 - a) Losses and expenses suffered by any of the Indemnified Parties; and
 - b) Demands or claims made against any of the Indemnified Parties by the applicant or any third party because of any injury (including death) or property damage in anyway arising out of the Applicant's activities, except any injury or damage caused solely by any negligent acts or omissions of an Indemnified Party. This section will survive the termination of this permit.

PAVILION RESERVATIONS: VILLAGE PARK REGULATIONS

VILLAGE OF SANFORD ORDINANCE NO. 33

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SANFORD VILLAGE PARK; PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF; AND FOR THE REPEAL OF SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE No. 10-4, IN THE VILLAGE OF SANFORD, COUNTY OF MIDLAND, STATE OF MICHIGAN.

Section 1. VILLAGE PARK-PROHIBITED ACTS GENERALLY, A PERSON SHALL NOT:

- (a) Enter, use or occupy lands or water when the lands are posted prohibiting such entry, use or occupancy.
- (b) Destroy, damage or remove Village property, trees, shrubs, wildflowers, planted grasses or other vegetation without first obtaining written permission.
- (c) Enter or remain in the Village Park between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise without written permission.
- (d) Peddle or solicit business of any nature; distribute handbills or other advertising matter; post signs on any lands, waters, structures, or property; or use such areas as a base of commercial operations without first obtaining proper written permission.
- (e) Use a loudspeaker, public address system, or sound-amplifying equipment of any kind without proper written permission. Permission shall not be granted if such equipment is capable of interfering with the use and enjoyment of the park by others. A person shall not operate any motor, motorboat, motor vehicle, radio, television, phonograph, tape recorder or any other device in such a matter as to create excessive noise that may disturb or annoy others.
- (f) Engage in any violent, abusive, loud, boisterous, wanton, profane, obscene or otherwise disorderly conduct tending to create a breach of the peace; disturb or annoy others; loiter, sit or lie upon walks, passages, steps or road thereby obstructing the free passage of others; remove or damage the property of another.
- (g) Build fires except in designated fire pits or grills that are approved by the DPW Supervisor or his representative.
- (h) Dump, place, throw or cause or permit the dumping, placing, throwing, or leaving of litter in the park, except in containers provided; deposit refuse or waste material that has originated outside the park in receptacles or dumpsters provided for park uses; set fire to the contents of a refuse or trash containers or place or burn garbage in a fire pit or stove.
- (i) Store or leave a boat, trailer, camper or other property in the park without first obtaining written permission.

Section 2. MOTOR VEHICLES.

- (a) A person shall not operate or park a motor vehicle except on designated roads or designated parking areas; operate a motor vehicle on a park road or parking lot at a speed in excess of 10 miles per hour, in an unsafe manner, at a speed greater than that posted or to disobey traffic or parking signs. When a motor vehicle is found parked in the Village Park, the registration plate displayed on the motor vehicle shall constitute prima facie evidence that the owner of the vehicle is the person who parked it there.
- (b) A person shall not operate a motor driven vehicle or any motorized device except on roads and parking lots constructed for the operation of licensed vehicles.
- (c) A person shall not operate an unlicensed vehicle on a park road or parking lot.

- (d) A person shall not leave a vehicle in the park overnight without written permission.

Section 3. ANIMALS-PROHIBITED ACTS. A PERSON SHALL NOT:

- (a) Possess a dog or other animal unless it is under immediate control on a leash not exceeding six (6) feet in length.
- (b) Leave a dog or other animal unattended at any time; permit a dog or other animal to run loose or create a disturbance; or to fail to properly control a dog or other animal. Any dog found not in the possession of, or under the immediate control of its owner or the owner's agent, or any dog creating a nuisance or disturbance, may be removed from the park.
- (c) Ride, permit or allow horses, or other riding animals, within the Sanford Village Park.

Section 4. FIREARMS AND HUNTING. PROHIBITED ACTS. A PERSON SHALL NOT:

- (a) Carry or have in possession a firearm or bow and arrow.
- (b) Hunt, trap, kill, capture or intentionally disturb any bird, animal or other wildlife.
- (c) Discharge any device that propels a projectile by gas, air, spring or rubber.

Section 5. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THESE RULES.

- (a) "Proper written permission" means a written permit issued by the DPW Supervisor, his authorized representatives or the Village Clerk.
- (b) "Unlicensed Vehicle" means any motorized device.

Section 6. EXCEPTIONS. Village employees acting in the line of duty or persons performing specific acts authorized by written permission are exempt from the provisions of these rules.

Section 7. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

- (a) Violation of any park rule may result in eviction from Sanford Village Park. Violation of any park rule may also result in a criminal complaint being initiated.
- (b) Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars or ninety (90) days in jail or both.
- (c) In the alternative to Section 7(b) herein, to the extent permitted by law, the Village of Sanford may issue a civil citation to any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance. Said civil citation shall carry a fine of not more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars.

Section 8. SEVERABILITY. Any and all sections, terms, provisions and/or clauses herein shall be deemed independent and severable. Should any Court of competent jurisdiction hold any section, term, provision or clause void and/or invalid, all remaining sections, terms, provisions and/or clauses not held void and/or invalid shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 9. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and shall be of no further force and effect; specifically repealing Section 2 of Ordinance No. 10.4.

Section 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take full force and effect thirty (30) days after publication.
