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### INTRODUCTION

This Title VI Implementation Plan is part of the Town of Middlebury Park Department's ("Park Department") regular and ongoing effort to proactively meet the compliance requirements established under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ("Title VI") and related anti-discrimination statutes and regulations. With this Implementation Plan, the Park Department seeks to provide direction and guidance for internal and external constituents regarding its Title VI program.

### PARK DEPARTMENT'S TITLE VI COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

The Park Department will maintain compliance with Title VI and related statutes and regulations. The Park Department confirms that its programs and activities will be conducted such that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap, nor low income be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination pursuant to and as provided by applicable state and federal law.

### SCOPE OF TITLE VI PROGRAM

The Park Department's Title VI program is the system of requirements of the Park Department developed to implement Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. References to Title VI requirements and regulations, however, are not limited to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Where appropriate and as required by other laws and regulations, this term also refers to the civil rights provisions of other federal statutes, regulations, and directives and Indiana state law to the extent that they prohibit discrimination on the grounds of religion, race, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability, national origin, or income status in programs receiving federal financial assistance of the type subject to Title VI itself. These statutes include Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and Subsequent Federal-Aid Highway Acts and related statutes.

### PARK DEPARTMENT'S TITLE VI NON-DISCRIMINATION NOTICE AND POLICY

The Park Department values each individual's civil rights and wishes to provide equal opportunity and equitable service for the citizens of Middlebury. As a recipient of federal funds, the Park Department conforms to Title VI and all related statutes, regulations, and directives. To the extent and as provided therein, no person shall be excluded from participation in, denied benefits of, or subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal

financial assistance by the Park Department on the grounds of race, color, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, national origin, religion, income status, or limited English proficiency. The Park Department further assures every effort will be made to ensure non-discrimination in all of its programs and activities, regardless of whether those programs and activities are federally funded.

It is the policy of the Park Department to comply, as applicable, with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970; the 1973 Federal Aid Highway Act; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987; the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, Executive Order 12898 (federal actions to address environmental justice in minority populations and low-income populations); and Executive Order 13166 (improving access to services for persons with limited English proficiency).

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Park Department hereby gives assurance that no qualified disabled person shall, solely by reason of disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination, including discrimination in employment, under any program or activity that receives or benefits from federal financial assistance.

The Park Department also assures that every effort will be made to prevent discrimination through the impacts of its programs, policies, and activities on minority and low-income populations. In addition, the Park Department will take reasonable steps to provide meaningful access to services for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). The Park Department will, where necessary and appropriate, revise, update and incorporate non-discrimination requirements into appropriate manuals, directives, and procedures.

Whenever the Park Department has a subrecipient for federal-aid funds, the Park Department will include Title VI language in all related written agreements.

The Park Department affirms its commitment to non-discrimination annually by reviewing, updating, and posting its Title VI Implementation Plan.

The Town Council of the Town of Middlebury, Indiana has established its Title VI nondiscrimination policy pursuant to Resolution No. 16-01 adopted January 18, 2016. The Town Council of the Town of Middlebury, Indiana has designated its Title VI coordinator and established its Title VI complaint procedure pursuant to Resolution 16-02 adopted January 18, 2016. See Exhibits A and B for Resolution No. 16-01 and Resolution No. 16-02 respectively.

### **ASSURANCES OF NONDISCRIMINATION**

Town of Middlebury, Indiana Title VI Assurances

The Town of Middlebury, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as the "Recipient") HEREBY AGREES THAT as a condition to receiving any Federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration, it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d-42 U.S.C. 2000d-4 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation-Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes - Implementation and Review Procedures (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) and other pertinent nondiscrimination authorities and directives, to the end that in accordance with the Act, Regulations, and other pertinent nondiscrimination authorities and directives, no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, sex (23 USC 324), age (42 USC 6101), disability/handicap (29 USC 790) and low income (Executive Order 12898) be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation, including the Federal Highway Administration, and HEREBY GIVES ASSURANCE THAT it will promptly take any measures necessary to effectuate this agreement. This assurance is required by Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations, subsection 21.7(a)(1) and Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations. section 200.9(a) (1) of the Regulations.

More specifically and without limiting the above general assurance, the Recipient hereby gives the following specific assurances with respect to its Federal-Aid Highway Program.

- 1. That the Recipient agrees that each "program" and each "facility" as defined in 49 CFR subsections 21.23(e) and (b) and 23 CFR 200.5(k) and (g) of the Regulations, will be (with regard to a "program") conducted, or will be (with regard to a "facility") operated in compliance with all requirements imposed by, or pursuant to, the Regulations.
- 2. That the Recipient shall insert the following notification in all solicitations for bids for work or material subject to the Regulations and made in connection with all Federal-Aid Highway Programs and, in adapted form in all proposals for negotiated agreements:

The Recipient in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C 2000d to 2000d-4 and Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation and Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes, issued pursuant to such Acts, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in any contract entered into pursuant

to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability/handicap, religion and/or low income in consideration for an award.

- 3. That the Recipient shall insert the clauses of Appendix A of this assurance in every contract subject to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 4. That the Recipient shall insert the clauses of Appendix B of this assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any deed from the United States effecting a transfer of real property, structures, or improvements thereon, or interest therein.
- 5. That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance to construct a facility, or part of a facility, the assurance shall extend to the entire facility and facilities operated in connection therewith.
- 6. That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance in the form, or for the acquisition of real property or an interest in real property, the assurance shall extend to rights to space on, over or under such property.
- 7. That the Recipient shall include the appropriate clauses set forth in Appendix C of this assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any future deeds, leases, permits, licenses, and similar agreements entered into by the Recipient with other parties: (a) for the subsequent transfer of real property acquired or improved under the Federal-Aid Highway Program; and (b) for the construction or use of or access to space on, over or under real property acquired, or improved under the Federal-Aid Highway Program.
- 8. That this assurance obligates the Recipient for the period during which Federal financial assistance is extended to the program, except where the Federal financial assistance is to provide, or is in the form of, personal property, or real property or interest therein or structures or improvements thereon, in which case the assurance obligates the Recipient or any transferee for the longer of the following periods: (a) the period during which the property is used for a purpose for which the Federal financial assistance is extended, or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits; or (b) the period during which the Recipient retains ownership or possession of the property.
- 9. The Recipient shall provide for such methods of administration for the program as are found by the Secretary of Transportation or the official to whom he delegates specific authority to give reasonable guarantee that it, other recipients, subgrantees, contractors, subcontractors, transferees, successors in interest, and other participants of Federal financial assistance under such program will comply with all requirements imposed or pursuant to the Act, the Regulations and this assurance.

10. The Recipient agrees that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under the Act, the Regulations, and this assurance.

THIS ASSURANCE is given in consideration of and for the pur pose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, contracts, property, discounts or other Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Recipient by the Department of Transportation under the Federal-Aid Highway Program and is binding on it, other recipients, subgrantees, contractors, subcontractors, transferees, successors in interest and other participants in the Federal-Aid Highway Program. The person or persons whose signatures appear below are authorized to sign this assurance on behalf of the Recipient.

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#### APPENDIX A

During the performance of this contract, the contractor, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "contractor") agrees as follows:

- (1) Compliance with Regulations: The contractor shall comply with the Regulation relative to nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation (hereinafter, "DOT") Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, and the Federal Highway Administration (hereinafter "FHWA") Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200 as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.
- (2) Nondiscrimination: The Contractor, with regard to the work performed by it during the contract, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, sex, age, and disability/handicap and low income in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The contractor shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by 49 CFR, section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the contract covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
- (3) Solicitations for Subcontractors, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the contractor of the contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, sex, age, and disability/handicap and low income.
- (4) Information and Reports: The contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) or the FHWA to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the contractor shall so certify to INDOT or the FHWA as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- (5) Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, INDOT shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the FHWA may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
  - (a.) withholding of payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies, and/or(b.) cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.
- (6) Incorporation of Provisions: The contractor shall include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (6) in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto.

The contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as INDOT or the FHWA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for non-compliance: Provided, however, that, in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the contractor may request the Indiana Department of Transportation to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the Indiana Department of Transportation and, in addition, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

#### APPENDIX B

A. The following clauses shall he included in any and all deeds effecting or recording the transfer of real property, structures or improvements thereon, or interest therein from the United States.

### (GRANTING CLAUSE)

NOW, THEREFORE, the Department of Transportation, as authorized by law, and upon the condition that the Town of Middlebury, Indiana will accept title to the lands and maintain the project constructed thereon, in accordance with Title 23, United states Code of Federal Regulations, the Regulations for the Administration of Federal-Aid Highway Programs and the policies and procedures prescribed by FHWA, also in accordance with and in compliance with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation and Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) pertaining to and effectuating the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252; 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4), does hereby remise, release, quitclaim and convey unto the Town of Middlebury, Indiana all the right, title and interest of the Department of Transportation in and to said lands described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof.

### (HABENDUM CLAUSE)

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said lands and interests therein unto the Town of Middlebury, Indiana and its successors forever, subject, however, to the covenants, conditions, restrictions and reservations herein contained as follows, which will remain in effect for the period during which the real property or structures are used for a purpose for which Federal financial assistance is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits and shall be binding on the Town of Middlebury, Indiana and its successors and assigns.

The Town of Middlebury, Indiana, in consideration of the conveyance of said lands and interests in lands, does hereby covenant and agree as a covenant running with the land for itself, its successors and assigns, that (1) no person shall on the grounds of religion, race, color, or national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, and disability/handicap, and low income be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination with regard to any facility located wholly or in part on over or under such lands hereby conveyed [,] [and)\* (2) that the Town of Middlebury, Indiana shall use the lands and interests in lands so conveyed, in compliance with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation-Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes – Implementation and Review Procedures, and as said Regulations may be amended [,] and (3) that in the event of breach of any of the above-mentioned nondiscrimination conditions, the Department of Transportation shall have a right to re-enter said lands and facilities on said land, and the above-described land and facilities shall thereon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of the Department of Transportation and its assigns as such interest existed prior to this instruction.\*

#### APPENDIX C

The following clauses shall be included in all deeds, licenses, leases, permits, or similar instruments entered into by the Town of Middlebury, Indiana ("Town") pursuant to the provisions of Assurance 7(a).

The (grantee, licensee, lessee, permitee, etc., as appropriate) for himself, his heirs, personal representatives, successors in interest, and assigns, as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree [in the case of deeds and leases add "as a covenant running with the land"] that in the event facilities are constructed, maintained, or otherwise operated on the said property described in this (deed, license, lease, permit, etc.) for a purpose for which a Department of Transportation program or activity is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits, the (grantee, licensee, lessee, permitee, etc.) shall maintain and operate such facilities and services in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes – Implementation and Review Procedures, and as said Regulations may be amended.

[Include in licenses, leases, permits, etc.]\*

That in the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, Town shall have the right to terminate the [license, lease, permit, etc.] and to re-enter and repossess said land and the facilities thereon, and hold the same as if said [licenses, lease, permit, etc.] had never been made or issued.

[Include in deed.]\*

That in the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, Town shall have the right to re-enter said lands and facilities thereon, and the above described lands and facilities shall thereupon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of Town and its assigns.

The following shall be included in all deeds, licenses, leases, permits, or similar agreements entered into by the Town of Middlebury, Indiana pursuant to the provisions of Assurance 7(b).

The (grantee, licensee, lessee, permitee, etc., as appropriate) for himself, his personal representatives, successors in interest, and assigns, as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree (in the case of deeds, and leases add "as a covenant running with the land") that (1) no person on the ground of race, color. or national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap, and low income shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or he otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities, (2) that in the construction of any improvements on, over or under such land and the furnishing of services thereon, no person on the ground of, race, color, or national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap and low income, shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination, (3) that the (grantee, licensee, lessee, permitee, etc.) shall use the premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations. Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary. Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation-Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964), Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200, Title VI Program and Related Statutes – Implementation and Review Procedures, and as said Regulations may be amended.

[Include in licenses, leases, permits, etc.]\*

That in the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, Town shall have the right to terminate the [license, lease, permit, etc.] and to re-enter and repossess said land and the facilities thereon, and hold the same as if said [license, lease, permit, etc.] had never been made or issued.

[Include in deeds]\*

That in the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, Town shall have the right to re-enter said land and facilities thereon, and the above described lands and facilities shall thereupon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of Town and its assigns.

### TITLE VI COMPLAINT POLICY AND LOG

Pursuant to Resolution 16-02, the Park Department has prepared a Complaint Procedure and Complaint Log. A copy of the Complaint Procedure and Log are contained in Exhibit C.

### TITLE VI TRAINING

The Town of Middlebury's Title VI and ADA Coordinator for the Park Department will attend Title VI training provided by the Indiana Department of Transportation. Attendance will occur within the next six (6) months. Utilizing training materials similar to those developed by the Indiana Department of Transportation, the Town of Middlebury's Title VI and ADA Coordinator will train the staff of the Park Department on the Title VI requirements and work toward integration of such requirements into the operations of the Park Department. Initial training of staff on Title VI requirements is anticipated to be completed prior to December 31, 2016. Training records will be retained demonstrating attendance and training dates and documenting the agendas and training materials.

### PARK DEPARTMENT PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

Program areas and activities of the Park Department will be reviewed and analyzed for compliance with the Title VI non-discrimination requirements including environmental justice and limited English proficiency. Data will be collected, reviewed, and analyzed when applicable with respect to race, color, gender, and national origin for right-of-way relocatees and others adversely affected by Park Department projects; attendees of public hearings, meetings, and open houses; and communities impacted by construction projects to ensure non-discrimination. It is anticipated that the review of program areas and activities and the establishment of processes to collect such data will be established by the Park Department within the next six (6) months. Maps of environmental justice and limited English proficient populations based upon the most recent census data will be used to minimize and mitigate adverse effects upon such populations and ensure that no disproportionate impacts occur. Most recent maps for such populations are attached hereto as Exhibit D.

### MONITORING SUBRECIPIENTS OF FEDERAL FUNDS

Although not expected to occur, to the extent the Park Department has any subrecipients of federal funds, pre- and post-award subrecipient monitoring will occur. The Park Department will develop and implement such monitoring policies to ensure subrecipients who receive federal funds are compliant and remain compliant with Title VI. It is anticipated that such subrecipient monitoring policies will be completed prior to entering any subrecipient agreements.

### COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

This Implementation Plan will be posted on the website of the Town of Middlebury for the Park Department. Public comment on the Implementation Plan will be solicited for recommendations and possible improvements. The Park Department encourages and will continue to encourage public involvement and access to decision-making in the planning and development of Park Department transportation and other Park Department projects to include minority and low-income communities and populations who are not proficient in English.

### INTERNAL COMPLIANCE REVIEWS AND MONITORING

The Town of Middlebury Title VI and ADA Coordinator will periodically review this Implementation Plan and update it annually. Statistical data collected on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, and age for participants in and beneficiaries of the Park Department's programs and activities will be reviewed and analyzed for non-discrimination compliance. Improvements for this Implementation Plan may be derived from the results of such analysis on the statistical data collected. The Town of Middlebury Title VI and ADA Coordinator will work with administration of the Park Department and other representatives of Town of Middlebury government as necessary to make adjustments to Park Department programs and activities to reduce discriminatory impacts and document its efforts.

### **RESOLUTION 16-01**

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 16-01**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIDDLEBURY, INDIANA ESTABLISHING A TITLE VI NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

WHEREAS a condition of Federal financial assistance is that a recipient must comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the provisions of the applicable Code of Federal Regulations and Executive Orders related thereto;

WHEREAS Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, applicable Code of Federal Regulations, and Executive Orders related thereto provide that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap, nor low income, be excluded from participating in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which a recipient receives Federal financial assistance;

WHEREAS the Town of Middlebury, Indiana has been and may in the future be a recipient of Federal financial assistance for which these nondiscrimination provisions would be applicable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Middlebury, Indiana hereby establishes this policy and confirms that the programs and activities of its departments to which federal financial assistance is extended will be conducted such that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap, nor low income, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination pursuant to and as provided by applicable State and Federal law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Middlebury, Indiana will from time to time name a Title VI Coordinator to assist in the implementation of this Nondiscrimination Policy and to assist in addressing any Title VI complaints which will be processed and administered in accordance with the same procedures as those established for the Town of Middlebury's ADA compliance program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Nondiscrimination Policy shall be interpreted so as to be consistent with and in compliance with the requirements of applicable State and Federal law; that this Nondiscrimination Policy shall be understood and acknowledged to be a policy

which prohibits discrimination but does not otherwise grant nor afford any special advantages, privileges, or other benefits to any person in the United States; and that this Nondiscrimination Policy does not exceed the requirements of nor otherwise place any burden upon the Town of Middlebury, Indiana beyond the requirements of applicable State and Federal law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Town Council of the Town of Middlebury, Indiana is authorized to execute the Town of Middlebury, Indiana Title VI Assurances as required by applicable State and Federal law.

### COMPLAINT PROCEDURE, COMPLAINT FORM, AND LOG

### Town of Middlebury Complaint Procedure under Title VI

This Complaint Procedure is established to meet the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ("Title VI). It may be used by anyone who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability/handicap, religion, low income status, limited English proficiency, or other protected classification in the provision of services, activities, programs, or benefits under any program or activity for which the Town of Middlebury received Federal financial assistance. The Town's Employee Handbook governs employment-related complaints of disability discrimination.

The complaint should be in writing and contain information about the alleged discrimination such as name, address, phone number of complainant and location, date, and description of the problem. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interviews, will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request.

The complaint should be submitted by the grievant and/or his/her designee as soon as possible but no later than 30 calendar days after the alleged violation to:

Within 15 calendar days after receipt of the complaint, the Town Manager or the appropriate designee will meet with the complainant to discuss the complaint and the possible resolutions. Within 15 calendar days of the meeting, the Town Manager or the appropriate designee will respond in writing, and where appropriate, in a format accessible to the complainant, such as large print, Braille, or audio tape. The response will explain the position of the Town of Middlebury and offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.

If the response by the Town does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant and/or his/her designee may appeal the decision within 15 calendar days after receipt of the response to the Middlebury Town Council.

Within 15 calendar days after receipt of the appeal, the Town Council or the Council's designee will meet with the complainant to discuss the complaint and possible resolutions. Within 15 calendar days after the meeting, the Town Council will respond in writing, and, where appropriate, in a format accessible to the complainant, with a final resolution of the complaint.

All written complaints received by the Town Manager, appeals to the Town Council, and responses will be retained by the Town of Middlebury for at least three years.

### ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AND LEP POPULATION MAPS












