**V - Veteran (3)**

There are **23** known burials in this cemetery.

The first known burial was Hannah Emery in 1834 and the last was Faith Emery Hurd in 1953.

**V** Dea. John **Emery**, died Jan. 17, 1873, aged 85 y's, 5 m's, & 6 d's.  
(War of 1812)

Hannah. (Post) wife of John **Emery**. died May 7, 1834. Aged 38 years  
(first wife, m. 1814)

Margaret C. (Crie) **Emery**, wife of DEA John Emery, formerly wife of  
Richard Bartlett, Died Dec.14, 1888, aged 86 y's, 1 mo, & 8 d's.  
(second wife, m. 1834)

Children of John Emery numbered below in birth order according to  
Eaton's History Vol. II, p. 212:

1. Eliza H. (Emery) wife of Benj. F. **Webster** Died March 26, 1861, AE.  
45 y's, 3 m's, & 29 d's.

Benj. (Benjamin) F. **Webster** Born Feb. 9, 1809 Died Jan. 11, 1891 AE.  
81 y's, 11 m's, 2d's.

Mellie G. Hooper, son of Horatio B. & Emma F. (Webster) **Hooper**, Died  
Dec. 16, 1871, AE 7 y's, 9 m's, & 27 d's (Melvin's mother Emma was the  
daughter of Eliza Emery and Benj. Webster. Emma and Horatio are buried  
in NJ)

7. Mary S. (Emery) wife of Nathan P. **Webster** Died Dec. 14, 1852, Aged  
21

8. Alvin S., son of John and Hannah (Post) **Emery**, Died May 20, 1849,  
AE. 16 yrs, 2 m's & 19 days

**V** 11. Richard B. **Emery** died at Brooks Station, Va. Nov. 26, 1862, AE.  
25 yrs, 1 mo, & 13 d'ys. (Civil War Veteran "2nd ME Battery" (Eaton's  
Vol II, p. 212)). Eaton's Vol I, p. 465 states he enlisted in the 2d  
Mounted Battery of Maine Volunteers and "died, greatly lamented". He

has a cenotaph (R. B. Emery ME (#5020)) at Fredericksburg National Cemetery in Virginia)

V 13. Samuel A. **Emery**, died July 3, 1866, AE. 24 yrs. 11 mos. & 15 d'ys. (From his death notice in the Rockland Gazette and Eaton's History he was a mariner. His grand niece Phyllis Additon Russell wrote in October of 1972 that he was "sea captain in the Civil War. Died at home of fever". No other records of his participation in the war have been found.)

Sons of John and Margaret C. Emery.

+Robert L. **Emery**, 1880-1949 M. D. (This is a separate stone from the monument with his parents and siblings. Note death year is INCORRECT)  
Marjorie W. (His wife, no dates, FAG states she is NOT buried here)

Margaret Crie, dau. of Harvey F. and (Cynthia) Alice E. (Emery)

**Additon**, Went home Nov. 4, 1901, AE. 4 y's 2 m's & 24 d's

**FRANK (Franklin Marlborough Packard**, 1868-1938, husband of Clara Emery. Flush stone with no information, by itself in the center of the cemetery. Dowsing by J. Ferrannini indicated that an adult male is buried here. There is indeed a grave-sized depression in the land. See FaG record for attachments)

\*Emery **Packard** 1909-1909, son of Frank & Clara. Burial based on notes from MRHS and 1972 transcription.

Likely buried here:

\*Annie L. Hutchinson **Emery** (1868-1925) wife of Sidney P. Emery. LHC added to FaG March 2022.

Bradford Alden Emery, Apr. 18, 1840 - Aug 10, 1919 (m. 1864)

Elizabeth Octavia Maddocks Emery, Aug 19, 1839 - Aug 7, 1900 (death year on monument is incorrect)

Their children:

Sidney Perham, 21 Apr 1866 - 12 Mar 1947 (m. Annie Hutchins in 1893, no children)

Susan Ellen, 19 Jul 1868 - 1 Nov 1924 (never married, no children)

Cynthia Alice, 10 Mar 1870- 14 Dec 1934, (m. Harvey Fairfield **Additon**, had 5 daughters)

Clara Hope, 17 Apr 1872 - 24 May 1952)(m. Franklin Marlborough **Packard**, had only one son, Emery, who died at the age of one)

Kathryne Charity, 19 Jun 1873 - 23 Aug 1938 (never married, no children)

Faith Rochester, 26 April 1875 - 3 Nov 1953 (m. Albert E. J. **Hurd** (27 years her senior) in 1919. No children)

+Robert Lovett, 7 Jun 1880- 19 Mar 1948 (m. and div. 2x., 1st Emma Adelaide Gibson, 2nd Marjorie Whittlesey. One adopted son.)

There are **no** individual headstones for Sidney, Cynthia, Kathryn, or Faith. Phyllis Hope Additon Russell, daughter of Cynthia, noted in October of 1972 during the Nathan Hale transcription project:

"Sidney, Susie, Kathryn and Robert are buried near parent's stone. Cynthia Alice and Clara Hope: ashes scattered in No. Edgecomb, Me. on Speed & Russell adjoining properties. Faith Rochester: ashes scattered in Fenway (Boston) near her C. S. (Christian Science) "Mother Church".
