AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO HOVERBOARDS, ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE SAFE OPERATION OF MOTORIZED SCOOTERS UPON THE STREETS AND ALLEYS, AND PROHIBITING OPERATION ON THE SIDEWALKS WITHIN THE CITY OF TIPTON MISSOURI, CONTAINING DEFINITIONS, A PENALTY CLAUSE AND AN EMERGENCY CLAUSE.

WHEREAS, the proliferation of hoverboard usage on the streets, alleys, and sidewalks within the city of Tipton, MO has led to concerns regarding public safety, pedestrian congestion, and potential hazards to both riders and pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tipton possesses the authority and responsibility to enact regulations aimed at preserving public safety and ensuring orderly conduct on city streets, alleys, and sidewalks, pursuant to its municipal governance powers and obligations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Alderpersons of the City of Tipton, Missouri as follows:

Section 1. Definitions

- A. Hoverboard – shall mean a way of transport resembling a skateboard that travels above the surface of the ground, ridden in a standing position. A hoverboard is a single person device, consisting of a platform for the feet mounted on two wheels and controlled by the way the rider distributes their weight. A hoverboard can be battery operated, electronic, gas, or otherwise motorized and this ordinance shall over all operation types.
- B. Streets, Alleys, Sidewalks – shall have the same definition as found in Section 560.120(A).

Section 2. Operation of Hoverboards

A. Prohibition of Operation of Hoverboards on City Sidewalks

Hoverboards shall be prohibited from operation along the city sidewalks in the City of Tipton, Missouri where such operation would inhibit or prevent regular pedestrian traffic from occurring. For clarification, if a person walking on the sidewalk had to step off the sidewalk to allow the operation of the hoverboard to occur, this would be a violation by the operator of the hoverboard of this section of the Code.

B. Operation of Hoverboards on City Streets and Alleys

- 1. Every person operating a motorized scooter shall have all the rights and is subject to all the provisions applicable to the driver of any other vehicle as established by ordinance, including, but not limited to, ordinances concerning driving under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs, except those provisions, which, by their very nature, can have no application.
- 2. Any person operating a hoverboard on city streets or alleys shall have the same operator licensure as required by Missouri statute, including a valid driver's license.
- 3. Any person operating a hoverboard on city streets or alleys shall have insurance as required by any operator of a motor vehicle on city streets and alleys within the City of Tipton or as required by the State of Missouri.

Section 3. Penalty

Any person who violates any provision of this Section is guilty of an infraction and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than dollars \$500.00 (five hundred dollars). Such an infraction does not constitute a crime and conviction shall not give rise to any disability or legal disadvantage based on conviction of a criminal offense. If any person under seventeen (17) years of age violates any provision of this Section in the presence of a peace officer possessing the duty and power of arrest for violation of the general criminal laws of the State or for violation of ordinances of Counties or municipalities of the State, said officer shall impound the hoverboard involved for a period not to exceed ten (10) days upon issuance of a receipt to the child riding it or to its owner.

Section 4. This Ordinance repeals all ordinances or portions of ordinances in conflict herewith.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.
