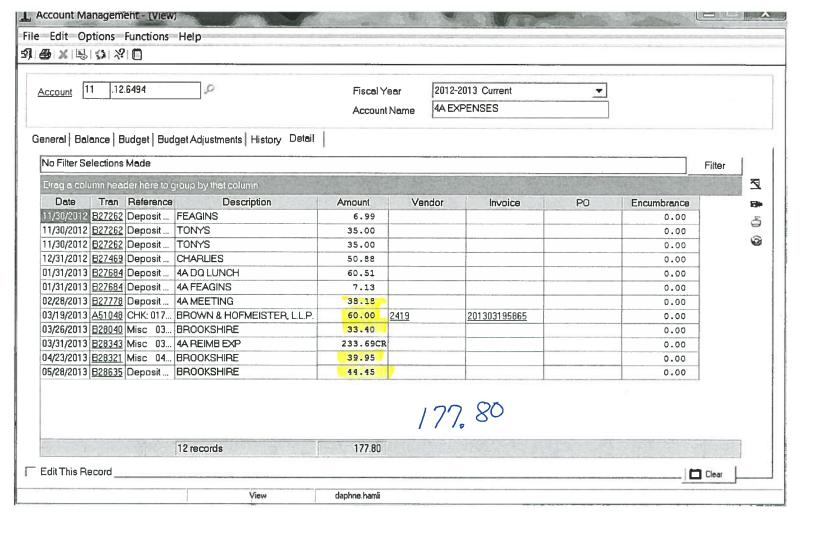

Faulty ballasts will be exchanged for new ballasts for a period of three years from date of shipment.

Vandalism to Sign Face: This Warranty covers the polycarbonate face(s) against breakage due to vandalism for the life of the sign. This Warranty does not cover the sign face if damaged by gunshots, or when damaged coincident with damage to the sign cabinet.

TekStar LED Display: Stewart Signs warrants the LED portion of the TekStar Sign for a period of three (3) years.

Failed electronic parts or assemblies will be repaired, exchanged or replaced for three (3) years from date of shipment. Stewart Signs will replace failed LED pixels (on-site labor not included), if more than 0.5% of the total number of pixels in the sign have failed within a year, provided the sign is installed with the recommended ventilation clearance of 2" on each end of the cabinet (ventilation vents are on each end of the cabinet).
