A note from the Mayor...

If your calendar rolled over to February and you realized the monthly newsletter had not been released yet, I am sorry, it was indeed my fault. But truth be told, I usually write these newsletters approximately a week before the end of the month, however, in this week and this month I just couldn't do that! As you may have already noticed through the various news articles and social media posts it was a very big week for our community and it brings me great joy to finally be able to share.

#1 Big Community News:

Last week the City of Tiffin and our neighboring communities finalized agreements that will resolve the long-standing challenges at the intersection of Forevergreen Road and Old Jasper Avenue. In situations like this, no one gets everything they want, but I firmly believe the decisions made and the compromises reached by all parties involved are in the best interest of our communities.

This milestone is something we can build upon for our shared future. North Liberty will take the lead in constructing a new roundabout at the intersection, with work currently scheduled to begin in 2026. However, we are all exploring ways to expedite the timeline, as everyone has a vested interest in completing this project as soon as possible.

I want to personally thank you for your patience over the years, especially this past year. A great deal of work has gone into bringing this to the finish line, and I sincerely appreciate your trust and confidence in our ability to get it done.

#1a Big Community News:

Also last week the City of Tiffin secured the largest commercial business commitment in its history with the announcement that Homemakers Furniture is coming to town! Homemakers will establish a 200,000-square-foot facility on the parcel of land south of Pinseekers, bringing approximately 200 new jobs to the area.

The effort to bring this outstanding retailer to Tiffin began in late 2023, making it one of the most exciting and challenging projects. I truly believe this marks a turning point for our city—where commercial development will begin to catch up with the rapid residential growth that has defined Tiffin for years.

Homemakers' operational team is second to none, and their commitment to Tiffin embodies everything we could hope for in a partnership of this scale. We are thrilled to welcome them to our community!

Keep an eye out later this month or next for a State of the City update, possibly in video form. As we navigate the annual budget season, I want to provide a clear picture of our financial standing and how everything fits together, as well as outline the timelines for all ongoing and upcoming projects.

The next few years will be exciting, bringing incredible growth along with the inevitable challenges that come with it—but I wouldn't have it any other way!

Smoke Detectors

An essential safety feature for any home, smoke alarms, when properly installed and maintained, can double your chances of surviving a fire. One half of all home fire deaths occur in homes that do not have working smoke alarms. Also, while it is estimated that 94% of U.S. households have at least one smoke detector as many as one half may not be working because the batteries are dead or missing.



Carbon Monoxide

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas created when fossil fuels (such as wood, oil, natural gas and kerosene) do not burn completely. CO is the leading cause of accidental poisoning deaths in the U.S. Since you can't see it, taste it or smell it, CO can kill you before you know it's there.

As a reminder, City Ordinances requires that the City begin snow plowing or ice removal immediately after it has stopped snowing or sleeting. Plowing or sanding of emergency routes may begin sooner at the discretion of the Public Works Department. For larger snowfalls, a snow-ice emergency may be declared. In such an event, vehicles parked on all streets will have to be moved. Any vehicle found to be parked where not permitted during the emergency declaration may be towed. Towing costs will be assessed to the owner of the vehicle.

During less severe snowfalls, vehicles parked on city streets must be moved within 24 hours. Vehicles must also be removed from dead-end streets for snow to be plowed. If your vehicle has been towed, you must contact the Johnson County Sheriff's Department for a release.

Snow plowing may create a snow pile at the end of driveways that cannot be prevented. Property owners should **not** push the snow back into the streets as it will create a hazard. Please respect your neighbors and do not push your snow onto their properties as well.

Assistance is requested in keeping fire hydrants dug out for your protection and will help the fire department find the fire hydrants in an emergency.

Per ordinance, sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 48 hours after snowfall. If the City is required to clear the sidewalk, the costs will be billed or assessed for collection.

Arterial roads such as Roberts Ferry Road and Oakdale Boulevard will be plowed first. Collector roads like Croell Avenue and Goldfinch Drive will be plowed next, followed by all other local roads. The City does not plow private roads. These are marked with red street signs.

Highway 6 is maintained by the Iowa Department of Transportation.



Every second counts in an emergency

- Remove snow and ice from the hydrant
- Clear an area approximately 3 feet around the hydrant
- Clear a path from the hydrant to the street

In the United States, heart disease is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups. In 2022, 1 in every 5 deaths in the United States was caused by heart disease. That is 1 every 33 seconds.

Eat a heart-healthy diet, get plenty of sleep, do not smoke, and stay physically active. Lifestyle is hugely important for heart health: About 80% of cardiovascular diseases, including heart disease and stroke, can be prevented.

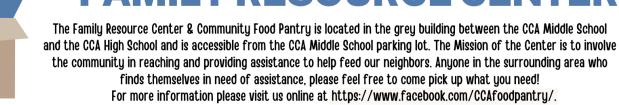
