ORDINANCE NO. 2023-1

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILPERSON

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO DURING THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2023 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS: Appropriations must be made for current expenses and expenditures of the Village of Walton Hills to allow for the proper functioning of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That in order to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the Village of Walton Hills during the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriations made as follows:

SECTION 3. That the Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the Village Treasury for payments from the foregoing appropriation upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers; therefore, authorized by law to approve the same, or this Ordinance of Council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or Ordinance; and provided further that the appropriations for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of two-thirds (2/3) vote of Council for any lawful purposes that could not be reasonably foreseen at the time of adoption of the appropriations measure.

SECTION 4. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that said measure is necessary for the daily operation of the Village and such sums must be immediately available; wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the members elected to Council, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-7

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILPERSON

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF APPROPRIATION FUND 1000-110-190-7906, FORMERLY CALLED “PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF HEALTHCARE”, TO NOW BE CALLED “PAYOUTS FOR POLICE RETIREMENT”, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Walton Hills wishes to designate funds to be used to payout any unused leave balances to police at retirement; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Village of Walton Hills to appropriate funding to this account on an annual basis, in an amount to be determined during the course of the year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Village of Walton Hills hereby declares account 1000-110-190-7906 to be used to appropriate funding of payouts for Police retirements.

SECTION 2. Each year the amount of funds to be appropriated will be discussed and reviewed at each Finance Committee meeting.

SECTION 3. The Mayor, Council and Fiscal Officer of the Village of Walton Hills may also pre-determine a minimum amount to appropriate to the fund each year.

SECTION 7. The Village Council finds and determines that all formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution was taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with the law.

SECTION 8. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare for the reason stated in the preamble hereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Village Council and signature of the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1220.01 (b) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE REGARDING TERM LIMITS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Walton Hills has expressed a desire to limit the terms of Planning Commission Members to encourage public participation and provide opportunities to individuals who wish to participate in government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. That section 1220.01 (b) which currently reads:

(b) When a position on the Planning Commission becomes vacant, the Mayor shall appoint the successor within 45 days of the creation of the vacancy, subject to approval of the Legislative Authority for the unexpired term, or full-term as the case may be. However, in the event the Mayor fails to make the appointment within 45 days to fill the vacancy, Council may fill the vacancy by a majority vote. The Mayor shall notify Council of the appointment within the 45-day time period to satisfy this provision. Council's failure to confirm any appointment of the Mayor shall result in a new, 45-day time period for the Mayor to present a new appointment. Where the outgoing Commission Member has served with distinction and desires to continue their service to the Village, the Mayor and Council shall reserve the right to give priority to that applicant in considering their reappointment to another term. Letters of interest may be completed and submitted to the Mayor by residents who are interested in the open seat on the Planning Commission. All letters of interest will be open for public review.
