

Help is Available to Receive the \$850 Maine Covid Relief Payment

In order to receive the \$850 "Covid Relief Payment" from the State of Maine, one must file a 2021 Maine tax return. A married couple filing a joint return will receive \$1700. There are income limits (\$100,000 single or married filing separate, \$150,000 for Head of Household, \$200,000 for married filing joint), but probably most of you reading this don't fall into those categories.

If you haven't filed your 2021 tax return, that's not a problem. You have until October 31, 2022. And the AARP Tax-Aide Program will help. With the wonderful assistance of our incredible Dr. Shaw Memorial Library librarians, we'll set up times for you to come in to get your tax return done. You may also qualify for other Maine tax credits (Property Tax Fairness Credit, which also applies to renters; and Sales Tax Fairness Credit). These other credits could add significantly to your refund.

If you have already filed your 2021 Maine tax return, you don't have to do anything. You should get a check in the mail sometime this summer (no direct deposit).

Call the library at 293-2565 and leave a message if it is outside of library hours: (Mondays 3:00 – 6:00; Wednesdays 9:00 -12:00, 3:00 – 7:00; Saturdays 10:00 – 3:00).

From the Mount Vernon Select Board

Another Town Meeting has come and gone. The meeting was well attended, with over 100 in attendance. We haven't had this many in attendance in a long time. Thank you all for coming out to vote and then for attending the meeting and voting on each article that will direct the Town's finances thru this coming year. The process started back in January with the Budget Committee meeting with the Select Board. Thanks to the Budget Committee for their help. It is always hard to try to keep spending down while maintaining adequate services for the Town.

The delineators (post) will be going up in the village soon. They are used as means of controlling the speed of the traffic in the village. This seemed to work well last summer.

The Town will have a new website design the first of July. Each department will be able to add announcements on their one section of the website. This will allow us to keep you better informed.

The engineering is completed on the Blake Hill Bridge. We are now working with the State DOT to get their approval of the plans in order to qualify for the 60% match by the State for the cost of the bridge. There is no word from the State on when the existing bridge will be removed.

The Town has signed up with Power Market to get up to 15% or around \$5500.00 in saving on our CMP bill. Power Market get credits from a community solar farm in China Maine.

The Town now have Ordinances covering Solar Farms and Fireworks. Thanks to Ordinance Review Committee for their work this year.

The Broadband Committee received approval to move forward with their work on giving the Town better and faster internet service through the Town. They can now look for grants to help defer the cost of what ever system we go with.

Congratulations to Carl Rogers being elected to the Select Board and Christine Shea being elected to the School Board.

Broadband Committee Update: **July edition**

The Broadband Committee thanks those who came to the June Town Meeting and expressed differing views and concerns about costs and benefits of having adequate broadband services in the town. The Committee is grateful the Town voted to approve the three warrant articles that will pave the way to a town vote on a plan and agreement with a specific vendor to build needed infrastructure for more adequate services for town residents and visitors of all ages.

Investing to improve broadband or leave the evolution of broadband to others, is not a simple thing. And it will be an issue for the town for years to come. Beyond the technology issues, the town is thinking about 'good enough broadband.' Issues of cost, inflation, competing priorities and uncertainties are on our collective minds. The Committee will continue working with the Select Board to develop the concrete plan. It's summer and fall meetings will be open to all and recorded for all. It's online presence will be improved. The plan proposal will be shared with the town well in advance of a scheduled town vote.

We ask all who read this article to check out the [Broadband Committee's website](#) from time to time and make sure you let us know what you think. We plan additional public meetings -- in person as health concerns permit -- and surveys and you can always write to us at: mtvbrdbnd@gmail.com. Another reason to visit the website is to monitor progress toward the broadband goal set out in the 2019 Mount Vernon Comprehensive Plan: ***providing access to high quality, affordable broadband to all in Mt. Vernon.***

Achieving four critical outcomes this year are the summer priorities for your committee:

To recommend a company to improve the current broadband infrastructure;

To submit grant(s) from the Maine Connectivity Authority and/or other matching fund source(s)


To begin implementing of a formal Digital Equity and Inclusion Plan designed to make it easier for town members to afford digital devices and access broadband services.

To support the Select Board's putting a referendum before the town to determine whether and how to implement a plan for upgrading services.

Thanks again to town members who are making the efforts to tell us how they feel about broadband services and costs to the town both now and in the future. The votes in June were close and good points were made both for and against. Thanks also to the Select Board and the Town Office in support of the committee's work. Change Coming to the Food Bank

Starting Saturday, July 2, the full food bank including meal kits, meat boxes, dry goods and personal care items, will only be available on the first and third Saturdays of the month. During June, volunteers will work with customers to make sure you are able to come to the food bank on the most convenient week.

Fresh produce, fruit, baked goods, breads and miscellaneous items will be offered every Saturday of the month; feel free to come for these items at any time. Starting June 18, we will have our local farm share, this year from Emery Farm in Wayne, so there will be lots of fresh produce for everyone. Of course, volunteers will be happy to provide any specific item(s) that customers have an immediate need for at any time.

New customers are welcome to come any Saturday and we will provide enough food to get them through to the next full food bank day.

Our hours remain the same, 9:30 to 11:30; however, we will open as soon as the food bank is completely set up. We continue to offer curbside service if you would rather not come downstairs.

On another note, we have birthday bags provided by the local Girl Scouts; please ask if you have a birthday coming up in the family.

We are grateful to Peter & Deborah Emery for presenting their picture book, The Wildlife Tree, at our opening of this year’s Story Walk at the Ezra Smith Wildlife Conservation Area this past weekend. We also want to thank the Kennebec Land Trust for managing the land and welcoming us each year for the Story Walk. The trails they have created are simply beautiful, and provide a nice walk for so many of us. The Story Walk will be at the Ezra Smith area for the summer – bring your family or visitors for a relaxing walk among the trees while you read the story by great local author (Peter) and illustrator (Deborah).

A note from our wonderful Library Trustees: Library Trustees & staff will be welcoming a new piece of artwork to the landscape at the Library in the upcoming weeks. The Board commissioned Perry Johnson, II, proprietor of FoeHammer Forge Works in Mt. Vernon, to design and construct a memorial tree to add to the garden landscape. The metal leaves for the tree will be available to purchase with engraved loved one’s names. Proceeds from the sale of leaves will go to the George Smith Memorial Fund at the library for the continued upkeep of the gardens. The pricing for the engraved metal leaves is \$20.00 each for the large size leaf, \$15.00 each for the small size leaf. A sample of the leaves may be seen at the library during regular open hours. Orders and payment may be given to the librarian in attendance. Each leaf will then be added to the tree by FoeHammer Forge Works to grow a very special and beautiful Memorial Tree.

Summer programming:

Registration for our **children’s summer reading program starts on Wednesday, June 29 at 3:30pm**, here at the library. The theme this year is “Oceans of Possibilities”! During registration, our young patrons can do some coloring on a 6-foot ocean banner, and can work with Legos and recyclables to create an ocean creature or theme. Each participant who pledges to read at least 4 hours over the summer will be given a grab bag, pencil, and reading chart with stickers. When they have reached their reading goal of 4 hours or more and hand in their reading chart, they can receive a certificate for a Gifford’s ice cream cone!

Ocean related activities will be held on **Wednesdays at 3:30pm throughout July**.

July 6: Tara Marble, a 4-H leader with the Cooperative Extension Service, will provide an activity about aquaculture. Kids can create their own fish pond and a water filter to clean the fish farm water. This will be a messy & fun experience!

July 13: Alice will read an ocean-related story, and we’ll have materials on hand to make a seascape or tide pool art project, using shells, sand, sea glass, and other ocean treasures.

July 20: Tara will be back to teach about ocean density. Children will be pirates exploring the ocean layers and create their own ocean cup that will represent these layers. There will be a related story, to help solve pirate problems!

July 27: Alice will read us a story and guide children in making two types of suncatchers, to help catch the summer’s rays of light!

The summer reading programs are free and open to a wide range of ages. We invite preschool and elementary school children to participate. There will be refreshments. We plan to meet outside (under tents, if it rains).
