

Regular meeting of July 2, 2019, 8:30 am, all voting in favor and motions carried unless noted otherwise. Members present, John Plaggemeyer, Ron Friedt and Angela Carlson. Lee Meier, Road Supervisor and Elliot Finck, future Road Supervisor were also present. Friedt motioned to approve the June minutes as presented, seconded by Carlson.

Friedt moved to approve the bills as presented: General fund 30,391.31; Road & Bridge 12,761.33; E-911 114.84; County Agent 858.63; Weed Control 821.63; Sheriff's Dept. 42,148.23; 24/7 85.65.

Checks 10921-10928 were written for Social Welfare in the amount of \$385.69, motioned dyed for lack of a second, due to a question to be asked regarding Weed Control Officer payment.

The following reports were reviewed: Recorder Fees June-\$2,653.00.

David Crane, State's Attorney, was present to discuss with the commission what happens when a person wants to put a gate on his property that would be on a section line. He will come back later in the meeting.

Meier, Road Supervisor, gave his monthly report. Hunter Crist, new road employee started on Monday and Shane Zentner will start next week. He will contact Grant County regarding a contract regarding a shared county road.

Duaine Marxen, County Agent, came in to present his monthly report. He was asked the question on the Weed Control Officer payment, and this was explained. At this time the motion was made to approve payment of bills by Friedt, seconded by Carlson.

Rod Haberstroh and Dave Glasser, representing Steiner Township, met with the commissioners to discuss adding another mile to their already approved mile and a half road work they are going to have done. Carlson motioned to approve, seconded by Friedt.

Amber Hoheisel, Tax Director, submitted an abatement request for a mobile home that is no longer in the county. Friedt motioned to approve abatement, seconded by Carlson.

David Crane, State's Attorney, came back to join the meeting.

Brent Roll met with the board to make his current gates location legal. He submits his request for permission to build fence with two gates across a section line located along the line of SW section 8 and NE section 17. He mentioned that both gates are fifty feet in length and have unlocked levers that are easily opened and closed. As the commissioners find that the obstruction does not effectively deprive public of ability to travel on this section line, Carlson motioned to approve, seconded by Friedt.

Steven Rude, Land Surveyor with Advanced Engineering, stopped in to explain the surveying he had done where the New England DOT building is located to show the ownership in that area.

The commissioners reviewed the Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit for \$3,000,000 on behalf of Hettinger County submitted by the Bank of ND.

Friedt made the motion to appoint John Plaggemeyer to the county's Human Services Zone, seconded by Carlson.

Sheriff Warner gave a brief explanation of how the Hettinger County Sheriff's office will be promoting child safety. Sheriff Warner and the National Child's Safety Council will be reaching out to businesses for donations to promote child safety and this funding of donations will go towards child safety education.

The commissioners will meet on Thursday, July 25 to go over the county's budget.
