

No reserved parking

We all know the frustration of having to spend hours shoveling out a vehicle in order to get to work. That frustration skyrockets when returning home to find another vehicle occupying that parking space. Unfortunately, the street is open to the public and you cannot reserve the space you worked so hard to shovel out.

Borough Tax Collector

One of the most asked questions is "Why do I pay two Per Capita tax bills?" You do receive two Per Capita bills - one on your Borough/County billing and one from the School District.

The Borough/County bill is mailed March 1. The amount has a discount period until the end of April; full price from May through June; and a penalty period from July to the end of the year. If unpaid, it will then be sent to collections as of the new year.

The School District Per Capita bill is mailed July 1. This bill comes from Berkheimer and has a discount period and other payment periods listed on it.

Office hours are by appointment

I'm usually in the office three times a week to check mail and messages. Simply call to arrange an appointment. The office is 570-385-1313 or you can also call 570-990-6821.

Because all Borough/County taxes are due by the end of the calendar year in my office, you may pay them in person on December 27, 28, & 29 from noon to 3 p.m. at my office located in the Schuylkill Haven Recreation / Senior Center, 340 Haven Street. As always, you can mail your Borough/County tax payments; but, please make sure your envelope is postmarked by December 31, 2023.

Please pay bills by check or money order only. If a receipt is requested, include a self-addressed and stamped envelope with your mailed-in payment.

Per Capita Tax updates need to be provided to the tax collector. If you know of someone that's moved out of town, is recently deceased, or in a nursing home, contact the tax office right away so they can be removed from the tax rolls.

The Borough/County bill must be paid in full when due. No installment payments are permitted.

Wastewater Plant upgrade is complete

Schuylkill Haven Municipal Authority's Wastewa-

ter Treatment Plant has been in operation since 1950 with upgrades com-

pleted in 1975, 1991, 1994 and, most recently, earlier this year 2023. The facility serves approximately 2,950 customers located in Schuylkill Haven Borough, North

Manheim Township, Wayne Township, South Manheim Township, and receives wastewater from other approved locations.

The most recent \$6 million upgrade project was designed to improve energy efficiency in its operations, offer system automation, replace aged equipment that could no longer be repaired, and install a computerized system for monitoring and control of the new and existing equipment within the process.

Tropical Storm Ida

Tropical Storm Ida impacted many communities on September 1, 2021, including Schuylkill Haven. Borough employees, residents and our fire departments won't forget the six inches of hard rain that fell that afternoon. Since then, the borough has worked with

the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to address and repair one area in the Borough that was severely impacted from the tropical storm.

Storm drains and stormwater pipes were installed on West Union Street from Tennis Avenue to St. Charles Street to mitigate water that caused severe flooding that day. While this effort took more than two years to

complete, this is a benefit to residents by avoiding a similar flooding event.



Earlier in 2023, an automobile accident damaged the Borough warehouse located on Haven Street. After careful consideration how best to repair the aging building, the Borough recognized it could also reduce the heat loss that escapes from it.

Employees installed smaller, energy-efficient windows and siding where the large painted windows once were, offering more natural light and significantly improving energy loss. Foam insulation was also applied along the ceiling to reduce the energy/heat loss in the area.

Do's, Don'ts & Tips for Maintaining Your Space

Fall spruce-ups; get ready for winter

Winter is just around the corner. Some of us have already had a glint of frost on our windshields. As always, we'll get a short window of opportunity of warmer weather allowing for one final last minute spruce up.

Here are a few chores that should be taken care of before old man winter applies his blanket of white:

- Cut grass one last time.
- Rake up all leaf litter and debris.
- Trim all shrubbery and tree limbs around buildings, sidewalk, and street areas.
- Organize trash storage areas; neatly stack firewood/lumber and other items that will be stored outside.
- Clean and store patio furniture, umbrellas, and children's summer toys.
- Touch up paint on trim, railings, and decks. Use a wire brush to remove flaking paint; prime bare wood first.
- Check caulk around windows and doors. Follow manufacturer's recommendations to re-caulk if needed.
- Inspect external doors and garage doors. Do they close tightly? Install weatherstripping, door thresholds if needed.

- Drain and store garden hoses. Install insulating covers on exterior spigots. If installed, have sprinkler systems blown free of water.
- Have chimneys and flues inspected and cleaned if necessary.

Leaf litter, safety and nuisances

The fall foliage is doing just that ... falling! The Borough's Property Maintenance Code requires residents to keep leaf litter cleaned up.



Allowing leaves and leaf debris to accumulate on public sidewalk areas, public streets or alleys is a violation of the Property Maintenance Code and carries fines and penalties of \$300 to \$1000 per violation.

Your mind in the gutter? Take control of your gutters and downspouts and be sure all dead leaves, debris and pine needles are removed, allowing the gutters to work properly during the cold, wet months ahead.

pick up. Loose yard waste will not be collected.

The Borough uses a call system to contact residents in the event of an emergency such as power outages, "water boil" advisories, snow removal, and so on. This is done with the phone number you have registered with the Borough Office. If you have not registered or are unsure if you are, you can do so on the Borough website at *schuylkillhaven.org* or by calling the Borough Office at 570-385-2841. This is a great tool to reach you with vital information.

With snow falling soon, please help us by not depositing snow in the street or gutters and do not pile snow at intersections that could cause visibility problems for motorists. Do clear storm drains and fire hydrants near your property. This will reduce hazardous conditions when snow melts and refreezes, and will help firefighters access hydrants in case of an emergency. When driving, keep a safe distance when following any equipment plowing or removing snow. We sometimes lose traction, just as you do, during a storm, and may need to make quick maneuvers to gain control.

The upcoming winter season presents some interesting challenges for the Borough's Water Department – the dreaded water leaks in the middle of the night (usually during the coldest period of weather); the calls from frantic customers that their water pipes or water meters are frozen; they have no water or they have a leak from burst pipes requiring their water service to be shut off as soon as possible.

Please be patient. After normal work hours, it does take time for us to respond. We assemble a crew, dress appropriately for the weather conditions, respond from our home to the maintenance garage to pick up our vehicles, and respond to your address to assist you. This takes time.

As a property owner or occupant, take some time before winter weather arrives to assist us.

- (1) Make sure your home has a street/unit address mounted on the front of your home or mailbox. Turn your porch light on after calling for assistance.
- (2) Know ahead of time the approximate location of your water curb box which is over your water shut off valve. This is a small 4"-to-5" round metal lid marked WATER with a brass nut in it. If you do not know its location or you cannot find it, let us know and we can locate it for you. Perhaps during warmer weather?
- (3) Check your home for drafts of cold air in the area of your water meter and where your water service line enters your home. Insulate or plug these drafts to prevent freeze-ups. A roll of insulation costs far less than damaged water meters or your pipes.
- (4) Keep a path cleared of the snow or ice for our meter reader from your street or sidewalk to your electric meter and your outside water meter reading device. If we cannot read your meters, we must estimate your usage.
- (5) If you live near a fire hydrant, please shovel the snow away and keep it clear for our fire department responders.

By assisting us in these small ways, we will all survive the winter blues and keep your utility services working. Stay warm, stay safe. Have a very happy and healthy New Year!

So, if you do switch just let us know about it and we can make adjustments in the field to keep your power on.

When you see a street light out or blinking on and off, you can call the Borough Office to report the problem. If you could, please get a pole number and the closest address to the location. A call back number would also help if we need more information to locate the problem. This information will help us find the light and make repairs to keep everything working properly.

In nearly every issue of *Haven Highlights*, included are items that should not go down your drains nor flushed from your toilets ... in particular, the so-called "flushable" wipes.

Another "no-no" that is often failed to mention is prescription drugs. Flushing old medicines down the toilet has long been a common practice. Today's medicines are way more diverse than ever, and some should not be flushed. Typically, each bottle will be marked whether or not it should be flushed down the toilet.

A much safer way to dispose of old medications is to give them to a "Drug Take-Back" location. Here in Schuylkill Haven, we are fortunate enough to have one of these at the front entrance lobby of the Police Station, located at 250 Parkway.

So, why not just flush any medication down the toilet? Out of sight, out of mind, right? Well, not exactly. Most wastewater treatment plants are not



equipped to treat pharmaceuticals. This could lead to those medications being discharged into our receiving streams, affecting water quality for communities and cities that draw their drinking water from those streams. There are many articles online about how this can affect wildlife and humans.

To keep things simple when it comes to flushing a toilet, remember the "3 Ps" – poo, pee, and toilet paper. Anything else can cost you money as a homeowner or a tenant as it can cause issues with your sewer lines of your home.
