Council members Mike Henry and Lance Hudson were absent. City staff members in attendance were City Manager, Ben White, Assistant City Manager, Mike Sullivan; City Secretary, Tabatha Monk, Police Chief Marsha Phillips, Fire Chief Gregg Massey, Warrant Officer Rick Ranspot, EDC Director Larry Tucker and City Attorney, Alan Lathrom.
- Prayer was led by Warrant Officer Rick Ranspot and the pledges to the United States and Texas flags were led by Mayor Wiebold.
- Mayor Wiebold announced to check the City Calendar for any upcoming closings for holidays and meetings.

The proposed Sandy Landing subdivision has submitted a variance request from the Subdivision Ordinances. The request is to install a single entrance cul-desac at a length of approximately 2700 LF. The ordinance states a maximum length of 600 LF is allowable. The subdivision contains 20 1-acre lots and is situated south of town on CR 550, just west of SH 78.

One of the main concerns with single entrance subdivisions is the ability for first responders to access residences at all times in the event of an emergency. We recommend that the variance request be approved on the condition of one or both of the following requirements:

- Developer is required to install an enlarged divided entry way from CR 550
- Developer is required to install at minimum a collector size roadway throughout the subdivision (60' ROW with 32' paving)





Sir,

Per previous conversations, the following issues have arisen or been discovered since my employment began November 1, 2022. These issues are specifically related to life-safety and the lack of preventive maintenance to said equipment, prior to my arrival.

A comprehensive evaluation was conducted of all equipment to include fire apparatus, associated equipment, to include tools, devices, and hose service life. There were no records found pertaining to maintenance, replacement history, condition or testing. We did find some records pertaining to annual (3<sup>rd</sup> party-testing) of ladders, SCBA's (air tanks), but that is all we have found.

There were no specific and/or historic records found of basic service to apparatus or equipment checks. The evaluation/inspection process revealed major life safety concerns and failures that needed to be addressed immediately.

Note: Both vehicles appeared to have the original oil and fuel filters that came with the trucks when purchased. One filter was date stamped 2009 and one was stamped 2012. We were not able to find where these vehicles were ever serviced.

We had no choice but to address these issues. With the repairs, to get these vehicles back into service and additional maintenance to the remaining fleet/equipment, the department is \$7,743.35 in overages to the vehicle maintenance budget.

Present safety concerns and needs. The department needs to address the status of several vehicles to include one's that have already been serviced.

A keystone is the main water valve for the pump intake from a water source i.e.: hydrant, apparatus, drafting, etc. We have one keystone on the engine and one on the quint. The Engine keystone is leaking and not sealing, will need to be replaced. The Quint Keystone is leaking and will need to be replaced. Both keystones are out of date and non-repairable. The Tender has no keystone.

We want to add two keystones to each apparatus, one each side. The keystones will be new and repairable.

Routine and preventive maintenance: Upon inspection, mechanic found the v-belt, serpentine belt, radiator coolant hose (upper and lower) need replaced due to fraying and cracking. Again, no records of preventative maintenance for this vehicle were found.

In maintaining ISO 2 and the safe operation for personnel, the department must conduct an annual pump test, ground/aerial ladder test, and hose test. This inspection and testing are conducted by third – party vendor.

When these vehicles were ordered there was no emergency lighting installed on the side of the vehicle. This is somewhat problematic when blocking and shutting down lanes of travel due to major accidents.

Need 20 radio batteries, eight chargers, and eight lapel mic's. most of the equipment is being replaced due to end of life, damaged, and nonworking.

**Grant Fee** 

\$1,500.00

**AFG Grant** 

Currently the department is seeking a grant to replace all <u>end-of-life</u> equipment to include SCBA's, masks, and air bottles. Additionally, we do not have a way to re-fill our bottles and must rely on filling these bottles from area FD's. This grant, if received will provide us with a Cascade system to refill air bottles as well as, replace end-of-life equipment.

The grant total is \$368,196.00 with in-kind match of \$17,533.14. We should be notified by April 2023 if we were successful in getting the grant.

Part-Time

\$10,000

Currently part-time staff are utilized for filling in during the Chief's and Full-time Firefighter absent. Other part-time monies are used when staff extra persons for inclement weather stand-by's. We are asking to increase this amount to augment for staffing during shortages not covered with volunteer staff.

Including the current overage of \$7,743.35 to the vehicle maintenance budget, the fire department is asking for a mid-year adjustment of **§51,951.46** to address the **remaining issues** identified in this report.

These items address the remaining issues and provide a benchmark in the overall health of our equipment and where we need to be present day. We have created an inspection process to include apparatus and equipment. Additionally, we've built into our protocols and future budgets for 3<sup>rd</sup> party inspections, to include Ladders, SCBA's, preventive pump maintenance, and the collection of data on each apparatus.

One of my main goals as fire chief, is for the department to become accredited through the Texas Fire Chief's Association "Best Practices Program". The program defines the pathway to organizational excellence which ultimately enhances firefighter safety, long-term planning, standard operating guidelines, deployment analysis, risk management, and other administrative functions. It will be this program and meeting specific industry standards, which will take this department to the next level.

In conclusion, the issues identified are directly related to Life-safety and making sure our equipment remains in a state of readiness. I found that historically there was no process to identify and check these issues on a regular basis. My prior experience tells me that we cannot afford to be in this state again. I pledge to you and the city, that there is a process in place now to prevent this from occurring again.




