Help is Available to Receive the \$850 Maine Covid Relief Payment

In order to receive the \$850 "Covid Relief Payment" from the State of Maine, one must file a 2021 Maine tax return. A married couple filing a joint return will receive \$1700. There are income limits (\$100,000 single or married filing separate, \$150,000 for Head of Household, \$200,000 for married filing joint), but probably most of you reading this don't fall into those categories.

If you haven't filed your 2021 tax return, that's not a problem. You have until October 31, 2022. And the AARP Tax-Aide Program will help. With the wonderful assistance of our incredible Dr. Shaw Memorial Library librarians, we'll set up times for you to come in to get your tax return done. You may also qualify for other Maine tax credits (Property Tax Fairness Credit, which also applies to renters; and Sales Tax Fairness Credit). These other credits could add significantly to your refund.

If you have already filed your 2021 Maine tax return, you don't have to do anything. You should get a check in the mail sometime this summer (no direct deposit).

Call the library at 293-2565 and leave a message if it is outside of library hours (Mondays 3:00 – 6:00; Wednesdays 9:00 -12:00, 3:00 – 7:00; Saturdays 10:00 – 3:00).

From the Mount Vernon Select Board

The Select Board and the Budget Committee have been working on the preparation of a budget for this year's Town Meeting.

The Two major budget items are the Blake Hill Bridge and Broadband. The Bridge is in the engineering stage. We need to raise \$250,000 this year to complete the project. The State will support the remaining 60% of the cost. The Broadband Committee has been working for over four years on their project and they are very close to making a recommendation to the Town.

Items having higher increases than normal are the dispatch service and transfer station disposal fees. We also gave increased wages to all employees.

As far as the roads, we are taking a different approach. Instead of doing a construction project this year, we will hire a civil engineer to review as many tar and dirt roads as we can and prepare a bid package. The Town can go out for a 20-year bond and get a many roads as possible at one time. This worked out well for Belgrade and Readfield when they did this.

We have two ordinances to vote on at the Town Meeting. One is the Fireworks Ordinance and the other is a Solar Ordinance. Copies of both ordinances are available at the Town Office.

Spring Update from your Broadband Committee—MAY 2022

Our thanks to members of the community who actively supported the work of the committee this past month. We have been shifting from a 'study' focus to completion a digital inclusion plan and preparing for town decisions likely made early this summer.

This past month, the Mount Vernon Broadband website has been launched and had 92 visitors in the first month. We've enrolled over 300 Mount Vernon members on our email list who have begun to receive information about the decisions soon to be before the town for consideration. The two real time town meetings hosted by the community were attended by over 60 individuals, some online and some joining us in the Community Center. Given that Mount Vernon has a population of about 1600 residents, we've not yet heard from a majority of the town.

We know that town members are facing many big challenges and have little time for thinking about broadband. Better than most, committee members know that developing better town broadband services is not as simple as trusting remote corporations and subscribing to multiple online services. The work is complicated and we're thankful that the town's citizens have, in April made time and shared good questions to support this work.

We are now organizing and will host another one or two town meetings prior to the June Town Meeting. What can we do to help you and the town prepare to make the decisions that lay ahead? These decisions will involve choosing the best town infrastructure (information highway), the best service provider and the best ways to use customized home devices, user mini-grants and skill development opportunities. These decision will impact the town and your home for the next ten years (without exaggeration).

How much bandwidth do we need?

Bandwidth is a measure of how much and how fast information flows over the internet to and from you and your devices. It's measured as "megabits per second" and is provided by internet service providers (ISPs). "Download speed" is how fast information (text, videos, voice, images, etc) flows to you. "Upload speed" is how fast information goes from your computer up to the internet (e.g., sending an e-mail, paying a bill, "uploading" a photo, etc.). Previously we asked you to test your present bandwidth as a way of helping with the town's grant development work and the state's understanding of how well/poorly served the town is at present.

Now, you can click on this <u>link</u> to estimate <u>how much total bandwidth</u> you need today and to think about how much you might need in the future. To prepare for estimating your needs, you'll need to start by estimating many devices (computers, smart phones, tablets, smart TVs, internet-based alarm systems, etc.) are in your house; 2) How often to you video conference (i.e., use Zoom, Facetime, etc)?; 3) How often does someone in your house play online games?; and, 4) What is more important to you? a) monthly subscription price or b) internet down- and upload speed?

After you enter your data and zip code, you may see an advertisement from an ISP currently used by more than half the town. If service is unavailable today at your address, we expect affordable plans, being studied by your Broadband Committee, will be available and capable of meeting your needs in the future. If you discover that there is no plan currently available for your home that meets your needs, the Committee's intention is to close that gap!

 SB Crockett motioned to accept Meeting Minutes of 03-28-2022, 2nd by SB Grenier. Motion Carried, Vote was 3-0. PASS

Mount Vernon Select Board Meeting Minutes of 04-11-22 (Cont.)

- Community Center June Cauldwell presented an estimate from the Masonry School. They will Plug all the holes and put a vapor barrier down. Sweep it onto the lawn as a filter for the ground water. Fix the foundation to stabilize and raise the floor. The Community Center wants to put in a cement floor which they would like help from the town to accomplish so they can get a \$1200 discount by doing all the work at one time rather than having the Masonry School come out a second time. Estimate of 5 days to complete. Concrete footing will stabilize the foundation. The CC Committee voted to accept this option. CC has \$39K in funds, but this also includes operation costs of \$6800. Additional anticipated operating cost of approx. 2K. Changed over to on demand water heater. Old furnace and pump will remain. Also plan to put insulation under the floor.
- Need to apply for permit from DEP. SB Crockett motioned to approve Maine School of Masonry with option 1, 2 and 3B for a cost of \$14,404. 2nd by SB Grenier. Motion carried. Vote was 3-0.
 PASS
- Greg Cauldwell, Planning Board Chair discussed whether we need to send Abutter notices for informational meetings. Select Board decided this was not necessary and to continue with Abutter Notices for those projects going to Public Hearings only.

Start Planning Town Report

- Need Reports by the end of April from all Committees and Boards
- Need to decide on who will be on the cover of our 2021 Town Report
- Axium Broadband Fiber in Readfield, Fayette and Vienna. Vienna approved the concept but
 waiting for town voting. Mount Vernon Select Board is looking into this provider as well. We need
 to commit to a provider before we can look for grants to help with the expenditure. Equity helps
 people to get internet established.

Email System Update

- Licensing in place. Converting to Microsoft. SB Crockett will pull everyone's email and load into the new platform so it will flow easily. SB Crockett to look into exporting contacts into the new platform.
- Microsoft Authenticator APP suggested by SB Crockett
- After all town accounts are activated, we will be able to put files into a Share Point setup.

Mount Vernon Select Board Meeting Minutes of 04-11-22 (Cont.)

Updates on TRIO, Audit, Etc.

- TRIO Go Live happened today.
- Server is in very bad condition. If we sign the new web hosting contract, Trio can have it going
 in 5 days and pay for it in July. Contract would be back dated to today. SB Grenier motioned to
 sign the Harris contract for hosting service, \$3000 for hosting and \$500 for installation. We have
 34K in the discretionary fund.
- Motion by SB Crockett to sign the TRIO contract for the Web Version, Motion Carried. Vote was 3-0. PASS
- SB Grenier will speak with TRIO to see if we can be billed for this new contract in our next budget year. If not, will consider taking this out of the discretionary fund.

Other Business

IT Manager

- Nate Savage contract is ending and he is not interested in renewing. Scott Herrick submitted a
 proposal for \$6000 to cover the Town Hall, Library and Fire Department. Rate is \$85/hour.
 Covers 70 hours.
- SB Grenier motioned that we sign and accept Technology Service Contract from the Horn Beam Mountain Farm AKA Scott Herrick for Technology at \$6K a year. 2nd by SB Crockett. Motioned Carried, Vote was 3-0. PASS
- Horn Beam Mountain Farm Contract is Effective 7-1-2022 Alice Counts to hold for Scott Herrick's signature
- What are they doing for the Ordinance Review meeting? Public, Zoom or both. Nate needs to note that this is a Public Hearing on April 21, 2022.
- Round Stone Trailer park new owners. Select Board asked if there were any evictions going on.
 An investment company bought the park. Price was increased \$100/month which is outpricing some residents. Aging in place looking at lower income housing for seniors.
- Mother-in-law dwellings, accessory dwellings require 200 ft of frontage which removes this as a viable option.

Violations may include up to and including termination. We are not the police and we aren't able to fire elected personnel. This all needs to be covered in an AEP.

Aging In Place



During the current fiscal year (ending June 30, 2022) the Town of Mount Vernon's Aging in Place Committee had several significant achievements:

- Continued "Car Ears" phone calling by 12 volunteers as well as in person (pandemic permitting) on 75 individuals on our list of senior citizens to help them live safely and stay healthy in their homes.
- Contracted with a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) to assist in certain cases involving senior citizens which required specialized follow-up.
- Implementation of the second-ever "February FroliX" month of special events to address social isolation, AKA "cabin fever", including distribution of 50 bags of puzzles, games, cookies and cocoa to 50 households.
- Manufacture of a bulletin board to be placed in Dunn's Corner neighbor to publicize community events and Town notices (to be put up in late spring).
- Planning for an Adult Day Program to start this summer at the Mount Vernon Community Center to allow seniors to get out of the house, enjoy a meal with others, and have some fun as well as provide care-givers respite.
- Success since this past July 1st in obtaining grants totally nearly \$60,000 from:

The Maine Health Access Foundation, \$50,000.

The Harold Dudley Charitable Fund, \$6,250.

The Home Care for Maine Fund, \$1,500.

The University of Maine Center on Aging, \$1,000.

• This builds on success the prior year in winning grants from AARP Maine and the Maine Community Foundation. For the past 2 years, no tax-payer money has been required.

I want to thank the other 13 members of the committee who worked so hard this past year to help Mount Vernon's seniors age in place: Alice and Jon Olson, Carol Fuller, Dr. Dan Onion, Donna Williams, Jane Rogers, Jo Tibby, Karla Arceneaux, Kerry Casey, LCSW Laurie Rodrigues, Mary Anne Libby, Pat Rawson, and Sandy Wright.

INSPECTIONS/PROJECT UPDATES

Plumbing Training. I attended MBOIA sponsored plumbing training in Topsham on April 20th. It was necessary training as the internal plumbing code has been revised. Most notable to me was the allowance of AAV (mechanical vent) in lieu of a vent connected to the main stack. The State is also requiring closer attention to who is allowed to obtain a permit due to lax standards in earlier code versions.

Brook Trout Lane. A portion of Brook Trout Lane was improperly ditched which could allow sediments to travel down side ditches towards Desert Pond. I have spoken to both the person who did the ditching and the owner of the property abutting the ditching informing both that they are liable for any significant impacts to the pond and have requested both get together and repair the ditching area. If neither do anything then I will have to begin enforcement against both parties.

365 Pond Road. The single structure (formerly an antique shop) is located on a very small grandfathered lot in the Village District and Stream Protection District. The current owner wishes to turn the structure into a seasonal dwelling. There are questions still remaining on the validity of the existing holding tank and whether the dwelling can be converted to a residence. Discussions are continuing.
