Sanford Village Council Minutes Feb. 11, 2019

The regular meeting of the Sanford Village Council was held on February 11, 2019 at the Jerome Township Hall. The meeting was called to order by President Dolores Porte at 7:00 PM.

Guest: Jolly Richardson from the Tree Dr. -He inspected the Ash trees in the Village Park that have been treated in the past and states "they all look in good health". He recommends treating the trees every two years for optimal health, but the Village could choose to treat the trees every three years. This may not get the same results though. Lon inquired what the cost increase would be to add the two Ash trees that are on the former Senior Center property that is now Village Park property. The current bid for treating the Ash trees is \$2430 the additional trees would increase the bid by \$325 making overall bid for all the Ash trees in the Village park \$2755. Council asked Jolly if the trees currently being treated would need to be treated for life. Jolly responded that in 6-8 years possibly the Ash Bore would have moved out of the area but there is no guarantee and that the trees would need to be treated as long as the Ash Bore are in the area. If the trees are not treated and there is Ash Bore in the area, they will die with in 7 years. The current cost for treating the trees to date is \$10,000. Carl and Don discussed letting the trees die off and instead of treating the trees putting funding into purchasing new pest resistant trees to grow in as the Ash die off. The council investigated the price for replacing trees and one vendor showed that the Village could purchase 10-12 ft trees in quantity of 10-20 trees for \$146 -\$200 per tree (estimate for replacing 31 trees approx. \$6,200). Robert Carl added that new trees require water, it will take longer for the mowing of the park, and when the old trees die off the Village will need to have them removed which all add to extra costs. Council members brought up the idea of keeping the largest and best Ash trees treating them and letting the smaller ones die off and replacing them. Carl stated that if we decide to continue to treat the trees that the council needs to have it go out for bids. Robert Carl stated that there is no advantage to biding out the trees since the Tree Dr. had previously agreed to treat the trees at supply cost only. The council agreed to place an ad in the Midland Daily News for bids on the Ash tree treatment and to have Jolly check with Dave (the owner of Tree. Dr.) on the exact number of trees to be treated. The issue of treating the Ash trees will be revisited after bids have been submitted.

- 9. Subdivision Requirements- Discussion on Flag lots and their history. (too small of parcels=too small roadway)
 - The Village of Sanford's tax base is 31% Churches =non-taxable
 - -Discussion should the Village develop a Road? Don suggested that due to the fact that properties have issues of not perking, owner not subdividing and drainage issues that the cost would be more than the possible income from taxable properties.
 - -Discussion that a permit would be issued with the stipulation that only one house and one pole barn can be built on the properties, and that he has 70' at the road frontage. The house must be built before the pole barn can be built on the property. Dolores will have Bill Fahey and Brett Spangler work on the language in the permit to be issued.
- 10. Mitchell and Crescent- Discussion on the properties- -they are not generating any property taxes-Crescent wont perk-Mitchell is land locked-Carl suggested offering the property owners adjacent to our property's opportunity for purchase at a reasonable price it then puts it into their hands and can generate taxable revenue. Marlene agrees that this is a good idea. The council agreed to offer up the properties and Dolores would speak to a realtor about the Crescent St. property.
