The Illinois Department of Public Health Plumbing Code requires that vacuum breakers be installed on all outdoor faucets. These devices protect the water supply from being contaminated by any substance which might enter the water hose and flow back into the system (i.e. fertilizer, herbicides, soap, etc.) Hose vacuum breakers can be purchased at most hardware stores and home and garden centers.

Mandatory Cross Connection Control Survey is enclosed

The water system is required by the EPA to have a Cross Connection Control Program in place. Part of the program is a mandatory Bi-Annual Cross Connection Control Survey to be filled out by all residents and businesses connected to the water system.

SECTION 11. VIOLATIONS

A. The Superintendent of Water shall deny or discontinue, after reasonable notice to the occupants thereof, the water service to any premises wherein any cross-connection control survey is not completed and turned in or backflow prevention device required by these regulations is not installed, tested, maintained and repaired in a manner acceptable to the Superintendent of Water, or if it is found that the backflow prevention device has been removed or bypassed, or if an unprotected cross-connection exists on the premises, or if a low pressure cut-off required by these regulations is not installed and maintained in working order.

B. Water service to such premises shall not be restored until the consumer has completed, corrected or eliminated such conditions or defects in conformance with these regulations and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Water, and the required reconnection fee is paid.
