# Sch. County Firefighters' Convention 2023 & Parade

The Liberty Fire Company No. 4 of Schuylkill Haven and the Good Will Hose of Cressona will co-host the 69th Schuylkill County Volunteer Firefighters' Association (SCVFA) Convention August 20 thru 26.

Event highlights include the annual SCVFA Memorial Service, Delegates Night, a High Stakes Super Bingo, and a Mug Night with live entertainment. As always, convention week will climax with a gigantic parade on Sat., August 26.

#### Parade particulars

Saturday's parade entries – fire trucks, apparatus, miscellaneous vehicles, bands, and marching groups – will stage in the Hill Farm section of Schuylkill Haven, near the First United Methodist Church on Saylor Street. The parade is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. traveling through the streets of Cressona and ending at Hydro. This will be the first time the SCVFA convention parade has been in Cressona since 1985.



Postal delays not a valid excuse

In recent months, the Borough has received numerous calls and comments from utility customers concerned that they had not received their bill(s). The Borough wants to assure residents that bills are delivered to the postal service on a normal monthly schedule; but, delays from the post office

Customers are encouraged to pay attention to their regular billing cycle and look for bills accordingly. Payment due dates remain the same despite postal delays.

Bills should be received by the 10th of each month, with payment due by the 20th. If customers have not received a bill, they are encouraged to view their account balance on the Borough's website: www.schuylkillhaven. org/ by clicking the box titled "Pay Bill On-line" and setting up an account, or logging into their online account if one is already set up. If you are a first-time user, you will need

your account number to complete registration.

Once the account has loaded, the amount due will be visible and the customer can proceed to payment, if desired. When paying by credit card, there is a \$4.25 service charge.

If customers choose to pay by cash or check without a payment stub, they should note the account number and property address on the check or with the cash payment. A night deposit box is at the drivethru to the rear of the Borough Administrative Office. Payments can be made in-person or at the drive-thru during normal business hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.



#### Sidewalk areas


Sidewalks must be maintained and kept in good repair, void of weeds and grass, swept and clean of

debris, and washed down occasionally.

Curbing must also be kept in good repair, void of all grass and weeds out to where the curbing and street intersect.

#### Trash & storage

Remember to remove all trash and recycling containers from street view as



Prior to pickup day, trash/rubbish must be kept in conventional, well-maintained trash containers with tight sealing lids. Trash bags are acceptable, but must be stored in a way that does not encourage or allow animals to rip them open.

Recyclables may not comingle with any household trash/rubbish, confined within the container, and not allowed to spill out or be blown away.

#### Yard areas

Lawns must be kept mowed to a height of 6" or less and trimmed around buildings, fences, play equipment, and the like.

General property areas should be maintained to ensure the attractiveness of the neighborhood.



#### Power outages & electric upgrades

It's summertime and 'tis the season for thunderstorms. Lightning strikes and wind damage can fell trees or cause tree limbs to hit power lines. In some cases, those power lines may lay energized, presenting very dangerous conditions. If you see downed wires during or after a thunderstorm, DO NOT go near them. Call Borough Hall at (570) 385-2841 during normal business hours or call the Schuylkill County 911 Center. The center will notify the needed responders.

When customers are doing any major electrical upgrades to their home, we ask that you give the Borough a load count for what you're adding. With customers switching to electric heat and adding car chargers to homes, some system upgrades may be necessary.

We are able to make changes to our lines and transformers if we know what loads are anticipated.

#### Water Distribution / Wastewater Collection

Summertime, yay! Summer is the time your lawns and gardens are green and growing, school is out, young adults are looking for part time jobs, vacations are being planned, or just choose to do nothing.

Summertime is also a chance to clean up from winter's stronghold, fill swimming pools, water lawns and gardens, and wash the car. These are just a few things that we do every year, but give little thought to the one resource that makes it all possible – water. Please, use your water wisely.

Schuylkill Haven has been in the water business since 1881 when the Schuylkill Haven Water & Gas Co. was formed. Around 1890 the Borough purchased the Panther Valley Reservoir and laid new pipes into Schuylkill Haven and Cressona so they could provide the residents with fresh, clean water along with meeting the demands of a growing area. As it was back in the day, to keep water and sewer systems running 24/7/365 with little interruption of service, it costs a lot of money.

This summer the Water Deptartment will replace 800 feet of water main on Market Street made necessary due to repeated main breaks on that line. The road will be closed to traffic while this construction is being done.



#### Water Treatment Plant

The next time you get your Pennsylvania Vehicle Registration renewal in the mail, read the attachment. Section 3709 of the state Vehicle Code provides for a fine of up to \$300 for "... dropping, throwing or depositing any waste paper, sweepings, ashes, household waste, glass, metal, refuse or rubbish upon any highway, public or private property without consent of the owner or onto the waterways from a vehicle."

When I submitted my first newsletter article, I wrote about the Tumbling Run water treatment plant, the reservoirs, and how we should protect them and watch for people littering.

With the coming of spring and all that the outdoors has to offer, I'd like to expand that notion to include the Schuylkill River watershed. Whatever we do here could affect the Schuylkill River all the way down stream to Philadelphia, the lower Delaware River, and into the Delaware Bay.

The Borough website will soon post the 2022 Consumer Confidence Report with annual test results on the borough's drinking water.

We will be showcasing our new equipment, process control instrumentation, and sharing our results of how the new equipment performs to help reduce plant costs.

We're very excited to be hosting this event for it is a great way to show how far we have come in the last two years. The WWTP staff has taken on the task of repainting the entire plant; but, our outside painting will not be completed before the meeting. It really makes our plant look more modern despite being built in the 1950s.

All three employees working at the wastewater plant are only in our 30s, so we have a long time of working here yet. We want this facility to be the best it can be – a place people won't cringe when driving by. Each week we are taking on a new project to improve our process and facility. Hopefully our Borough's residents will soon be able to see the changes and, even better yet, smell the improvements in the air!
