

## MISCELLANEOUS ORDINANCES

### **Loitering/Peeping:**

No person shall loiter unnecessarily in or about any private dwelling, or peep into the windows of any private dwelling to the discomfort or alarm of the persons therein, the neighbors, or any person going to and from the same. Whoever violates this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed twenty dollars (\$20.00).

(# 1-passed Town Meeting March 1, 1965)

### **Littering, etc.:**

It shall be unlawful to dump rubbish, trash, or garbage into the water of or along the shore of the Thoroughfare within the Village Limits, or within one hundred feet (100) of any public road within the Town. A fine of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be imposed for violation of this ordinance.

(# 3-passed Town Meeting March 1, 1965)

### **Firearms:**

It shall be unlawful for anyone to carry or to have in his or her possession a loaded firearm on any street or public place, or with fifty (50) yards of the shore excepting on his or her private property within the Village Limits, other than a law officer in discharge of his duties, or a person participating in Memorial Service who may use blank cartridges. Exception to this shall be a lawful permit to carry a concealed weapon.

(# 6-Passed Town Meeting March 1, 1965)

### **Parking Lot Use Regulations Amendment:**

No fishing gear, lobster traps, crates or scallop related gear shall be stored in the Town parking lot, on the seawall or the Town float for more than 24 hours. After that time the Selectmen or Town Constable will give 24-hours notice before having such gear removed at the owner's expense.

(Passed Town Meeting March 11, 2000)

### **Pulpit Harbor Town Landing Use Regulations**

The town owned beach area at Pulpit Harbor shall be kept free of all litter, lobster traps, crates, cars, boat cradles, floats, and stored boats from June 1 – October 1 each year. After June 1 the Selectmen will have the right to dispose of such material at their discretion.

(Passed Town Meeting March 1, 1982)

### **Unauthorized Sleeping Prohibited on Public Property**

Sleeping in any motor vehicle (as defined in Title 29, Section –G) or trailer (as defined in Title 29, Section 7) which is parked, stopped, or standing on any public road or public property shall be prohibited between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. within the Town of North Haven.

Exceptions to this ordinance would be camping permits issued by the Selectmen for use at Mullen's Head Park.

Anyone found in violation of this ordinance will be subject to a fine of \$50 for each violation, to be recovered for the use of the Town.

Each day such a violation occurs shall be considered a separate offense.
