Main Street Program to help with getting to downtown area.
- Stephen Caspari stated he thinks it would cost approximately \$750,000.00 to resurface the entire length of 8 miles of the trail, if acquired by the city. He suggested it would benefit 4B to contribute more now and work with the existing surfaces instead of waiting and coming back at a later date and it cost us more. He asked if someone could explain what the discretionary spending amount is that 4B is allowed to spend.
- Ben White said his understanding from 4A board is that it is 10% for marketing type activities of the overall budget. He stated he would go over the budget with the attorney and confirm what the money can be spent on.
- Richard Holbrook asked if the Main Street Manager would be brought up to speed.
- Ben White stated the new Main Street Manager, Kevin Casey, starts next week and he will be stepping
  in.
- Daphne Hamlin stated the full amount of money that had been requested was \$314,000.00. She stated
  the board needed to conservatively stay around a \$250,000.00 budget to \$275,000.00.
- Ben White stated they needed to cut \$39,000.00 to stay at the \$275,000.00 budget.
- Richard Holbrook asked if the Farmersville Museum was requesting \$10,000 from 4B.
- Ben White stated yes.
- Daphne Hamlin stated Chamber of Commerce originally requested \$15,000.00 and now is requesting \$20,000.00.
- Donna Williams stated she spoke with the Comptroller's Office in Austin and asked if 4B could fund the Main Street Program. They said 4B could reimburse the city for the Main Street Program. Christmas

- Lights, fireworks and donations are considered discretionary items. She indicated last year there was no public notice released.
- Stephen Caspari said moving forward the board needed to have all the applicants come and request the funds in person.

## H. Presentations and requests for funds for civic organizations

- Randy Smith stated the Amenities Board and Park's Board has split into two separate boards. The
  Amenities Board has no budget and the Senior Center needed funding for a part-time person to operate
  the center. He said that currently they still have no date on when the Civic Center, Library, and Senior
  Center would reopen.
- Stephen Caspari asked if the funds being requested for the fiber optics went up because city can no longer do the work in house.
- Ben White stated the amount requested went up because we are now going to have to use contractors instead of city employees.
- Stephen Caspari asked if there are other bids for the project.
- Ben White stated standard procedure is to receive three quotes. He said currently they only have the one for fiber optics.
- Tony Mercer asked if the Main Street Program was using \$10,000.00 this year and requesting an additional \$15,000.00 for next year's budget for more benches and trash cans.
- Ben White stated yes.
- Jason Acevedo stated \$4,500.00 towards benches and the remaining \$10,000.00 would go to refinishing the 13 trash cans downtown. He said that money came from the Main Street 20 year Celebration that was cancelled due to Covid. The money being requested for the next budget year is an additional \$15,000.00 for new trash cans and 14 new benches.
- Tonya Mercer asked if there is a map where the benches and trash will be placed.
- Alison Mathers stated they needed to receive permission from the building owners first.
- Stephen Caspari asked about ADA compliance with adding new benches.
- Jason Acevedo stated the purpose of requesting the money now is to have it in the budget for next year.
- Richard Holbrook asked if it would be possible to have the city attorney come to the meeting.
- Ben White stated yes we can have the attorney come, but there will be a cost associated with that.
- Lisa Eastman stated the Chamber of Commerce has lost about 22 members and would more than likely loose six more. The Chamber has not been able to have events like they did in the past and not sure financially if they can make it past March. She said the Chamber is a 501c6 and are unable to apply for grants under the Cares Act. We are trying to build events back up. She said they are moving forward with our banquet, but we are unable to have as many people attend due to Covid.
- Donna Williams stated as a business owner she thinks the Chamber Of Commerce should be supported more from 4B in the future. She stated that through Covid they called, supported us, posted on Facebook.
- Richard Holbrook clarified the next 4B meeting would be set for 8/18/20 at 6:00 pm with the attorney present and the public hearing would be moved to 8/25/20 at 6:00pm.

#### I. City Manager Report

Ben White stated they have updated the software for sound system and they are currently in the
process of buying one more speaker system. He stated they will be discussing the Land Use Map,
Thoroughfare Map and the Bike/Trail Map at the next City Council meeting. He stated these three
components are really critical for future city planning.

# CITY OF FARMERSVILLE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION MINUTES REGULAR SESSION MEETING July 20, 2020, 6:30 P.M.

#### I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

- Chairman Michael Hesse presided over the meeting which was called to order at 6:31 p.m. Commissioners Lance Hudson, Leaca Caspari, John Klostermann, Joe Helmberger, Rachel Crist (via teleconference), and Adam White were in attendance. Also, in attendance were staff liaison, Sandra Green; City Manager, Ben White; City Attorney, Alan Lathrom; and Council liaison, Mike Henry
- Mike Henry led the prayer and the pledges to the United States and Texas flags.

## II. REORGANIZATION OF COMMISSION

- A. Election of Chairman
  - John Klosterman nominated and made a motion to accept Joe Helmberger as Chairman.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve made by Leaca Caspari
  - All members voted in favor
- B. Election of Vice-Chairman
  - Leaca Caspari nominated and made a motion to accept Michael Hesse as the Vice-Chairman
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve made by John Klostermann
  - All members voted in favor, except Lance Hudson voted no.
- C. Election of Secretary
  - Michael Hesse nominated and made a motion to accept Lance Hudson as the Secretary.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve was Leaca Caspari
  - All members voted in favor.

## III. PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS (FOR NON-PUBLIC HEARING AGENDA ITEMS)

No one came forward in person or on teleconference to speak.

#### IV. PUBLIC HEARING

- A. Public hearing to consider, discuss and act upon a recommendation to the City Council regarding an amendment to the Farmersville Comprehensive Plan dated January, 2013, by amending the Conceptual Land Use Plan Map contained therein by changing the land use on approximately thirty-two (32) acres of land from Estate Residential to Industrial. The property is comprised of two tracts of land located along the north side of U.S. Highway 380 (Audie Murphy Parkway) extending in a westerly direction from County Road 699 a distance of approximately 2,100 linear feet more or less.
  - Chairman Helmberger opened the public hearing at 6:38 p.m. and asked if anyone wanted to speak for or against the item.
  - No one came forward so he closed the public hearing at 6:39 p.m.
  - Leaca Caspari asked what the options were of the Planning & Zoning Commission. She said that Reliable Concrete has been operating in that area for several months already, and the Comprehensive Plan update is forth coming so she wondered if it would be wise to wait and look at this item at that point. She also wanted to know what would happen if the city chose to not approve this request.
  - Michael Hesse asked what the motivation for the change right now was.
  - Ben White stated we went into this process because both have been annexed into the city. There is one batch place currently in operation and then one will be used as batch plant in the future. There is a thoroughfare map on the website and it will be coming to P&Z in the future for recommendation to City Council.
  - Joe Helmberger asked what the current zoning of the property was.
  - Sandra Green stated it was never zoned when they were annexed into the city so it would be AG – Agricultural.
  - Leaca Caspari stated it does not appear that the Commission has very many options due to the business already being there. She asked why this process was not considered before they were annexed.
  - Ben White stated zoning cannot be discussed as part of the annexation.
  - Mike Henry stated the property was all in the county originally. After they
    started their construction the city annexed the property and it became a
    problem because our Comprehensive Plan showed it as Estate Development.
    He said the first part of the plant was issued a certificate of occupancy by the
    county, but the second phase is just sitting there and cannot be completed
    until the zoning is changed.
  - Alan Lathrom stated that under Chapter 43 of the Local Government Code it states that if the property was already being used before it was annexed into the city the governing body cannot prohibit that use. There was a development agreement with the original owner of the dirt that spelled out the

property would be annexed into the city limits and that tax revenues would come to the city. When the property was annexed in it was brought in but not zoned, so it was agricultural when it came in. He said he could not remember why the Future Land Use Map called out that area adjacent to U.S. Highway 380 as being Estate Residential.

- Joe Helmberger stated at the time Estate Residential was all that was left and that was the decision that was made back in 2013.
- Alan Lathrom said the city cannot issue a certificate of occupancy on the second phase of construction because they are not zoned for industrial. This process is trying to bring the land use in conformance with what is currently out there and operating. It is to make everything match up in that area.
  - Motion to approve the Comprehensive Plan change from Estate Residential to Industrial made by Lance Hudson
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve made by Michael Hesse
- John Klostermann asked if anything was going to happen within the remaining area that shows Estate Residential.
- Joe Helmberger stated it would probably be changed in the future because the Outer Loop is going to go through that area.
- Alan Lathrom stated that when we update the Future Land Use Plan and it comes before the Commission and City Council later those areas could be addressed.
  - All members voted in favor.

## CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE #2020-0922-001

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP OF THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. 0-2018-0508-001, AS AMENDED, BY CHANGING THE ZONING ON APPROXIMATELY 5.050 ACRES OF LAND IN THE W. B. WILLIAMS SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 954, MORE COMMONLY KNOWN AS 91 COUNTY ROAD 699, IN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, FROM A – AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT USES TO HII – HIGH IMPACT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT USES; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; PROVIDING ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville, Texas, (the "City") is a Type A General – Law Municipality located in Collin County created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Texas Local Government Code, and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville, Texas, has recommended a change in zoning classification of the property described herein and has recommended amending the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, regarding the rezoning of the property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this case coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, and upon due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, has determined that in the public's best interest and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City, the zoning of the property described herein shall be changed and that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, should be amended to reflect the rezoning of the property herein described;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

#### **SECTION 1. FINDINGS INCORPORATED**

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

## **SECTION 2. PROPERTY REZONED**

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the property described herein shall be rezoned as set forth in this section, and the Official Zoning Map of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. O-2018-0508-001, as amended, of the City of Farmersville, Texas, is hereby amended and changed in the following particulars to reflect the action taken herein, and all other existing sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, definitions, phrases, and words of the City's Zoning Ordinance are not amended but shall remain intact and are hereby ratified, verified, and affirmed, in order to create a change in the zoning classification of the property described herein, as follows:

That certain tract of land containing approximately 5.050 acres of land in the W. B. Williams Survey, Abstract No. 954, more commonly known as 91 County Road 699, and more fully described and depicted on the "Zoning Exhibit" attached hereto as Exhibits "A" and "B," respectively, and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes allowed by law (the "Property"), presently zoned A – Agricultural District Uses, is hereby rezoned to HII – High Impact Industrial District uses.

#### SECTION 3. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO BE MODIFIED

It is directed that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville be changed to reflect the zoning classification established by this Ordinance.

## **SECTION 4: REPEALER**

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. Any and all Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, which are in any manner in conflict with or inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and/or inconsistency.

#### **SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY**

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that the several provisions of this Ordinance are severable. In the event that any court of competent jurisdiction shall judge any provisions of this Ordinance to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, such judgment shall not affect any other provisions of this Ordinance which are not specifically designated as being illegal, invalid, or unenforceable.

#### **SECTION 6: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION**

Any person, firm, corporation or business entity violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined any sum not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). Each continuing day's violation under

this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense. The penal provisions imposed under this Ordinance shall not preclude the City of Farmersville from filing suit to enjoin the violation. The City of Farmersville retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state and federal law.

#### **SECTION 7: INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

#### **SECTION 8: PUBLICATION**

The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official Newspaper of the City of Farmersville the Caption, Penalty, and Effective Date Clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Local Government Code.

#### **SECTION 9: ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT**

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date Clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville, and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

#### **SECTION 10: SAVINGS**

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

#### **SECTION 11:** EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

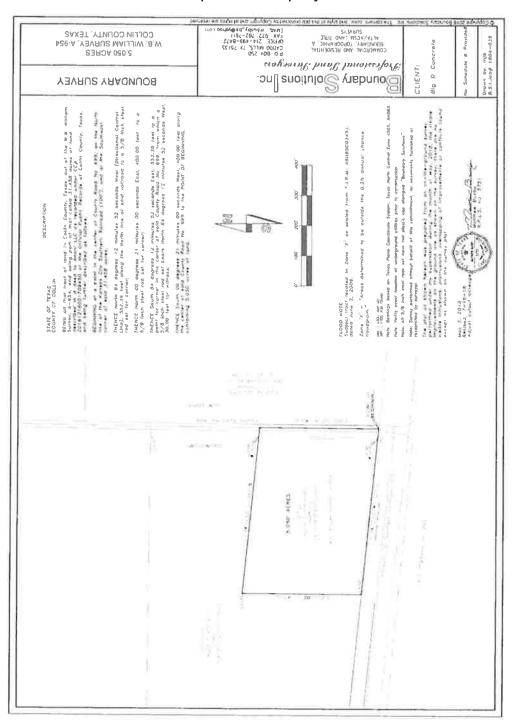

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP OF THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. O-2018-0508-001, AS AMENDED, BY CHANGING THE ZONING ON APPROXIMATELY 26.60 ACRES OF LAND IN THE W. B. WILLIAMS SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 954, MORE COMMONLY KNOWN AS 123 COUNTY ROAD 699, IN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, FROM A – AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT USES TO HII – HIGH IMPACT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT USES; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; PROVIDING **FOR PUBLICATION: PROVIDING ENGROSSMENT** AND ENROLLMENT; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN **EFFECTIVE DATE.** 

**WHEREAS**, the City of Farmersville, Texas, (the "City") is a Type A General – Law Municipality located in Collin County created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Texas Local Government Code, and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville, Texas, has recommended a change in zoning classification of the property described herein and has recommended amending the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, regarding the rezoning of the property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this case coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, and upon due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, has determined that in the public's best interest and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City, the zoning of the property described herein shall be changed and that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, should be amended to reflect the rezoning of the property herein described;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

Williams Survey, Abstract No. 954, more commonly known as 123 County Road 699, and more fully described and depicted on the "Zoning Exhibit" attached hereto as Exhibits "A" and "B," respectively, and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes allowed by law (the "Property"), presently zoned A – Agricultural District Uses, is hereby rezoned to HII – High Impact Industrial District uses.

## **SECTION 3. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO BE MODIFIED**

It is directed that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville be changed to reflect the zoning classification established by this Ordinance.

## **SECTION 4: REPEALER**

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. Any and all Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, which are in any manner in conflict with or inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and/or inconsistency.

## **SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY**

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that the several provisions of this Ordinance are severable. 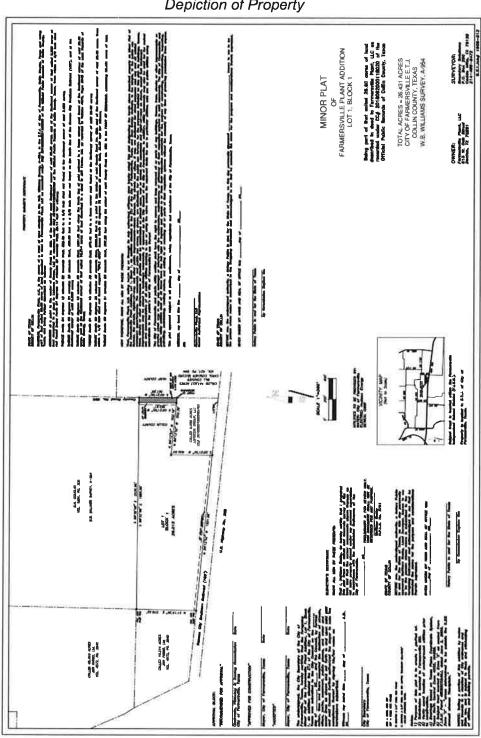
