



- Established by Peaine and St James Townships –
   October
- Nearly Monthly Meetings for the last year



- Island is falling behind service available inhome communities of our visitors and our near-shore neighbors
  - 50Mbps is the most envisioned by providers for service to all island locations
  - Gigabit speeds in Charlevoix, Petoskey and Traverse City are coming or available today
- Visitors leave (or don't come) for lack of broadband
- Live anywhere knowledge workers can't consider the island
- Lost opportunities to improve education and healthcare for lack of high-quality video conferencing
- Uncompetitive costs: \$80 or more a month for 10 Mbps (or less service) for many island locations vs. community projects with gigabit service for the same price

## Bandwidth Needs

### Recommended home-use speeds for *today*...

- Check email and browse the web: 1-5 Mbps minimum
- Stream HD content (e.g., Netflix): 15-25 Mbps minimum
- Stream 4K content and play competitive online games: 40-100 Mbps minimum
- Stream 4K content, play online games, and download very large files: 200+ Mbps minimum

#### Recommended business-use speeds for *today...*

- VOIP telephone: 1 Mbps symmetric
- Video conference: 6 Mbps symmetric
- Telecommuting: 5-25 Mbps symmetric
- Off-site data backup: 25-50 Mbps symmetric (home office small business)
- Large size/volume file transfer: 100 Mbps+

# Path to a Solution

Short-term (summer 2020 or sooner)

Interim Pools of Service at Key Locations

Middle-term (2 to 3 years)

Educational Access Network (20x5 for \$30)

Great Lakes Energy (50x10 for \$80)


Long-term (2 to 5 years)

Gigabit-capable connectivity for the island


- \$35,000 to \$40,000 project to create interim "pools" of 200
   Mbps symmetric service (up and down) at key island locations
- Available for use in workspace at Library, Community Center,
   Museums and Township Buildings
- Also used for township and county business at connected locations (halls, county building, transfer station, governmental center, St. James fire hall, Health Center) School, Municipal Docks (visitors)
- This is designed to address immediate service issues not a long-term solution
- Core equipment could be re-used for future projects
- Added service will relieve summer pressure on TDS service
- Possible use for consolidated VoIP telephone services for consortium members


# Interim Pools of Service: Short-term solution overview



## Mainland connection

- Microwave to Engadine in the UP where Merit and other fiber are available
- Tower space from NMU for \$300/month






## On-island distribution

- Low cost, easy to install microwave systems
- High speed link from Font Lake tower to hub at governmental center or BICS
- Distributed from hub using point to multi-point or point to point systems

## What Others are Doing — Lyndon Township

#### COMMUNITY FINANCED FIBER TO THE HOME

- Township issued millage-backed bonds to finance construction of fiber broadband system to service all businesses and homes in the community.
- Average homeowner cost for millage is \$22 month
- Service costs: \$35 for 25 Mbps | \$45 for 100Mbps | \$70 1Gbps
- Unlimited phone: \$40 residential | \$50 business
- Construction now underway
