 - ▶ 3 Part-time Firefighter/Paramedic
 - ▶ 2 Part-time Firefighter/EMT
 - ▶1 Part-time Fire Chief
 - ▶ 1 Part-time Assistant Fire Chief
 - Provides an Immediate Response to Your emergency

Town of Vernon FD Night Staffing

- Current staffing consists of:
 - 5 Personnel- 1800 to 0600 hours
 - ▶1 Paid on Call Lieutenant/Paramedic/EMT
 - ▶ 2 Paid on Call Firefighter/Paramedics
 - ▶ 2 Paid on Call Firefighter/EMT's
 - ▶ 2 Battalion Chief's
 - ▶1 Part-time Fire Chief
 - ▶ 1 Part-time Assistant Fire Chief
 - Provides an Immediate Response to your Emergency as we typically have 5 in the station at night
 - " Members stay at station if they live out of area"

2018 Accomplishments

- We continued to develop working relationships with our neighbors with shared services
 - Paramedic program with Town of Waukesha FD
 - Town of Waukesha sends us a Ladder Truck automatically for reported structure fires
 - Waterford has now gone online as a Paramedic Provider and serves as a resource for the VFD, WFD now responds automatically with an ALS unit to all reported structure fires

2018 Accomplishments

- Awarded a DNR Wildland Grant for new skid unit for ARGO UTV. 50/50 Grant
- Conducted Live Fire Training Burn
 - Members received invaluable practical training
- ▶ ISO Evaluation for the VFD, new PPC is a 5
 - Improvement due to continued staffing
 - More firefighting capacity (2500 Gallon Engine)
 - Automatic Aid on initial alarm (ARA) for additional staffing and water

Emergency Calls for Service

- ▶ Total calls 636
 - 426- Approximately 67% were of a medical nature (EMS)
 - 210- Approximately 23% were for fire or service nature
 - Average response time was 6 Min 30 Sec for non-mutual aid calls

Estimated Fire Loss

- ▶ 2018 Estimated Fire loss was \$425,000
 - House Explosion with fire
 - Several vehicle fires





 - Medical Examiner



Fire Service Costs

- New Fire Engine \$550,000 to 650,000
- New Rescue Truck \$750,000
- New Ambulance \$245,000
- New SCBA \$7,000
- ► New defibrillator \$30,000
- New set of protective gear \$2,000
- New Thermal Imaging Camera \$5,000
- ▶ Paramedic Tuition \$5,000 to 6,000
- ► EMT Tuition- 1,400
