

CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE #2022-0524-001

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE. THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP AMENDING COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. 2018-0508-001, AS AMENDED, BY CHANGING THE ZONING ON APPROXIMATELY 53.274 ACRES OF LAND GENERALLY SITUATED AT 703 MERIT STREET. IN THE W.B WILLIAMS SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 952, IN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, FROM A - AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT USES TO PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (PD-2022-0524-___ -SF-3) WITH A BASE ZONING DESIGNATION OF SF-3 SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLING-3 DISTRICT USES SUBJECT TO THE CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS STATED HEREIN AND EXHIBITS **ORDINANCES**; ATTACHED HERETO: REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION: PROVIDING ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT: PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City has recommended denial of a change in zoning classification of the property described herein and has recommended against amending the official zoning map of the City regarding the rezoning of the property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this case coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City Council"); and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation that the requested zoning change be denied triggers a three/fourths super-majority vote of the City Council to approve the requested zoning change under Farmersville Code § 77-21(d)(4); and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, and upon due deliberation and consideration of the negative recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, has determined that in the public's best interest and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City, the zoning of the property described herein shall be changed and that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, should be amended to reflect the rezoning of the property herein described.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS INCORPORATED

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. PROPERTY REZONED

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the City Council does hereby rezone the property described herein as set forth in this section, and the Official Zoning Map of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 2018-0508-001, as amended, of the City of Farmersville, Texas, is hereby amended and changed in the following particulars to reflect the action taken herein, and all other existing sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, definitions, phrases, and words of the City's Zoning Ordinance are not amended but shall remain intact and are hereby ratified, verified, and affirmed, in order to create a change in the zoning classification of the property described herein, as follows:

That certain tract of land containing approximately 53.274 acres of land generally situated at 703 Merit Street, in the W.B Williams Survey, Abstract No. 952, in the City of Farmersville, Collin County, Texas, and more fully described on the "Zoning Exhibit" attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes allowed by law (the "Property"), presently zoned A — Agricultural District uses is hereby rezoned to PD-Planned Development District (PD-2022-0524-___-SF-3) with a base zoning designation of SF-3 - Single-Family Dwelling-3 District Uses and as stated herein and in the exhibits attached hereto.

SECTION 4. CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO REZONING

The change in the zoning classification established and described in Section 3 herein shall be and is hereby made subject to the following conditions and requirements without which the requested zoning change would not have been approved:

- A. The Property is hereby limited to not more than two hundred nineteen (219) residential units.
- B. If the gross acreage of the Property is reduced below its current gross area of approximately 53.274 acres of land, the number of residential units allowed shall be reduced proportionately so that the Property contains no more than 4.1 residential units per gross acre.
- C. The minimum front yard setback is hereby reduced from twenty-five feet (25') to twenty feet (20').

- D. The maximum lot coverage for Single-Family (Detached) lots is hereby increased from fifty percent (50%) to sixty percent (60%).
- E. The ordinances, rules, regulations, and standards applicable to the base zoning classification of SF-3 Single-Family Dwelling-3 as contained in the Farmersville Code specifically including, but not limited to, Chapter 77, "Zoning," of the Farmersville Code shall apply to all other development aspects of the tract of land identified on the attached map.
- F. The requirement for submission of a Concept Plan is hereby waived by the City Council because sufficient information exists to evaluate the proposed Planned Development district for this single-family project.

In the event of any conflict between any exhibit attached hereto and this Ordinance, the language and contents of this Ordinance shall control.

SECTION 5. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO BE MODIFIED

It is directed that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville be changed to reflect the zoning classification established by this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. REPEALER

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. Any and all Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, which are in any manner in conflict with or inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and/or inconsistency.

SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared to be illegal, invalid, unenforceable, or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance, since same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such illegal, invalid, unenforceable, or unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section, and said remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

Any person, firm, corporation, or business entity violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for each offense; and each and every day such violation shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense. The penal provisions imposed under this Ordinance shall not preclude the City of Farmersville from filing suit to enjoin the violation. The City of Farmersville retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state and federal law.

SECTION 9. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 10. PUBLICATION

The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official Newspaper of the City of Farmersville the Caption, Penalty, and Effective Date Clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 11. ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date Clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville, and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 12. SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.



CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE #O-2022-0524-002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, ANNEXING UPON THE PETITION OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS CERTAIN ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY, AS HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED, CONTAINING APPROXIMATELY 8.153 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS; FINDING THAT ALL NECESSARY AND REQUIRED LEGAL CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN SATISFIED; PROVIDING THAT SUCH AREA SHALL BECOME A PART OF THE CITY AND THAT THE OWNERS AND INHABITANTS THEREOF SHALL BE ENTITLED TO THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF OTHER CITIZENS AND BE BOUND BY THE ACTS AND ORDINANCES OF THE CITY NOW IN EFFECT AND TO BE HEREAFTER ADOPTED; ADOPTING A SERVICE PLAN; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR AMENDING AND CORRECTING THE OFFICIAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY AS HERETOFORE ADOPTED; PROVIDING THAT THE CITY MANAGER UNDERTAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS RELATIVE TO SAID ANNEXATION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR SAID ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville, Texas has received a petition seeking annexation of a certain tract of land (identified below) that has been duly signed and acknowledged by each owner of the land proposed to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, the City accepted the Petition pursuant to Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code and has instituted annexation proceedings to annex the territory covered by such petition for annexation; and

WHEREAS, the City published notice of the required public hearing on said annexation in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and in the territory proposed to be annexed not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the day of such public hearing and held the public hearing in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was conducted and held in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, all required statutory notices pursuant to the Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code have been accomplished; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code, an agreement regarding the provision of services to the land, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein for all purposes, was negotiated with the owners of the subject land detailing the services that will be provided by the City; and

WHEREAS, the tract of land proposed to be annexed is adjacent to and adjoins or abuts properties within the City of Farmersville, Texas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1: All of the above premises are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2: The following described land shall be and is hereby annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Farmersville, Collin County, Texas:

An approximately 8.153-acre tract of land located on the northeast quadrant of U.S. Highway 380 and County Road 653, Collin County, Texas, and being situated in the William Hemphill Survey, Abstract No. A 0448, Sheet 3 Tract 20, Collin County, Texas, and as further described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes allowed by law.

SECTION 3: The municipal services for the herein annexed land will be provided in accordance with the Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code, that is hereby approved as part of this Ordinance, and is made a part hereof.

SECTION 4: The land described in Exhibit "A" shall bear its pro rata share of the taxes levied by the City, and the inhabitants of the land herein annexed shall be entitled to all of the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of other citizens of the City and are hereby bound by all acts, ordinances and all other legal action of the City now in full force and effect and all those which may be hereafter adopted.

SECTION 5: The official map and boundaries of the City heretofore adopted and amended shall be and are hereby amended so as to include the land described in Exhibit "A" as part of the City.

SECTION 6: The City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to perform or cause to be performed all acts necessary to effectuate this Ordinance including, but not limited to, making any corrections to the official map of the City to add the land hereby annexed as required by law.

SECTION 7: The City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to file or cause to be filed a certified copy of this Ordinance with the necessary governmental agencies, including the United States Department of Justice.

SECTION 8: If any section, subsection, sentence, phrase, or word be found to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, or if any portion of said properties is incapable of being annexed by the City of Farmersville, Texas, for any reason whatsoever, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, sentence, phrase, word, paragraph or

provision of this Ordinance or the application of any other section, sentence, phrase, word, paragraph or provision to any other person or portion of said properties, situation or circumstance, nor shall the adjudication affect any other section, sentence, phrase, word, paragraph or provision of any other ordinance of the City of Farmersville, Texas. The City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of this Ordinance and would have annexed the valid properties without the invalid part and invalid properties and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, as provided by the laws of the State of Texas.

ANNEXATION SERVICE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AND THOMAS DODGE COMPANY

This Annexation Service Agreement ("Service Agreement") is made and entered into pursuant to Texas Local Government Code § 43.0672 as of this ____ day of _____, 2022, by and between the CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, ("City") and THOMAS DODGE COMPANY, a Texas corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Owner") on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. The City and Owner may hereafter be referred to collectively as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party" from time to time.

WHEREAS, Owner has submitted a petition for the annexation of the 8.153 acre tract of land, described in Exhibit "A", (the "Annexed Area") that has been accepted by City; and

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code § 43.0672 now requires the Owner of land that petitions for annexation into a city and the City to enter into an agreement that details the manner in which municipal services will be provided to such land upon its annexation:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and premises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the City and Owner agree as follows:

- 1. **Findings Incorporated.** All of the above premises are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Service Agreement as if copied in their entirety.
- 2. <u>Agreed Service Plan for Providing Municipal Services</u>. Municipal services will be provided to the Annexed Area, by the City in accordance with the following provisions and Texas Local Government Code § 43.065.

A. Police Protection.

- 1. Police personnel and equipment from the Farmersville Police Department will be provided to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance.
- 2. Police protection services will be provided at a level of services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of

services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever is applicable.

B. Fire Protection.

- 1. Fire protection and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) from the Farmersville Volunteer Fire Department will be provided to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance.
- 2. Fire protection services will be provided at a level of services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever is applicable.

C. Fire Prevention.

The services of the Collin County Fire Marshal, pursuant to a contract with the City, will be provided to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance.

Solid Waste Collection.

- 1. Solid waste collection will be provided to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. However, for the first two years following annexation, a person in the area who used the services of a privately-owned solid waste management service provider prior to the effective date of the annexation may continue to utilize the services of privately-owned solid waste providers in accordance with Texas Local Government Code § 43.0661 rather than immediately converting to the City's provider.
- 2. Solid waste collection services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.
- 3. The collection of refuse from individual properties will be made in accordance with the usual Sanitation Department scheduling.

E. Water Service.

1. For portions of the Annexed Area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), the City will provide water services to this

Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to any other area of the municipality. For portions of the Annexed Area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), water services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

- 2. When new development occurs, the City of Farmersville requires a developer to construct the necessary infrastructure to meet the needs of the development. This requirement may also include the construction of off-site improvements.
- 3. The responsibility for construction of the infrastructure by a developer is described in the City's Subdivision Regulations.
- 4. For portions of the annexed area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), the City will allow the provision of extensions of water facilities to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance. Such extensions shall be in accordance with the Farmersville Code and the City's Design Standards, and as amended.
- 5. Connection to existing city water mains for water service will be provided in accordance with existing City Policies. Upon connection to existing mains, water will be provided at rates established by City Ordinance.
- 6. Water mains installed or improved to City standards within the Annexed Area which are part of the City of Farmersville water system and are located within dedicated easements, rights-of-way, or any other acceptable location approved by the City Engineer, will be maintained by the City upon the effective date of this ordinance.
- 7. Maintenance of private lines shall continue to be the responsibility of the owner or occupant of property situated within the Annexed Area.
- 8. Where other water districts provide water service, any development that occurs will still meet the City of Farmersville standards for the sizing and construction of utilities.
- 9. For portions of the Annexed Area which are not solely within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), water services shall continue to be provided in the same manner that is described in an approved Judgment, Agreement, Decree or other legal document as of the effective date of this ordinance and as it may thereafter be adopted or amended.

F. Sanitary Sewer Service.

- 1. The City will provide sewer services to the Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to any other area of the municipality. Upon annexation, sanitary sewer services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.
- 2. When new development occurs, the City of Farmersville requires a developer to construct the necessary infrastructure to meet the needs of the development. This requirement may also include the construction of off-site improvements.
- 3. The responsibility for construction of the infrastructure by a developer is described in the City's Subdivision Regulations.
- 4. The City will allow the provision of extensions of sanitary sewer facilities to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. Such extensions shall be in accordance with the Farmersville Code and the City's Design Standards, and as amended.
- 5. Connection to existing city sanitary sewer mains for sewage service will be provided in accordance with existing City Policies. Upon connection to existing mains, sanitary sewer collection will be provided at rates established by City Ordinances.
- 6. Sanitary sewer mains and lift stations installed or improved to City Standards within the Annexed Area which are located within dedicated easements, rights-of-way, or any other acceptable location approved by the City Engineer, will be maintained by the City of Farmersville upon the effective date of this ordinance.

G. Streets.

- 1. Emergency street maintenance will be provided for publicly dedicated streets or roads within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. Routine maintenance will be scheduled as part of the City's annual street maintenance program in accordance with the then current policies and procedures defined by ordinance.
- 2. Street services will be provided at a level of services at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and

population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

H. Parks and Recreation.

- 1. The City of Farmersville will provide parks and recreation services to the Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to any other area of the municipality. For new development, the City requires developers to construct hike/bike trails in keeping with the Parks Master Plan. Additionally, new developments must still satisfy the parkland dedication requirements that call for the dedication of land or the payment of fees in lieu of land for park uses.
- 2. Residents within the Annexed Area may utilize all existing park and recreation facilities upon the effective date of this Ordinance. Fees for such usage shall be in accordance with current fees established by ordinance.
- 3. Additional park and recreation facilities will be constructed based on Park policies defined in the City's Comprehensive Plan, as amended, and the Farmersville Code. The general planned locations and classifications of parks will ultimately serve residents from the current city limits and residents from areas being considered for annexation.

I. Environmental Health and Code Enforcement Services.

- 1. Enforcement of current environmental health ordinances and regulations, including but not limited to, weed and brush ordinances, junked and abandoned vehicles ordinances and animal control ordinances, will begin within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this annexation ordinance.
- 2. Inspection services, including but not limited to, the review of building plans, the issuance of permits and the inspection of all buildings, plumbing, mechanical, and electrical work to ensure compliance with City Codes and Ordinances will be provided within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance.
- 3. The City will provide the level of Environmental Health and Code Enforcement Services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

J. Planning and Zoning.

The Annexed Area shall be zoned in conjunction with the annexation pursuant to the City's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance (Chapter 77 of the Farmersville Code, as amended). The Future Land Use Plan and Future Land Use Plan Modules Diagram contained within the Comprehensive Plan, as amended, will serve as a guide for consideration of future (re)zoning requests.

K. Miscellaneous.

Any city owned facility, building, or service located within the Annexed Area will be operated and maintained by the City upon the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

L. Capital Improvements Program.

The Annexed Area is eligible for Capital Improvement Program consideration upon the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

M. Other Municipal Services.

Other municipal services not specifically listed in Sections A-L shall be provided to the Annexed Area no later than two and one-half years after the effective date of the annexation, unless certain services cannot reasonably be provided within two and one-half years. In that case, the City shall propose a schedule for providing certain services, and the schedule shall provide for the provision of full municipal services no later than four and one-half years after the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

- 3. <u>Term and Renewal</u>. This Service Agreement is valid for ten years. Renewal of the Service Agreement is at the discretion of the City of Farmersville.
- 4. <u>Level of Services</u>. This Service Agreement does not require a uniform level of full municipal services to each area of the City, including the Annexed Area, if different characteristics of topography, land use, and population density are considered a sufficient basis for providing different levels of service.
- 5. <u>Amendments</u>. This Service Agreement shall not be amended unless public hearings are held in accordance with Texas Local Government Code, § 43.052.
- 6. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Service Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters contained herein and may not be modified or terminated except upon the mutual written agreement of the parties hereto save and except for the termination rights set forth herein.

- 7. <u>Venue</u>. This Service Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and shall be performable in Collin County, Texas. Exclusive venue shall be in Collin County, Texas.
- 8. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Service Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns.
- 9. <u>Savings/Severability</u>. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Service Agreement shall for any reason be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this Service Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
- 10. <u>Construction</u>. This Service Agreement shall be construed fairly and simply, and not strictly for or against any party. Headings used throughout this Service Agreement are for convenience and reference only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be interpreted or held to explain, restrict, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation or construction of the meaning of the provisions of this Service Agreement.
- 11. <u>Multiple Counterparts</u>. This Service Agreement may be separately executed in individual counterparts and, upon execution, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP OF THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. O-2018-0508-001, AS AMENDED, SO THAT AN APPROXIMATELY 8.153 ACRES OF LAND LOCATED ON THE NORTHEAST QUADRANT OF U.S. HIGHWAY 380 AND COUNTY ROAD 653, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, AND BEING SITUATED IN THE WILLIAM HEMPHILL SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. A 0448, SHEET 3 TRACT 20, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, IN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, IS ZONED TO LI - LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT USES; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: **PROVIDING** FOR **PUBLICATION: PROVIDING ENGROSSMENT** ENROLLMENT; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville, Texas, (the "Planning and Zoning Commission") has recommended a change in zoning classification of the property described herein and has recommended amending the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, regarding the rezoning of the property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this case coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville (the "City Council"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council after public notice and public hearing as required by law and upon due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, has determined that in the public's best interest and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City, the zoning of the property described herein shall be established and that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, should be amended to reflect the zoning of the property herein described;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS INCORPORATED

The above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. PROPERTY ZONED

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the property described herein shall be zoned as set forth in this section, and the Official Zoning Map of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. O-2018-0508-001, as amended, of the City of Farmersville, Texas, is hereby amended and changed in the following particulars to reflect the action taken herein, and all other existing sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, definitions, phrases, and words of the City's Zoning Ordinance are not amended but shall remain intact and are hereby ratified, verified, and affirmed, in order to create a change in the zoning classification of the property described herein, as follows:

That certain tract of land containing approximately 8.153 acres of land located on the northeast quadrant of U.S. Highway 380 and County Road 653, Collin County, Texas, and being situated in the William Hemphill Survey, Abstract No. A 0448, Sheet 3 Tract 20, Collin County, Texas, and more fully described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes allowed by law (the "Property") is hereby zoned to LI – Light Industrial District Uses in accordance with the specific requirements contained in the City's Master Plan and Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION 3. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO BE MODIFIED

It is directed that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville be changed according to its legend to reflect the zoning classification established by this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: REPEALER

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. Any and all Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, which are in any manner in conflict with or inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and/or inconsistency.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that the several provisions of this Ordinance are severable. In the event that any court of competent jurisdiction shall judge any provisions of this Ordinance to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, such judgment shall not affect any other provisions of this Ordinance which are not specifically designated as being illegal, invalid, or unenforceable.

SECTION 6: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

Any person, firm, corporation, or business entity violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined any sum not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). Each continuing day's violation under this

Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense. The penal provisions imposed under this Ordinance shall not preclude the City of Farmersville from filing suit to enjoin the violation. The City of Farmersville retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state, and federal law.

SECTION 7: INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 8: PUBLICATION

The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official Newspaper of the City of Farmersville the Caption, Penalty, and Effective Date Clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 9: ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date Clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville, and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 10: SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 11: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, ANNEXING UPON THE PETITION OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS CERTAIN ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY, AS HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED, CONTAINING APPROXIMATELY 26.0183 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS: FINDING THAT ALL NECESSARY AND REQUIRED LEGAL CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN SATISFIED; PROVIDING THAT SUCH AREA SHALL BECOME A PART OF THE CITY AND THAT THE OWNERS AND INHABITANTS THEREOF SHALL BE ENTITLED TO THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF OTHER CITIZENS AND BE BOUND BY THE ACTS AND ORDINANCES OF THE CITY NOW IN EFFECT AND TO BE HEREAFTER ADOPTED; ADOPTING A SERVICE PLAN; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR AMENDING AND CORRECTING THE OFFICIAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY HERETOFORE ADOPTED: PROVIDING THAT THE CITY MANAGER UNDERTAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS RELATIVE TO SAID ANNEXATION: PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR SAID ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

WHEREAS, the public hearing was conducted and held in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, all required statutory notices pursuant to the Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code have been accomplished; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code, an agreement regarding the provision of services to the land, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein for all purposes, was negotiated with the owners of the subject land detailing the services that will be provided by the City; and

WHEREAS, the tract of land proposed to be annexed is adjacent to and adjoins or abuts properties within the City of Farmersville, Texas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1: All of the above premises are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2: The following described land shall be and is hereby annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Farmersville, Collin County, Texas:

An approximately 26.0183-acre tract of land located in an area west of State Highway 78 and north of County Road 550, Collin County, Texas, and situated within the Elijah B. Reed Survey, Abstract No. 739, Collin County, Texas, and as further described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes allowed by law.

SECTION 3: The municipal services for the herein annexed land will be provided in accordance with the Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes in accordance with Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code, that is hereby approved as part of this Ordinance, and is made a part hereof.

SECTION 4: The land described in Exhibit "A" shall bear its pro rata share of the taxes levied by the City, and the inhabitants of the land herein annexed shall be entitled to all of the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of other citizens of the City and are hereby bound by all acts, ordinances and all other legal action of the City now in full force and effect and all those which may be hereafter adopted.

SECTION 5: The official map and boundaries of the City heretofore adopted and amended shall be and are hereby amended so as to include the land described in Exhibit "A" as part of the City.

SECTION 6: The City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to perform or cause to be performed all acts necessary to effectuate this Ordinance including, but not limited to, making any corrections to the official map of the City to add the land hereby annexed as required by law.

SECTION 7: The City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to file or cause to be filed a certified copy of this Ordinance with the necessary governmental agencies, including the United States Department of Justice.

SECTION 8: If any section, subsection, sentence, phrase, or word be found to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, or if any portion of said properties is incapable of being annexed by the City of Farmersville, Texas, for any reason whatsoever, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, sentence, phrase, word, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance or the application of any other section, sentence, phrase,

word, paragraph or provision to any other person or portion of said properties, situation or circumstance, nor shall the adjudication affect any other section, sentence, phrase, word, paragraph or provision of any other ordinance of the City of Farmersville, Texas. The City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of this Ordinance and would have annexed the valid properties without the invalid part and invalid properties and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, as provided by the laws of the State of Texas.

ANNEXATION SERVICE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AND PCRE, LLC

This Annexation Service Agreement ("Service Agreement") is made and entered into pursuant to Texas Local Government Code § 43.0672 as of this ____ day of _____, 2022, by and between the CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, ("City") and PCRE, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, (hereinafter referred to as "Owner") on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. The City and Owner may hereafter be referred to collectively as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party" from time to time.

WHEREAS, Owner has submitted a petition for the annexation of the 26.0183-acre tract of land, described in Exhibit "A", (the "Annexed Area") that has been accepted by City; and

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code § 43.0672 now requires the Owner of land that petitions for annexation into a city and the City to enter into an agreement that details the manner in which municipal services will be provided to such land upon its annexation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and premises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the City and Owner agree as follows:

- 1. **Findings Incorporated.** All of the above premises are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Service Agreement as if copied in their entirety.
- 2. <u>Agreed Service Plan for Providing Municipal Services</u>. Municipal services will be provided to the Annexed Area, by the City in accordance with the following provisions and Texas Local Government Code § 43.065.

A. Police Protection.

- 1. Police personnel and equipment from the Farmersville Police Department will be provided to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance.
- 2. Police protection services will be provided at a level of services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and

population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever is applicable.

B. Fire Protection.

- 1. Fire protection and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) from the Farmersville Volunteer Fire Department will be provided to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance.
- 2. Fire protection services will be provided at a level of services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever is applicable.

C. Fire Prevention.

The services of the Collin County Fire Marshal, pursuant to a contract with the City, will be provided to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance.

D. Solid Waste Collection.

- 1. Solid waste collection will be provided to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. However, for the first two years following annexation, a person in the area who used the services of a privately-owned solid waste management service provider prior to the effective date of the annexation may continue to utilize the services of privately-owned solid waste providers in accordance with Texas Local Government Code § 43.0661 rather than immediately converting to the City's provider.
- 2. Solid waste collection services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.
- 3. The collection of refuse from individual properties will be made in accordance with the usual Sanitation Department scheduling.

E. Water Service.

1. For portions of the Annexed Area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), the City will provide water services to this Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to

any other area of the municipality. For portions of the Annexed Area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), water services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

- 2. When new development occurs, the City of Farmersville requires a developer to construct the necessary infrastructure to meet the needs of the development. This requirement may also include the construction of off-site improvements.
- 3. The responsibility for construction of the infrastructure by a developer is described in the City's Subdivision Regulations.
- 4. For portions of the annexed area within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), the City will allow the provision of extensions of water facilities to the Annexed Area on the effective date of this ordinance. Such extensions shall be in accordance with the Farmersville Code and the City's Design Standards, and as amended.
- 5. Connection to existing city water mains for water service will be provided in accordance with existing City Policies. Upon connection to existing mains, water will be provided at rates established by City Ordinance.
- 6. Water mains installed or improved to City standards within the Annexed Area which are part of the City of Farmersville water system and are located within dedicated easements, rights-of-way, or any other acceptable location approved by the City Engineer, will be maintained by the City upon the effective date of this ordinance.
- 7. Maintenance of private lines shall continue to be the responsibility of the owner or occupant of property situated within the Annexed Area.
- 8. Where other water districts provide water service, any development that occurs will still meet the City of Farmersville standards for the sizing and construction of utilities.
- 9. For portions of the Annexed Area which are not solely within the City's legally certificated area (CCN), water services shall continue to be provided in the same manner that is described in an approved Judgment, Agreement, Decree or other legal document as of the effective date of this ordinance and as it may thereafter be adopted or amended.

F. Sanitary Sewer Service.

- 1. The City will provide sewer services to the Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to any other area of the municipality. Upon annexation, sanitary sewer services will be provided at a level of service at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.
- 2. When new development occurs, the City of Farmersville requires a developer to construct the necessary infrastructure to meet the needs of the development. This requirement may also include the construction of off-site improvements.
- 3. The responsibility for construction of the infrastructure by a developer is described in the City's Subdivision Regulations.
- 4. The City will allow the provision of extensions of sanitary sewer facilities to the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. Such extensions shall be in accordance with the Farmersville Code and the City's Design Standards, and as amended.
- 5. Connection to existing city sanitary sewer mains for sewage service will be provided in accordance with existing City Policies. Upon connection to existing mains, sanitary sewer collection will be provided at rates established by City Ordinances.
- 6. Sanitary sewer mains and lift stations installed or improved to City Standards within the Annexed Area which are located within dedicated easements, rights-of-way, or any other acceptable location approved by the City Engineer, will be maintained by the City of Farmersville upon the effective date of this ordinance.

G. Streets.

- 1. Emergency street maintenance will be provided for publicly dedicated streets or roads within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance. Routine maintenance will be scheduled as part of the City's annual street maintenance program in accordance with the then current policies and procedures defined by ordinance.
- 2. Street services will be provided at a level of services at least equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and

population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

H. Parks and Recreation.

- 1. The City of Farmersville will provide parks and recreation services to the Annexed Area by any of the methods by which it extends the services to any other area of the municipality. For new development, the City requires developers to construct hike/bike trails in keeping with the Parks Master Plan. Additionally, new developments must still satisfy the parkland dedication requirements that call for the dedication of land or the payment of fees in lieu of land for park uses.
- 2. Residents within the Annexed Area may utilize all existing park and recreation facilities upon the effective date of this Ordinance. Fees for such usage shall be in accordance with current fees established by ordinance.
- 3. Additional park and recreation facilities will be constructed based on Park policies defined in the City's Comprehensive Plan, as amended, and the Farmersville Code. The general planned locations and classifications of parks will ultimately serve residents from the current city limits and residents from areas being considered for annexation.

I. <u>Environmental Health and Code Enforcement Services.</u>

- 1. Enforcement of current environmental health ordinances and regulations, including but not limited to, weed and brush ordinances, junked and abandoned vehicles ordinances and animal control ordinances, will begin within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this annexation ordinance.
- 2. Inspection services, including but not limited to, the review of building plans, the issuance of permits and the inspection of all buildings, plumbing, mechanical, and electrical work to ensure compliance with City Codes and Ordinances will be provided within the Annexed Area upon the effective date of this ordinance.
- 3. The City will provide the level of Environmental Health and Code Enforcement Services equal to current services available in the City, or equal to the level of services available in other parts of the City with topography, land use and population density similar to those contemplated or projected in the Annexed Area, whichever may be applicable.

Planning and Zoning.

The Annexed Area shall be zoned in conjunction with the annexation pursuant to the City's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance (Chapter 77 of the Farmersville Code, as amended). The Future Land Use Plan and Future Land Use Plan Modules Diagram contained within the Comprehensive Plan, as amended, will serve as a guide for consideration of future (re)zoning requests.

K. Miscellaneous.

Any city owned facility, building, or service located within the Annexed Area will be operated and maintained by the City upon the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

Capital Improvements Program.

The Annexed Area is eligible for Capital Improvement Program consideration upon the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

M. Other Municipal Services.

Other municipal services not specifically listed in Sections A-L shall be provided to the Annexed Area no later than two and one-half years after the effective date of the annexation, unless certain services cannot reasonably be provided within two and one-half years. In that case, the City shall propose a schedule for providing certain services, and the schedule shall provide for the provision of full municipal services no later than four and one-half years after the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

- 3. <u>Term and Renewal</u>. This Service Agreement is valid for ten years. Renewal of the Service Agreement is at the discretion of the City of Farmersville.
- 4. <u>Level of Services</u>. This Service Agreement does not require a uniform level of full municipal services to each area of the City, including the Annexed Area, if different characteristics of topography, land use, and population density are considered a sufficient basis for providing different levels of service.
- 5. <u>Amendments</u>. This Service Agreement shall not be amended unless public hearings are held in accordance with Texas Local Government Code, § 43.052.
- 6. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Service Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters contained herein and may not be modified or terminated except upon the mutual written agreement of the parties hereto save and except for the termination rights set forth herein.

- 7. <u>Venue</u>. This Service Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and shall be performable in Collin County, Texas. Exclusive venue shall be in Collin County, Texas.
- 8. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Service Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns.
- 9. <u>Savings/Severability</u>. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Service Agreement shall for any reason be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this Service Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
- 10. <u>Construction</u>. This Service Agreement shall be construed fairly and simply, and not strictly for or against any party. Headings used throughout this Service Agreement are for convenience and reference only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be interpreted or held to explain, restrict, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation or construction of the meaning of the provisions of this Service Agreement.
- 11. <u>Multiple Counterparts</u>. This Service Agreement may be separately executed in individual counterparts and, upon execution, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP OF THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. O-2018-0508-001, AS AMENDED, SO THAT AN APPROXIMATELY 26.0183 ACRES OF LAND LOCATED IN AN AREA WEST OF STATE HIGHWAY 78 AND NORTH OF COUNTY ROAD 550, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, AND SITUATED IN THE ELIJAH B. REED SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 739, IN THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS, IS ZONED TO SF 3, SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING 3 DISTRICT USES; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; PROVIDING ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, after public notice and public hearing as required by law, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Farmersville, Texas, (the "Planning and Zoning Commission") has recommended a change in zoning classification of the property described herein and has recommended amending the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, regarding the rezoning of the property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, conditions, and prerequisites have been complied with prior to this case coming before the City Council of the City of Farmersville (the "City Council"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council after public notice and public hearing as required by law and upon due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and of all testimony and information submitted during said public hearings, has determined that in the public's best interest and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City, the zoning of the property described herein shall be established and that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville, Texas, should be amended to reflect the zoning of the property herein described;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> FINDINGS INCORPORATED

The above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. PROPERTY ZONED

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the property described herein shall be zoned as set forth in this section, and the Official Zoning Map of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. O-2018-0508-001, as amended, of the City of Farmersville, Texas, is hereby amended and changed in the following particulars to reflect the action taken herein, and all other existing sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, definitions, phrases, and words of the City's Zoning Ordinance are not amended but shall remain intact and are hereby ratified, verified, and affirmed, in order to create a change in the zoning classification of the property described herein, as follows:

That certain tract of land containing approximately 26.0183 acres of land located in an area west of State Highway 78 and north of County Road 550, Collin County, Texas, and situated within the Elijah B. Reed Survey, Abstract No. 739, Collin County, Texas, and more fully described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes allowed by law (the "Property") is hereby zoned to Sf 3, Single Family Dwelling 3 District Uses in accordance with the specific requirements contained in the City's Master Plan and Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION 3. OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO BE MODIFIED

It is directed that the official zoning map of the City of Farmersville be changed according to its legend to reflect the zoning classification established by this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: REPEALER

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. Any and all Ordinances, resolutions, and/or policies of the City, whether written or otherwise, which are in any manner in conflict with or inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and/or inconsistency.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that the several provisions of this Ordinance are severable. In the event that any court of competent jurisdiction shall judge any provisions of this Ordinance to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, such judgment shall not affect any other provisions of this Ordinance which are not specifically designated as being illegal, invalid, or unenforceable.

SECTION 6: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

Any person, firm, corporation, or business entity violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined any sum not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). Each continuing day's violation under this

Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense. The penal provisions imposed under this Ordinance shall not preclude the City of Farmersville from filing suit to enjoin the violation. The City of Farmersville retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state, and federal law.

SECTION 7: INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 8: PUBLICATION

The City Secretary is hereby directed to publish in the Official Newspaper of the City of Farmersville the Caption, Penalty, and Effective Date Clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 9: ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date Clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville, and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 10: SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 11: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

CITY OF FARMERSVILL ORDINANCE # O-2022-0524-006

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 74, ENTITLED "UTILITIES." OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II BY CHANGING THE NAME OF ARTICLE II FROM, "WATER, SEWER **ELECTRICAL** CHARGES" TO "WATER, SEWER **ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES": THROUGH THE** FURTHER AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, NOW ENTITLED "WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES." BY AMENDING DIVISION 1, "GENERALLY," BY CHANGING THE NAME OF DIVISION 1 TO "CONNECTIONS" AND BY ALSO ADDING NEW SECTIONS 74-19. "DEFINITIONS," 74-20, "PURPOSE", "LOCATION OF LINES: CITY ACCESS: AND SYSTEM PROTECTION," AND 74-22, "PERMIT; REQUIREMENTS TO CONNECT"; THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF DIVISION 3, "SERVICE CHARGES," BY ADDING SECTIONS 74-100, "METERING", 74-101, "WATER AND SEWER **MULTIFAMILY** CONNECTIONS BUILDINGS. **MOBILE** FOR HOME/MANUFACTURED HOUSING PARKS, AND MOTOR HOME/RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKS," **AND** 74-102. "RESTRICTIONS AND CERTAIN CORRECTIONS" AS SET FORTH HEREIN BELOW: REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: RESERVING ALL EXISTING RIGHTS AND REMEDIES; PROVIDING FOR IMMUNITY: PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIONS: PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE CAPTION OF THIS ORDINANCE: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas (the "City Council") enacted Chapter 74 of the Farmersville Code to provide an equitable charge for the extension of water and sanitary sewer mains and connections and related appurtenances necessary to serve customers in the area covered by the City's Certificate of Convenience and Necessity both within the City's corporate limits and its extraterritorial jurisdiction (collectively the "Certificated Area"); and

WHEREAS, Section 552.001(d) of the Texas Local Government Code specifically empowers a city that owns or operates a utility system including a water system or sewer system to prescribe the kind of water mains and sewer pipes that may be used inside or outside the city; and

WHEREAS, Section 552.001(d) of the Texas Local Government Code also allows a city to inspect those facilities, and require that they be kept in good condition at all times and prescribe the necessary rules, which may include penalties, concerning such water and sewer facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that additional requirements are necessary for persons desiring to connect to the City's water and sanitary sewer systems; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Farmersville, Texas, to amend certain provisions of Chapter 74, entitled "Utilities," of the Farmersville Code of Ordinances as provided herein below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS INCORPORATED.

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative determinations and are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if set forth in their entirety.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 74, "UTILITIES", OF THE FARMERSVILLE CODE THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II BY AMENDING BY CHANGING THE NAME OF ARTICLE II FROM "WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CHARGES" TO "WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES"

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 74, "Utilities," of the Farmersville Code is hereby amended through the amendment of Article II by changing the name of Article II from "Water, Sewer and Electrical Charges" to "Water, Sewer and Electrical Connections and Charges" to hereafter read as follows:

"ARTICLE II. - WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES"

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 74, "UTILITIES", OF THE FARMERSVILLE CODE THROUGH THE FURTHER AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, NOW ENTITLED "WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES," BY AMENDING DIVISION 1, "GENERALLY," BY CHANGING THE NAME OF DIVISION 1 TO "CONNECTIONS" AND BY ALSO ADDING NEW SECTIONS 74-19, "DEFINITIONS," 74-20, "PURPOSE", 74-21, "LOCATION LINES: OF CITY ACCESS: AND PROTECTION," AND 74-22, "PERMIT; REQUIREMENTS TO **CONNECT**"

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 74, "Utilities," of the Farmersville Code is amended by amending Article II, now entitled "Water, Sewer and Electrical Connections and Charges," by amending Division 1, "Generally," by changing the name of Division 1 to "Connections" and by adding new Sections 74-19, "Definitions,"

74-20, "Purpose", 74-21, "Location of Lines; City Access; and System Protection," and 74-22, "Permit; Requirements to Connect" to hereafter read as follows:

"DIVISION 1. - CONNECTIONS

Sec. 74-19. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

City means the City of Farmersville, Texas, together with all its governing and operating bodies.

Consumer means the actual user of a City water or sanitary sewer connection.

Extraterritorial Jurisdiction or ETJ, as defined by Texas Local Government Code § 42.021, means the unincorporated area of land that is contiguous to the corporate boundaries of the City and within one mile of those boundaries.

Frontage means the distance of the lot line or tract side to which water and/or sewer mains are connected.

Off-site main means water and/or sewer mains totally outside of and not adjacent to a tract of land to be subdivided and developed for resale.

On-site main means water and/or sewer mains totally within or adjacent to a tract of land to be subdivided and developed for resale.

Plumbing Code means the most recent edition of the International Plumbing Code as adopted and amended by the City.

Pro rata means a charge made against the consumer or property owner to pay for a portion of the cost of installation or extension of water and sanitary sewer mains, as provided for in this chapter or the Subdivision Ordinance.

Property owner means the record title holder of premises served with water from a connection by the City.

Qualified licensed inspector means a person who is licensed by the State of Texas to perform the type of examination(s) and test(s) called for in this Chapter as determined by the City. Depending on

the type of inspection involved, persons with one or more of the following credentials may be considered a *qualified licensed inspector*.

"Plumbing inspectors" and "water supply protection specialists" licensed by the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners ("TSBPE") or "customer service inspectors" who are currently licensed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ").

Retail utility service means potable water service or sanitary sewer service or both provided by the City to a consumer for compensation.

Service means any act performed, anything furnished or supplied, and any facilities or lines committed or used by the City in the performance of its duties under this Chapter to its patrons, employees, other retail public utilities, and the public, as well as the interchange of facilities between the City and another retail public utility.

Sec. 74-20. - Purpose.

The intention and purpose of this article is to provide an equitable charge for water and sanitary sewer connections and a proportionate distribution of the cost of potable water and sanitary sewer facilities to serve the City's customers within the certificated area. This article is also intended to require that all extensions of and connections to the City's water and sewer utilities comply with and conform to the minimum requirements of Texas and federal law in addition to the City's regulations to protect the City's public drinking water supply and drinking water supply system (collectively "Water System") from contamination or pollution including, but not limited to, proper system construction or configuration on the Customer's side of the meter.

Sec. 74-21. – Location of Lines; City Access; and System Protection.

- (a) No water or sewer service line shall be laid except in a dedicated street, alley or easement in favor of the City. The City shall have the right to approve the location of, and inspect, the water service meter, pipe, and appurtenant equipment on customer's property necessary to connect customer to the Water and Sewer Systems.
- (b) City shall have access to its meter(s) and equipment located upon customer's property at all reasonable and/or necessary times for any purpose connected with or in the furtherance of its business operations,

and upon disconnection or discontinuance of services, the City shall have the right to remove any of its equipment from customer's property.

- (c) Customer shall install, at customer's own expense, any necessary service lines from the City's facilities and equipment to the point of use, including any customer service isolation valves, backflow prevention devices, clean-outs, and other equipment as may be specified by the City.
- (d) City shall also have access to customer's property for the purpose of inspecting for possible cross-connections, potential contamination hazards, illegal lead materials, other unauthorized plumbing practices and any other violations or possible violations of state and federal statutes and regulations relating to the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, Chapter 341 of the Texas Health & Safety Code and/or Title 30, Chapter 290 of the Texas Administrative Code during the City's regular business hours. These inspections shall be conducted by the City or its designated agent prior to initiating service and periodically thereafter; when there is reason to believe that cross-connections or other potential contamination hazards exist; or after any major changes to the private water distribution facilities."

Sec. 74-22. – Permit; Requirements to Connect.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to tie onto any water line or sewer line belonging to the City without first complying with the provisions of this Chapter, securing a permit from the City, and paying the fees as provided for in this Chapter.
- (b) All persons desiring retail utility services from the City or desiring to transfer service from a service location to another service location shall file an application with the City at the City's designated location. No connection to the City's utility system shall be made before the person has met the application, fee, and extension requirements of this chapter and, if applicable, the City's subdivision regulations.
- (c) The City shall provide utility service to only "qualified service applicants," defined below, and no utility service application shall be accepted by the City unless the application is submitted by a qualified service applicant. The request by a qualified service applicant shall be filled within five (5) working days unless the City and the qualified service applicant have entered into a utility improvement agreement. If the City and the qualified service applicant have entered into a utility improvement agreement, service will be provided in accordance with that utility improvement agreement.
- (d) A person is a "qualified service applicant" if the person has met the following conditions:

- (1) The person has submitted a completed and signed utility service application and service agreement to the City, has presented a driver's license or social security card to the City, a copy of which the City shall keep on file, and has provided the City with verifiable proof of the applicant's right to occupy the service address. For retail service to a corporation, organization, government or political subdivision or agency, business trust, partnership, association, or any other legal entity, the person shall also provide verifiable documentation of the person's authority to request service on behalf of the entity.
- (2) For developers in the City limits or ETJ of the City desiring retail utility service from the City, the developer has complied with the City's subdivision regulations to obtain retail utility service from the City for the subdivision.
- (3) For persons required to obtain a building permit from the City, the person has paid all the required building permitting fees and applicable impact fees.
- (4) For persons desiring utility service for property or service connections located outside the City limits of the City, the person has complied with the requirements of subsection (k) of this Section.
- (5) The person has paid all applicable charges and fees prescribed by the City's fee schedules, including any tapping and metering charges, all security deposits, construction investigation fees, and utility connection and plumbing code inspection fees.
- (6) The person has complied with the City's extension of utility facilities requirements, if necessary, and the facilities have been extended, inspected, and accepted by the City.
- (7) The person has paid all the pro rata charges as required by this chapter and the City's subdivision regulations, if applicable.
- (8) There is capacity to serve the person or development, or, if the City Manager or the City's Engineer, upon request of the City Manager, determines there is not capacity to service the person or development, the person or developer has entered into a development agreement or utility improvement agreement, as applicable, with the City for the expansion of the City's utility facilities, and complied with the terms of that agreement.

- (9) The person requesting utility services has provided a service address to which utility service will be provided.
- (10) If required, an inspection of the utility connection has been conducted by a Plumbing Inspector or a Water Supply Protection Specialist licensed by the TSBPE or by a Customer Service Inspector licensed by the TCEQ, and such inspection has been approved by the City.

All references in this Chapter to "applicant" or "Applicant" means a "Qualified Service Applicant."

- (e) The City may refuse service to a person if, at the time of the application, the person is indebted to the City, or if that person is indebted to another retail public utility, for the same kind of service for which the person has applied from the City. However, if the person is disputing the indebtedness and is otherwise in compliance with the depository requirements, service shall not be refused.
- (f) No application shall be approved if the City determines that the requested service is for unreasonable consumer uses that will threaten or endanger the City's utility system or threaten the City's ability to provide continuous and adequate service.
- (g) Any person denied service under this ordinance may request review of the City's decision. The request shall be made to the City Manager, who shall place the request before the City Council. The City Manager may request additional information of the person denied service. The City Council may grant or deny service, after review of the request, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.
- (h) It shall be unlawful for any person not employed by the City to uncover and make any connection with the utility systems of the City without first obtaining the consent of the City.
- (i) If a utility improvement agreement is required by the City in order to obtain utility services from the City, or the City and a developer desire to enter into a development agreement, the agreement, at a minimum, shall incorporate the requirements outlined in this chapter and shall include the following:
 - (1) Provide all costs associated with required administration, design, construction, and inspection of facilities for utility service to the applicant's service address and terms by which these costs are to be paid, and specify that the City is under no obligation to provide

service to the applicant unless and until all required fees have been paid by the applicant.

- (2) Describe all fees and costs to be paid to the City, including construction investigation fees, tapping and metering fees, and pro rata reimbursement charges, if applicable.
- (3) Describe the facilities that are required to be constructed and the materials to be used in the construction of the facilities, state the size of each meter to be installed, define who will be responsible for the construction of those projects, and require the facilities to be sized and constructed in accordance with the City's standards and as determined by the City Manager or the City's Engineer.
- (4) If the facilities are to be constructed by the City, prescribe the procedures by which the applicant shall accept or deny a contractor's bid for facilities to be constructed by the City, thereby committing to continue or discontinue the project.
- (5) Describe the terms and conditions by which the City may terminate its obligations to provide service.
- (6) Outline how the City will administer the applicant's project with respect to:
 - a. Design of the applicant's onsite utility facilities;
 - b. Securing and qualifying bids;
 - c. Selection of a qualified bidder for construction for facilities the City intends to construct;
 - d. Dispensing advanced funds for construction of facilities required for the applicant's service;
 - e. Inspecting construction of facilities; and
 - f. Testing facilities and closing the project.
- (7) Define the terms by which the applicant shall indemnify the City from all third-party claims or lawsuits in connection with the project contemplated.
- (8) Define the terms by which the applicant shall deed all constructed facilities to the City and by which the City shall assume operation and maintenance responsibility, including any enforcement

of warranties in connection with construction of the applicant's project.

- (9) Define the terms by which the applicant shall grant title or easement for utilities, constructed facilities, and facility sites and terms by which the applicant shall provide for the securing of required utility easements and sites.
- (10) Provide termination date.
- (11) If applicable, provide for pro rata reimbursement by the owners of all intervening property served by such extension of facilities constructed by or paid for by the applicant. Such pro rata reimbursement provisions shall comply with this Chapter.
- (j) All customers of the City's utility system, including those customers located in whole or in part outside the corporate limits of the City, shall comply with the cross-contamination and backflow prevention requirements of the City.
- (k) In addition to the other provisions of this Chapter, this subsection applies to any retail utility service provided and requested to be provided by the City to premises that are located, in whole or in part, outside the corporate limits of the City.
 - (1) Any customer receiving utility services outside the City limits may not maintain connection to the City's utility system or connect to the City's utility system unless the customer is in compliance with the applicable utility regulations, state law, the Plumbing Code, and other City requirements relating to the provision of utility service. Any customer failing to be in compliance or refusing reasonable requests for inspection of facilities connected or to be connected to the City's utilities may be disconnected or declined services.
 - (2) No retail utility service shall be provided at premises located in whole or part outside the corporate limits of the City unless the person desiring such service has filed an application with the City, the City has determined the application meets the requirements of this chapter, and if applicable the City's subdivision regulations, and approved such application, and the person is a Qualified Service Applicant as defined by this Section.
 - (3) The application for service to property located outside the corporate limits of the City shall include the following statement:

THE APPLICANT UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT ALL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY (AS NOW WRITTEN AND AS HEREINAFTER AMENDED) RELATING TO UTILITY SERVICES OR TO PLUMBING MATTERS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO CROSS-CONNECTION AND BACK-FLOW PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS, AND INCLUDING ORDINANCES THAT IMPOSE CRIMINAL SANCTIONS, APPLY TO UTILITY SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY TO PREMISES OUTSIDE OF THE CITY'S CORPORATE THE APPLICANT ALSO UNDERSTANDS AND LIMITS. **AGREES** THAT THE CITY MAY SUSPEND OR DISCONNECT SUCH SERVICES IN THE EVENT THAT THE APPLICANT OR ANY OTHER PERSON AT THE PREMISES TO BE SERVED FAILS TO COMPLY WITH SUCH ORDINANCES.

- (4) No utility services application shall be accepted by the City unless a completed and signed application is submitted to the City that meets the requirements described in this section, the person is a Qualified Service Applicant, and the person has complied with the following requirements:
 - a. The person has paid the prescribed utility connection fee, if required, paid the plumbing code or customer service inspection fees and has presented to the City written evidence from a qualified licensed inspector that the plumbing system at the premises to be served has been inspected and is in compliance with the Plumbing Code;
 - b. The person has complied with the City's utility facilities extension requirements, if necessary."
- (I) All customers of the City's utility systems, including those customers located in whole or in part outside the corporate limits of the City, shall have a customer service inspection performed by a Customer Service Inspector approved by the City, and obtain a customer service inspection certificate completed on TCEQ Form 20699 or an equivalent form approved by the TCEQ, prior to the City providing continuous water service to new construction, or to any existing service either when the City has reason to believe that cross-connections or other potential contaminant hazards exist, or after any material improvement, correction, or addition to the private water distribution facilities serving the customer.
 - (1) Individuals with the following credentials and who are approved by the City shall be recognized as capable of conducting a customer service inspection certification.

- a. Plumbing Inspectors and Water Supply Protection Specialists licensed by the TSBPE.
- b. Customer Service Inspectors who are currently licensed by the TCEQ.
- (2) As potential contaminant hazards are discovered, they shall be promptly eliminated to prevent possible contamination of the water supplied by the Water System. The existence of a health hazard, as identified in 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 290.47(f), shall be considered sufficient grounds for immediate termination of water service. Service can be restored only when the health hazard no longer exists, or until the health hazard has been isolated from the Water System in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 290.44(h).
- (3) These customer service inspection requirements are not considered acceptable substitutes for and shall not apply to the sanitary control requirements stated in 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 290.102(a)(5).
- (4) A customer service inspection is an examination of the private water distribution facilities for the purpose of providing or denying water service. This inspection is limited to the identification and prevention of cross-connections, potential contaminant hazards, and illegal lead materials. If a customer service inspection is performed by a customer service inspector, the customer service inspector shall report any violations immediately to the City Manager or the City's Building Inspection Department.
- (5) A customer service inspection is not a plumbing inspection as defined and regulated by the TSBPE. The City's Plumbing Code requires that TSBPE licensed plumbing inspectors perform plumbing inspections of all new plumbing and alterations or additions to existing plumbing within the City's corporate limits. A customer service inspection may be performed by a plumbing inspector licensed by the TSBPE as a part of the more comprehensive plumbing inspection under the Plumbing Code. (As noted above, customer service inspections that are required in the City's ETJ may be performed by a Customer Service Inspector who is currently licensed by the TCEQ.)"
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 74, "UTILITIES", OF THE FARMERSVILLE CODE THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE II, NOW ENTITLED "WATER, SEWER AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS AND CHARGES," BY AMENDING DIVISION 3

CHARGES", "SERVICE BY ADDING SECTIONS 74-100. "METERING", 74-101, "WATER AND SEWER CONNECTIONS FOR BUILDINGS, MULTIFAMILY MOBILE HOME/MANUFACTURED HOUSING PARKS, AND MOTOR HOME/RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKS" 74-102. "RESTRICTIONS **AND** CERTAIN AND CORRECTIONS"

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 74, "Utilities," of the Farmersville Code is amended by amending Article II, now entitled "Water, Sewer and Electrical Connections and Charges," by amending Division 3, "Service Charges," by adding Sections 74-100, "Metering", 74-101, "Water and Sewer Connections for Multifamily Buildings, Mobile Home/Manufactured Housing Parks, and Motor Home/Recreational Vehicle Parks," and 74-102, "Restrictions and Certain Corrections", to hereafter read as follows:

"Sec. 74-100. - Metering.

- (a) All water furnished by the City shall be metered by meters that are maintained and owned by the City. Unless otherwise provided for herein, the meter and connection is for the sole use of customer and will be used to provide service to ONLY one (1) dwelling or one (1) business authorized to receive such service by City
- (b) When more than one building, apartment, etc., is served through one meter. Where more than one building or apartment or other subdivision of space in any residence or commercial building is served through one meter, each such additional building, apartment, or other subdivision of space shall be deemed a separate service and a separate minimum charge shall be made therefor and collected by the City, but in any such case, each such minimum shall be the regular minimum prescribed for a single service through a like meter.
- (c) Determination of meter sizes. The City Manager or the City Engineer shall determine the size and type of meter installed or used on any water service, and where more than one service is furnished through any one meter, he shall determine the number of minimum rates, which shall apply to such meter account.
- (d) Several owners served by one meter. Where water is supplied to more than one family or occupant through a single service pipe on which there is a meter, the City will not undertake to apportion the charge for such use of water among the several owners, occupants or families; but the bill for such use of water will be charged against the owner or such occupant, through whose premises such service pipes pass and in such case each separate owner, occupant or family shall be subject to the minimum charge hereinafter specified.

- (e) Any attempt to tamper with or to by-pass a meter, or to divert water utility service from one property to another, or to share, resell, or submeter water to any other person, dwelling, business, or property is prohibited.
- (f) Unauthorized users of City services shall be prosecuted to the extent allowed by law under Texas Penal Code § 28.03.

Sec. 74-101. - Water and Sewer Connections for Multifamily Buildings, Mobile Home/Manufactured Housing Parks, and Motor Home/Recreational Vehicle Parks.

(a) *Definitions*. For purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following definitions:

Multifamily building: An apartment building or condominium.

Mobile home/manufactured housing park: A unified development of home spaces arranged on a tract of land or site under single ownership, and designed to accommodate mobile homes or manufactured housing, as those terms are defined in V.T.C.A., Occupations Code Chapter 1201, as amended, to be utilized as dwellings.

Motor Home/Recreational Vehicle Park: A unified development of parking slips or spaces or plots arranged on a tract of land or site under single ownership, and designed to accommodate motor homes or recreational vehicles, as those terms are defined in V.T.C.A., Occupations Code Chapter 2301, as amended, to be utilized for sleeping accommodations or as temporary, transient or semi-permanent accommodations in which to park or place such vehicles for which a fee is exchanged.

- (b) One meter per individual dwelling unit. A separate water meter shall be provided for each individual dwelling unit in a multifamily building or mobile home/manufactured housing park or motor home/recreational vehicle park. Not more than one individual dwelling unit in a multifamily building or mobile home/manufactured housing park or motor home/recreational vehicle park shall be connected to one meter.
- (c) Penalty for violation. It is unlawful for any person to connect a meter to more than one individual dwelling unit in a multifamily building or mobile home/manufactured housing park or motor home/recreational vehicle park.

Sec. 74-102. – Restrictions and Certain Corrections.

- (a) No direct connection between the public drinking water supply and a potential source of contamination is permitted. Potential sources of contamination shall be isolated from the public water system by an airgap or an appropriate backflow prevention assembly in accordance with state plumbing regulations. Additionally, all pressure relief valves and thermal expansion devices must be in compliance with state plumbing codes.
- (b) No cross-connection between the public drinking water supply and a private water system is permitted. These potential threats to the public drinking water supply shall be eliminated at the service connection by the proper installation of an airgap or a reduced pressure-zone backflow prevention assembly and a service agreement must exist for annual inspection and testing by a certified backflow prevention device tester.
- (c) No connection which allows water of any kind or nature (including but not limited to condensing, cooling, or industrial process water) to be returned to the public drinking water supply is permitted.
- (d) No pipe or pipe fitting which contains more than 0.25 % lead may be used for the installation or repair of plumbing at any connection which provides water for human use.
- (e) No solder or flux that contains more than 0.2 % lead may be used for the installation or repair of plumbing at any connection which provides water for human use.
- (f) No installation of any plumbing fixture that is not in compliance with state-approved plumbing regulation is permitted."

SECTION 4. CUMULATIVE REPEALER

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City and shall not repeal any of the provisions of said ordinances except in those instances where provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance and such ordinances shall remain intact and are hereby ratified, verified and affirmed.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY

If any section, article, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word in this Ordinance, or application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance, and the City Council hereby declares it would have passed such remaining portions of the Ordinance despite such invalidity, which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 7. IMMUNITY

All of the regulations provided in this Ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this Ordinance, acting for the City of Farmersville in the discharge of his duties, shall not thereby render himself personally liable; and he is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his said duties.

SECTION 8. INJUNCTIONS

Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this Ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 9. PENALTY

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalty provisions set forth in Section 1-3 of the Farmersville Code of Ordinances; and each and every day such violation shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 10. PUBLICATION

The caption of this Ordinance shall be published one time in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Farmersville following the City Council's adoption hereof as provided by law.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its final passage and publication as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.

CITY OF FARMERSVILLE ORDINANCE # 2007-33

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING ARTICLE 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES. ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND COMMERCE," BY REPLACING CURRENT SECTION 5.110 ENTITLED "RESERVED" WITH A NEW SECTION 5.110 ENTITLED "HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX:" PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF A HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX AT THE RATE OF SEVEN PERCENT FOR THE PRICE PAID FOR A HOTEL ROOM: PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF QUARTERLY REPORTS: PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING Α SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, chapter 351 of the Texas Tax Code authorizes the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas, to impose a hotel occupancy tax at the rate of seven percent (7.0%); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas, finds and determines the ordinance is in the best interest and public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Farmersville, Texas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS:

SECTION I: <u>Incorporation of premises</u>. The above and foregoing premises to this Ordinance are true and correct and are incorporated herein and made a part hereof for all purposes.

SECTION II: That Article 5 of the City Code of the City of Farmersville, Texas, is hereby amended by replacing current Section 5.110 in its entirety with a new Section 5.110 entitled "Hotel Occupancy Tax" which shall read as follows:

"Sec. 5.110. Hotel Occupancy Tax.

Sec. 5.110.1. Definitions.

In this article:

(1) Consideration means the cost of a hotel room only if the room is ordinarily used for sleeping, and does not include the cost of any food served or personal

- services rendered to the room or a person in the room unless related to the cleaning and readying of the room for occupancy.
- (2) Hotel means a building in which members of the public may obtain sleeping accommodations for consideration. The term includes a hotel, motel, tourist home, tourist house, tourist court, lodging house, inn, boarding house, rooming house, bed and breakfast inn, or other building where a room is furnished for a consideration, but does not include a hospital, sanitarium, or nursing home.
- (3) Hotel Room means a room in a hotel that members of the public obtain for sleeping accommodations and which may also include kitchen facilities, sitting rooms and other related appurtenances.
- (4) Tourism means the guidance or management of tourists.
- (5) Tourist means an individual who travels from the individual's residence to a different municipality, county, state, or country for pleasure, recreation, education, or culture.

Sec. 5.110.2. Tax levied; exceptions.

- (a) A tax of seven percent (7%) of the consideration paid for a hotel room is levied on a person who, under a lease, concession, permit, right of access, license, contract, or agreement, pays the consideration for the use or possession or for the right to the use or possession of a hotel room that costs two dollars or more each day and is ordinarily used for sleeping.
- (b) This article does not impose a tax on:
 - (1) a person who has the right to use or possess a hotel room for at least thirty (30) consecutive days, so long as there is no interruption of payment for the period; or
 - (2) the United States, a governmental entity of the United States, or an officer or employee of the United States.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided in section 156.103 of the Texas Tax Code, as amended, the State of Texas, or an agency, institution, board, or commission of the State of Texas other than an institution of higher education, as that term is defined by section 61.003 of the Texas Education Code, as amended, shall pay the tax imposed by this article and is entitled to a refund of the amount of tax paid.
- (d) A person entitled to a refund of tax paid under this section shall make an application for a refund in the form prescribed by the City.

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Sec. 5.110.3. Collection of tax generally.

- (a) A person who owns, operates, manages, or controls a hotel or collects payment for the use or possession or for the right to the use or possession of a hotel room shall collect the tax levied by this article for the City.
- (b) A person who collects the tax shall deposit the tax proceeds into in a separate liability account and may not use the tax proceeds for any purpose other than payment to the City.
- (c) Every person owning, operating, managing or controlling any hotel shall collect the tax levied by this article for the City. The hotel operator shall be entitled to one percent of the hotel occupancy tax revenues collected as reimbursement for the operator's administrative costs for collecting the tax. However, as further described in this article, this reimbursement may be forfeited at the discretion of the City if the hotel operator fails to timely pay over the tax or timely file a report as required by the City or files a false report with the City.

Sec. 5.110.4. Quarterly reports; payments.

- (a) A quarterly period under this section is based on the City's fiscal year, with the first quarter beginning on October 1 and ending on December 31.
- (b) On or before the last day of the month following each quarterly period, a person required to collect the tax imposed under this article shall:
 - (1) file a written report with the City for that quarterly period, with a copy of the report for state hotel occupancy taxes required by Section 156.151 of the Texas Tax Code, as amended, for the same quarterly period; and
 - (2) pay the tax due for the quarter.
- (c) A report under this section shall be in the form prescribed by the City and shall include:
 - (1) the total consideration paid for rooms subject to the tax in the preceding quarter;
 - (2) the total amount of tax collected; and
 - (3) the total amount of tax exemptions granted.
- (d) If requested by the City, a person responsible for collecting the tax shall provide the City with:

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- (1) the names, addresses, and identification relied upon to grant an exemption from the tax; and
- (2) any other information the City may reasonably require.
- (e) The City Manager may request, and a person required to collect the tax shall provide within a reasonable time, additional documentation verifying the information contained in the report to the City.

Sec. 5.110.5. Collection procedure on purchase of a hotel.

- (a) If a hotel owner sells a hotel, the purchaser or his assignee shall withhold an amount of the purchase price sufficient to pay the amount of tax due until the seller provides:
 - (1) a receipt issued by the City showing that the amount of tax due has been paid; or
 - (2) a certificate issued by the City showing that no tax is due.
- (b) A purchaser of a hotel who fails to withhold the amount of the purchase price as required by this section is liable for the unpaid tax required to be withheld to the extent of the value of the purchase price.
- (c) The purchaser of a hotel may file a written request with the City for the issuance of a certificate stating that no tax is due or for a statement of the amount required to be paid before a certificate may be issued. The City shall issue the certificate or statement not later than the 60th day after the date that the City receives the request.
- (d) If the City fails to issue the certificate or statement within the period provided by Subsection (c), the purchaser is released from the obligation to withhold the amount of tax from the purchase price or pay the amount of tax due.

Sec. 5.110.6. Rules; access to records.

- (a) The City Manager may promulgate rules to effectively collect the tax imposed by this article.
- (b) Upon reasonable notice, a person responsible for collecting the tax shall give the City access to the records necessary to determine the accuracy of a report filed or the amount of tax due under this article.

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Sec. 5.110.7. Allocation and use of hotel occupancy tax revenue.

- (a) The revenue derived from the tax authorized by this article may be used only as provided by section 351.101 of the Texas Tax Code, as amended, to promote tourism and the convention and hotel industry as follows:
 - (1) the acquisition of sites for and the construction, improvement, enlarging, equipping, repairing, operation, and maintenance of convention center facilities or visitor information centers, or both;
 - (2) the furnishing of facilities, personnel, and materials for the registration of convention delegates or registrants;
 - advertising and conducting solicitations and promotional programs to attract tourists and convention delegates or registrants to the City or its vicinity;
 - (4) the encouragement, promotion, improvement, and application of the arts, including instrumental and vocal music, dance, drama, folk art, creative writing, architecture, design and allied fields, painting, sculpture, photography, graphic and craft arts, motion pictures, radio, television, tape and sound recording, and other arts related to the presentation, performance, execution, and exhibition of these major art forms;
 - (5) historical restoration and preservation projects or activities or advertising and conducting solicitations and promotional programs to encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums:
 - (A) at or in the immediate vicinity of convention center facilities or visitor information centers; or
 - (B) located elsewhere in the City or its vicinity that would be frequented by tourists and convention delegates; and
 - (6) expenses, including promotion expenses, directly related to a sporting event in which the majority of participants are tourists who substantially increase economic activity at hotels and motels within the City or its vicinity.
- (b) Revenue derived from the tax shall only be expended to directly enhance and promote tourism and the City's convention and hotel industry. Tax revenue may not be used as general revenue for general governmental operations of the City.

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Sec. 5.110.8. Penalties; interest.

- (a) In addition to the tax imposed under this article, a person shall pay a penalty of five percent (5%) of the tax due if the person:
 - (1) fails to file a report on or before the due date;
 - (2) fails to pay the tax imposed on or before the due date; or
 - (3) files a report containing false information.
- (b) A person who fails to pay any amount of the tax and penalty due under Subsection (a) on or before the 60th day after the tax is due shall pay an additional five percent (5%) penalty on the unpaid tax. A delinquency penalty shall not be less than one dollar (\$1.00).
- (c) Beginning on the 61st day after the due date, delinquent taxes shall draw interest at a rate of ten percent (10%) per annum.

Sec. 5.110.9. Offenses.

- (a) A person commits an offense if the person violates or fails to perform an act required by this article, or files a report containing false information. Each instance of a violation of this article is a separate offense, and each day that a person remains in violation shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.
- (b) An offense under this article is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable as provided in Section 1.104.1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmersville.
- (c) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City of Farmersville from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

Sec. 5.110.10. Additional enforcement authority.

The City may take the following actions against a person who has failed to file a required report, failed to collect the tax imposed, failed to pay the taxes over to the City when due, or filed a false report:

- (1) bring suit to collect the unpaid tax or to enjoin the person from operating a hotel in the City until the tax is paid or the report filed, as applicable, as provided by the court's order; and
- (2) any other remedy provided under state law.

Secs. 5.110.11 - 5.110.20. Reserved."

SECTION III: Savings. This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance; provided, however, that any complaint, notice, action, cause of action, or claim which prior to the effective date of this Ordinance has been initiated or has arisen under or pursuant to such other ordinance(s) shall continue to be governed by the provisions of that ordinance or those ordinances, and for that purpose that ordinance or those ordinances shall be deemed to remain and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION IV: Severability. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, phrases, clauses and words of this Ordinance are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence, phrase, clause or word in this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and the City Council hereby declares that it would have passed such remaining portions of this Ordinance despite such invalidity, which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION V: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in accordance with and as provided by Texas law.
