Dear Candidate:

Thank you for your interest in serving the citizens of Hale Center. Should you decide to become a candidate, your candidacy requires compliance with certain state statutes and local ordinances. Please realize the material in this packet is not exhaustive and that it is the duty of the candidate to become familiar with and follow all laws, rules, and regulations applicable to municipal campaigns. Hale Center is a General Law Type A city.

The General Election is scheduled for May 7, 2022, for the purpose of electing the mayor and two councilmembers all places are for two (2) year full terms.

The role of the City Secretary's Office is to accept and file candidate applications, affidavits, and statements required of candidates, and note the dates of filing thereon. There is no legal duty to inform anyone of the necessity of or deadlines for filing any of the documents or to advise anyone in regard to the meaning and requirements of statutes. The City Secretary should not be expected to judge or comment upon the timeliness or sufficiency of reports filed, but rather to serve only as the custodian of the records.

On filing of an application for place on the ballot, the City Secretary must review the application to determine whether it complies with the requirements as to form, content, and procedure only. That is, the City Secretary checks to be sure it was filed correctly and in a timely manner and that all required information is completed and attested to. The review must be completed not later than the fifth day after the date the application is received by the authority. If an application does not comply with applicable requirements, the City Secretary must reject the application and provide the candidate written notice of the rejection. [EC Sec. 141.032(e)]. Candidates are not permitted to simply making corrections to the form once submitted, review materials fully before turning them in. Please file your application as soon as practicable to allow sufficient time for this review. Filing at the last minute may not give the City Secretary sufficient time for review, which is subject to state law, not City preference. Please do not leave any blanks on the application, as doing so may render your application invalid.

Texas Election Code Section 141.032, which governs the review of a candidate's application for a place on the ballot for form, content, and procedure, does not apply to a determination of a candidate's eligibility.

All applications, affidavits, statements, and campaign reports filed with the City Secretary's office are considered public information and are open to inspection by the public.

Your interest in municipal government and our community is appreciated. This office has prepared this "Candidate Packet" to acquaint you with legal requirements pertaining to campaign contributions, expenditures, and responsibilities set forth in the State Election Code. This packet is not all-inclusive of what you may be required to do. Therefore, reading all the material is recommended as points of contact are referenced throughout the material.

2022 Candidate Packet

General information (underlined items are included in this packet):

The Texas Election Code Sec. 141.001 provides the following: ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC OFFICE.

- (a) To be eligible to be a candidate for, or elected or appointed to, a public elective office in this state, a person must:
- (1) be a United States citizen;
- (2) be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election or on the date of appointment, as applicable;
- (3) have not been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
- (A) totally mentally incapacitated; or
- (B) partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
- (4) have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- (5) have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the territory from which the office is elected for six months immediately preceding the following date:
- (A) for a candidate whose name is to appear on a general primary election ballot, the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot;
- (B) for an independent candidate, the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot;
- (C) for a write-in candidate, the date of the election at which the candidate's name is written in;
- (D) for a party nominee who is nominated by any method other than by primary election, the date the nomination is made; and
- (E) for an appointee to an office, the date the appointment is made;
- (6) on the date described by Subdivision (5), be registered to vote in the territory from which the office is elected; and
- (7) satisfy any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law for the office.
- (a-1) For purposes of satisfying the continuous residency requirement of Subsection (a)(5), a person who claims an intent to return to a residence after a temporary absence may establish that intent only if the person:
- (1) has made a reasonable and substantive attempt to effectuate that intent; and
- (2) has a legal right and the practical ability to return to the residence.
- (a-2) Subsection (a-1) does not apply to a person displaced from the person's residence due to a declared local, state, or national disaster.
- (a-3) The authority with whom an application for a place on a general primary election ballot is filed under Section <u>172.022</u> shall, to the extent permitted by law, use Subsections (a) and (a-1) in determining whether a candidate meets the residency requirements for a public elective office.
- (b) A statute outside this code supersedes Subsection (a) to the extent of any conflict.
- (c) Subsection (a) does not apply to an office for which the federal or state constitution or a statute outside this code prescribes exclusive eligibility requirements.
- (d) Subsection (a)(6) does not apply to a member of the governing body of a district created under Section <u>52</u>(b)(1) or (2), Article III, or Section <u>59</u>, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

D. City of Hale Center Council candidates use Texas Ethics Commission Non-Judicial Candidate/Officeholder forms, file with the City Secretary's office, and do not file electronically with the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC), although candidates may choose to use and print fillable forms when appropriate. TEC forms are available at https://www.Ethics.state.TX.US/forms/coh/coh/frm.php

Most form links are accompanied with a link to an instruction manual for the form. Candidates find the TEC's Campaign Finance Guide for Candidates and Officeholders Who File with Local Filing Authorities at https://www.Ethics.state.TX.US/data/resources/guides/coh local guide.pdf to be informative.

The City Secretary is the local filing authority for HALE CENTER City Council candidates.

- a. Appointment of a Campaign Treasurer by a Candidate (Form CTA) from https://www.Ethics.state.TX.US/data/forms/coh/cta.pdf (The Form CTA Instruction Guide is linked at https://www.Ethics.state.TX.US/data/forms/coh/CTA ins.pdf) The CTA should be filed in the City Secretary's office at the same time as the Application for a Place on the Ballot. Please note the statement that must be signed regarding the nepotism law. The second page of the form is to be completed if the candidate would like to use modified reporting.
- **b.** The *Code of Fair Campaign Practices* (Form CFCP) is signed voluntarily and is available at https://www.Ethics.state.TX.US/data/forms/coh/cfcp.pdf
- c. City candidates follow the TEC's 2022 Uniform (Local) Filing Schedule, available at https://www.ethics.state.tx.us/data/filinginfo/schedules/s22uniform.pdf Questions on reporting procedures, contributions, or expenditures should be addressed to the Texas Ethics Commission at (512) 463-5800. It is the duty of a candidate to become familiar with the laws applicable to campaigning for office. Regarding the filing of candidate/officeholder reports, the City Secretary is limited to accepting the filing of the various reports, and noting the date and time of filing thereon. Questions regarding campaign reporting procedures, contributions, or expenditures should be directed to the Texas Ethics Commission at (512) 463-5800 or Ethics.state.TX.US.

Please note that all applications, affidavits, statements, and campaign financial reports filed with the City Secretary's office are considered public information and open for public inspection and copying.

CITY COUNCIL

State Law reference— Form of government, Local Government Code § 6.001 et seq.

2.01. - Composition of city council.

a. Members of council. City council shall be composed of a mayor and six (6) councilpersons.

The mayor and the two (2) councilpersons shall be elected by a majority vote of the city.

- **b.** Election. All candidates for city council shall be voted on and elected separately for positions on said city council, and each candidate shall be designated on the official ballot according to the title of such position to which he seeks election. Any candidate for office receiving a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which he is a candidate shall be elected to such office. Candidates in a runoff election are the candidates who receive the highest number of votes in the main election or who tie for the highest number of votes. Tie votes shall be resolved in accordance with state law.
- **c.** Term of office. The mayor and councilpersons shall each hold their respective offices for a term of two (2) years and until their successors shall have been elected and duly qualified.

2.02. - Qualifications.

- **a.** Enumerated. The mayor and councilpersons shall have been qualified voters of the city for twelve (12) months immediately preceding election day, and continuously during their term of office.
 - 2.03. Conduct of elections.
- a. Regulations. All city elections shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. In the event there should be any failure of the general laws to provide for some feature of the city elections, city council shall have the power to provide for such deficiency, making all regulations it considers desirable, not inconsistent with the laws of the State of Texas, for the prevention of fraud in such elections and for the recount of ballots in case of doubt or fraud. Municipal elections shall be

conducted by the appointed election authorities, who shall also have power to make such regulations not inconsistent with any regulations made by council or the laws of the State of Texas. No informalities in conducting a city election shall invalidate the same, if it be conducted fairly and in substantial compliance with the general laws, where applicable, and the ordinances of the city.

b. Schedule.

- **1.** Regular election. The regular election for choice of members of council shall be held annually on a uniform election date as determined by state law and as ordered by city council.
- **2.** Special election. Council may by ordinance or resolution order a special election, fix the time for holding same and provide necessary means.

State Law reference— Uniform election dates, V.T.C.A., Election Code § 41.001.

2.04. - Vacancies in city council.

- **a.** Candidacy elsewhere. If the mayor or any councilperson shall announce his candidacy, or shall in fact become a candidate, in any general, special or primary election for any office of profit or trust under this the laws of Texas or the United States, other than the office he has held, at any time when the unexpired term of the office then held shall exceed one year and thirty (30) days, such announcement or such candidacy shall constitute an automatic resignation of the office then held.
- **b.** Procedure. When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of mayor or councilperson, council shall call a special election within one hundred twenty (120) days. At said election the vacant office or offices shall be filled.

c. Filing for office. Each candidate for public office must:

- 1. Have been a resident of the City of Hale Center for at least twelve (12) months immediately preceding filing for office, and be a qualified voter in the city.
 - 2. File sworn application with the city secretary in accordance with state law.

3. File for only one city office.

- d. Official ballots. Official ballots shall be prepared in accordance with state law.
- e. Canvassing elections. Election returns shall be canvassed in accordance with state law.

2.05. - Compensation.

Each councilperson and the mayor shall receive for his services a stipend in an amount determined by the council, not to exceed the sum of nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) per year for the mayor, and six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per year for each councilperson.

2.06. - First meeting of council after canvass.

On the first Monday next following the canvassing of an election, or as soon thereafter as practicable, city council shall meet at the usual place for holding meetings, and the newly elected members shall qualify and assume the duties of office.

2.07. - Meetings.

- **a.** Frequency. City council shall meet regularly at such times as may be prescribed by its rules but not less frequently than once each month. All meetings of council shall be open to the public except as allowed by state law; special meetings shall be called by the city manager upon request of the mayor or councilpersons.
 - b. Rules. City council shall determine its own rules and order of business.
 - c. Minutes. Minutes of all open meetings of the council shall be recorded as a public record.

State Law reference— Public meetings, V.T.C.A., Government Code § 551.001 et seq.

2.08. - Duties of mayor and mayor pro-tem.

The mayor shall preside at meetings of council and shall be entitled to vote to break a tie. The mayor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as are or may be conferred and imposed upon him by the ordinances of the city. He shall be recognized as the head of the city government for all ceremonial purposes. A mayor pro-tem shall be a council member and be elected by the council at the first meeting of council after canvassing the general and any run-off election, who shall serve for a one-year term or until his successor is appointed and has qualified. If a vacancy occurs in the office of mayor or in the case of his absence or disability, the mayor pro-tem shall act as mayor until a successor is elected and has qualified or until the mayor is again able to assume his duties of office.

2.09. - Powers of council.

All powers of the city and the determination of all matters of policy shall be vested in city council. Council shall execute the laws and administer the government of the city. Without limitation of the foregoing and among the other powers that may be exercised by council.

Candidate qualifications for Hale Center Type A General Law City (Local Gov't Code, Section 22.032): Mayor:

Residence -- 1 year in state prior to the filing deadline; 1 year in city prior to election day

Age -- 18

Must be a registered voter in territory elected from by the filing deadline*

Councilmember/Alderman:

Residence -- 1 year in state prior to filing deadline; 6 months in the city (or ward) prior to filing deadline (Texas Elec. Code, Section 141.001(a); Brown v. Patterson, 609 SW 2nd 287)

Age -- 18

Must be a registered voter in territory elected from by the filing deadline*

Please note the two forms you must submit when you file for office are:

1) Application for a Place on the Ballot. This form MUST be notarized. You may complete the form (without the signature) and I can notarize it for you when you file your application. A summary of the nepotism law, referenced on the application, is in the enclosed CTA Instruction Guide. I must review each application carefully to determine compliance with the Election Code requirements so please submit your application at your earliest convenience to allow time for this evaluation.

2) Form CTA – Appointment of a Campaign Treasurer by a Candidate. This form is to be completed by the candidate or the candidate's campaign treasurer (but signed only by the candidate). You may not accept any campaign contribution (funds or services) or make or authorize any campaign expenditure before this form has been filed. A candidate that does not intend to accept more than \$500 in political contributions or make more than \$500 in political expenditures may sign Page 2 of the form declaring "Modified Reporting" thereby eliminating the pre-elections reporting requirements. NOTE: If you select "Modified Reporting" and later exceed \$500 in political contributions or expenditures, you must file form C/OH - Campaign Finance Reports according to the regular filing schedule. Instructions on filing finance reports and the final report are in the enclosed Instruction Guide for this form.

Various forms and information are provided and are listed as follows:

- 2022 Election Calendar
- Application for a Place on the City of Hale Center General Election Ballot. This form can be filed in my office between January 19, 2022 and February 18, 2022. The application <u>must be signed in the presence of a notary</u>. I will notarize this for you if you have not already signed the form when you file your application.
- Code of Fair Campaign Practices Form (CFCP) and CFCP Act By signing this form you are signifying your intentions to run a fair, ethical and honest campaign. This form is voluntary; however, it is highly recommended that you sign it and file it at the same time you file your application for a place on the ballot and the Form CTA.
- Appointment of a Campaign Treasurer by a Candidate (Form CTA) The Form CTA should be filed with me at the same time as you file the application for a place on the ballot. It is prohibited to accept campaign contributions (funds or services) or make any expenditure before this form has been filed. Even if you do not intend to accept campaign contributions or make campaign expenditures, you must file this form. Please note: the statement regarding the nepotism law must be signed. A summary of the nepotism law is in the CTA Instruction Guide. The CTA Instruction Guide can be found http://www.ethics.state.tx.us/forms/CTA_ins.htm
- Candidate/Officeholder Campaign Finance Report (Form C/OH)
 Forms are to be completed by the candidate or the candidate's campaign treasurer (but signed only by the candidate).
 These forms are to be filed in my office on the dated specified in the filing schedule.
- Candidate/Officeholder Report of Unexpended Contributions (Form C/OH-UC)
- Political Advertising brochure

Hale Center City Council meet once a month on the second Tuesday. Special called meetings can also occur during the month as needed. All meetings are subject to the Texas Open Meetings Act and must be posted 72 hours in advance. It is your duty to become familiar with the laws applicable to campaigning for office. Regarding the filing of candidate/officeholder reports, the City Secretary is limited to accepting the filing of the various reports, and noting the date and time of filing of the reports.

MAY 7, 2022 HALE CENTER COUNCIL ELECTION IMPORTANT DATES AND CANDIDATE INFORMATION

ELECTION DAY & TERMS

The City of Hale Center Council is composed of six (6) members – the Mayor and 5 Councilmembers, elected by the qualified voters of the city to serve a two (2) year term. The 2022 Election Day is May 7, 2022.

DRAWING FOR PLACE ON THE BALLOT

The order in which the candidates' names are listed on the ballot is determined by a drawing conducted by the City Secretary. The drawing will be held on February 24th at 9:00 am in the City Secretary's office. You are invited, but not required, to attend the drawing.

CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORT DUE DATES

The first Campaign Finance Report is due April 7, 2022. The second Campaign Finance Report is due April 29, 2022. A Final Report may be filed at a point after the election in which you don't expect to accept or expend any more campaign funds. If a Final Report is not filed, a Semi-Annual Report will be due annually by January 17 and July 15. The Campaign Treasurer Appointment form has an option to choose modified reporting for the next election cycle. Modified reporting excuses an opposed candidate from filing reports 30 days and 8 days before an election. An opposed candidate is eligible for modified reporting only if the candidate does not intend to exceed either \$930 in contributions or \$930 in expenditures in connection with an election. All forms are filed with The City Secretary. The City Secretary is not required to send a candidate or officeholder a notice to file; has no responsibility for either assuring the candidates, officeholders, or political committees file the required documents; or the authority to penalize a filer for failure to submit a required filing. Filers should be aware, however, that there are penalties for violating the Campaign Finance Law. The City Secretary is not obligated to answer questions regarding Campaign Finance Law or ensure that forms are completed correctly. VOTING INFORMATION

The last day to register to vote in order to be eligible to vote in the May 7, 2022 Election is April 7, 2022. Early Voting is April 25, 2022 – May 3, 2022, voting hours will be from 8am to 5pm. Election day is May 7, 2022, voting hours are 7am to 7pm. Voting hours and locations will be posted on the city website.

CANVASSING THE ELECTION/OATH OF OFFICE

Canvassing of election returns, issuance of certificates of election, and administration of the oaths of office will take place during a scheduled city council meeting. The City Secretary will notify candidates of the date as soon as possible after it is scheduled.

PUBLIC INFORMATION

The Application for Place on the Ballot, and all Campaign Finance forms will be made available to the public upon request. The media often requests copies of these documents. Please note that the Application for Place on the Ballot has two optional fields; Email Address and Telephone Number. Although it is important for the city to have your contact information, you are not required to place this information on this form.

Since personal email addresses are protected under the Texas Public Information Act, an additional *Authorization to Release* form will need to be filed if you choose to complete the optional fields.

If you choose not to complete the optional fields, please provide this information to the City Secretary in an alternate method.

CODE OF FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play that every candidate and political committee in this state has a moral obligation to observe and uphold, in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their constitutional rights to a free and untrammeled choice and the will of the people may be fully and clearly expressed on the issues.

THEREFORE:

- (1) I will conduct the campaign openly and publicly and limit attacks on my opponent to legitimate challenges to my opponent's record and stated positions on issues.
- (2) I will not use or permit the use of character defamation, whispering campaigns, libel, slander, or scurrilous attacks on any candidate or the candidate's personal or family life.
- (3) I will not use or permit any appeal to negative prejudice based on race, sex, religion, or national origin.
- (4) I will not use campaign material of any sort that misrepresents, distorts, or otherwise falsifies the facts, nor will I use malicious or unfounded accusations that aim at creating or exploiting doubts, without justification, as to the personal integrity or patriotism of my opponent.
- (5) I will not undertake or condone any dishonest or unethical practice that tends to corrupt or undermine our system of free elections or that hampers or prevents the full and free expression of the will of the voters, including any activity aimed at intimidating voters or discouraging them from voting.
- (6) I will defend and uphold the right of every qualified voter to full and equal participation in the electoral process, and will not engage in any activity aimed at intimidating voters or discouraging them from voting.
- (7) I will immediately and publicly repudiate methods and tactics that may come from others that I have pledged not to use or condone. I shall take firm action against any subordinate who violates any provision of this code or the laws governing elections.
- I, the undersigned, candidate for election to public office in the State of Texas or campaign treasurer of a political committee, hereby voluntarily endorse, subscribe to, and solemnly pledge myself to conduct the campaign in accordance with the above principles and practices.

TEXAS ETHICS COMMISSION 2022 FILING SCHEDULE FOR REPORTS DUE IN CONNECTION WITH ELECTIONS HELD ON UNIFORM ELECTION DATES

This is a filing schedule for reports to be filed in connection with elections held on uniform election dates in May and November. Examples of elections held on uniform election dates are elections for school board positions and city offices. The uniform election dates in 2022 are May 7 and November 8.

Candidates and officeholders must file semiannual reports (due on January 18, 2022, and July 15, 2022). In addition, a candidate who has an opponent on the ballot in an election held on a uniform election date must file two pre-election reports (unless the candidate has elected modified reporting).

The campaign treasurer of a political committee that is involved in an election held on a uniform election date must also file pre-election reports (unless the committee is a general-purpose political committee that files monthly or a specific-purpose political committee that files on the modified reporting schedule). This schedule sets out the due dates for pre-election reports in connection with elections on uniform election dates. EXPLANATION OF THE FILING SCHEDULE CHART

<u>COLUMN I: REPORT DUE DATE</u> - This is the date by which the report must be filed. If the due date for a report falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the report is due on the next regular business day. This schedule shows the extended deadline where applicable. A report transmitted to the Texas Ethics Commission over the Internet is considered timely filed if it is transmitted *by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline*. For most filing deadlines, a report filed on paper is considered timely filed if it is deposited with the U.S. Post Office or a common or contract carrier properly addressed with postage and handling charges prepaid, or hand-delivered to the filing authority by the filing deadline. **Pre-Election Reports:** A report due 30 days before an election and a report due 8 days before an election must be *received* by the appropriate filing authority no later than the report due date to be considered timely filed.

<u>COLUMN II: TYPE OF REPORT (WHO FILES)</u> - This column gives the report type and explains which reporting form to use and which filers are required to file the report.

<u>COLUMN III: BEGINNING DATE OF PERIOD COVERED</u> - This column sets out the beginning date of the time period covered by the report. Use the latest one of the applicable dates. The "date of campaign treasurer appointment" is the beginning date only for the *first* report filed after filing a campaign treasurer appointment. For officeholders recently appointed to an elective office, the beginning date for the first report will be the date the officeholder took office, provided that he or she was not already filing as an officeholder or candidate at the time of the appointment. (*NOTE:* If you are ever confused about the beginning date for a required report, remember this rule: **There should never be gaps between reporting periods and, generally, there should not be overlaps.**)

<u>COLUMN IV: ENDING DATE OF PERIOD COVERED</u> - This column sets out the ending date of the time period covered by the report. The report must include reportable activity occurring on the ending date.

RESOLUTION

The Texas Ethics Commission unanimously condemns the use of misleading campaign communications regarding the activities of the Commission.

The use of the statements "a sworn complaint has been filed against Candidate A" or "the Texas Ethics Commission is investigating a complaint against Candidate A" are improper attempts to mislead the public. It is therefore the unanimous opinion of the bipartisan Texas Ethics Commission that the use of such language in campaign communications is an unfair practice and should be judged accordingly by voters.

By law, the Texas Ethics Commission investigates every sworn complaint, whether it has merit or not. Likewise, any citizen of the State of Texas has the right to file a sworn complaint, whether it has merit or not. The fact that a complaint has been filed or the Commission is investigating provides no meaningful information to the voting public. Anyone can file a complaint and the Commission must investigate the complaints it receives.

If violations of the statutes under the Commission's jurisdiction have occurred, the proper way to inform the public of these violations is to describe the facts of the violation or the actual findings of the Commission after the conclusion of an investigation.

The Commission directs that this resolution be prominently referenced on the Commission's website and that the resolution be sent to members of the legislature and state and county party chairs.

POLITICAL SIGNS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

PLEASE NOTE:

A sign that is greater than 36 square feet, taller than eight feet, is lighted or has moving elements, is located on a billboard or any other sign available for rent that generally carries commercial message or other non-political messages will require a permit.
