Reimbursement for professional consulting services: The Planning Board, in the review of an application, may refer the application to such engineering, planning, environmental or other technical consultant as such board shall deem reasonably necessary to enable it to review the application as required by law. Charges made by such consultants must be in accord with those usually made for such services, the applicant must be notified before any charges are incurred and the Village Board must approve the charges before they are incurred.

8. Attendance by applicant or representative (designated in writing by applicant) is required at the scheduled Planning Board meeting for any action to be taken.

NOTE: A request for Subdivision cannot be placed on the Planning Board agenda until the Code Enforcement Officer certifies the submittal is complete and contains all the information that is required.

A public hearing is required for all Subdivision applications.
