## Now Serving 16 Counties

### Bainbridge Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped

The Bainbridge Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped now serves sixteen counties in Southwest Georgia. In addition to Decatur, Miller, and Seminole counties, they serve Baker, Brooks, Calhoun, Clay, Colquitt, Early, Grady, Mitchell, Quitman, Randolph, Terrell, Thomas, and Webster counties. Previously serving only ten counties, the Bainbridge Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped serves six additional counties (Calhoun, Clay, Quitman, Randolph, Terrell, and Webster) due to the closing of the Albany Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped on June 30, 2009.

Books and magazines on

cassette tapes are available from the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped are available for those who cannot hold, handle, or see well enough to read printed materials printed by conventional methods due to a temporary or permanent handicap.

The Bainbridge Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped also has an array of equipment available to use, including amplifiers, a Kurzweil Reading Edge Machine, a Braille machine, and a Perkins Brailier.

# H1N1 Flu and You

## Important Information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

The H1N1 flu is becoming a hot topic around our region and around our nation. H1N1 Flu, also referred to as the “swine flu”, is a new influenza virus causing illness in people. This new virus was first detected in the United States in April. This virus is transmitted from person-to-person.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the symptoms of the H1N1 virus include fever, coughing, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills, fatigue, diarrhea, and vomiting. Severe illnesses and death has occurred as a result of illness associated with this virus.

If you or someone you know is sick with a flu-like illness, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that people stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone, except to get medical care or for other necessities.
