- **1. Call to Order**: The Mayor Called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance is spoken.
- **3. Moment of Silence:** Mayor Kolograf asked for a moment of silence for our deceased resident Lorna Palumbo and for world peace.
- 4. Roll Call: Councilpersons Neilsen, Brenner-Miller, Allen, Spitznagel and Weeden were all present.
- 5. Persons having business before council: Representative Tony Ramos from NOPEC gave an update on NOPEC. They have recaptured approximately 80% of their customers since last spring. Walton Hills had 789 residents last summer and now have closer to 795 customers with NOPEC including 550 residents participating in the gas plan. There is a new energy audit program NOPEC offers that covers 60%-100% of the cost of qualifying energy audits for both small businesses and local governments. Some questions were answered regarding how to find out if you are with NOPEC. The current price is 6.45 cents per KWH compared to the utilities price of 12 cents per KWH. He noted that the Apples-to-Apples website offers pricing comparisons with private energy providers if residents choose to compare.

Andrew Liscoe, a fifth-grade student from St. Michaels school came with his parents to ask for support for the approval for the resolution regarding school transportation. He explained his reasons why council should support the resolution.

- <u>6. Walton Walkers Presentation</u>: Debbie Kozak made a presentation on the benefits of walking and the Walton Walkers Club. She presented the walkers with awards showing the total steps each member has walked. The Village presented Mrs. Kozak with an outstanding VIP volunteer award.

Councilwoman Allen said she understood the transportation issues he is facing.

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILPERSON

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO PROVIDE NON-UNION EMPLOYEES WITH AN EQUITY ADJUSTMENT TO THEIR COMPENSATION RETROACTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023, PURSUANT TO THE RECOMMENDATION OF YOUR PARTNER IN HR FOR THE REASONS STATED BELOW, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Mayor engaged Your Partner in HR to conduct a Compensation Project and Summary that recommended proposed increases based on the Project Summary considering averages in Northeast Ohio and in consideration of employee retention given the competitive nature in the market; and

WHEREAS, Council approved the recommendations of said study in Ordinance number 2023-5 which modified various provisions of Chapter 260 of the Village Codified Ordinances as part of the Village's periodic review of employment positions, wages and other compensation effective January 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council wish to modify the non-union employees compensation to be competitive with other communities and to encourage employee retention.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: That the Council for the Village hereby authorizes the Mayor to provide non-union employees with an equity adjustment as recommended by said study effective January 1, 2023 in the interest stated above and previously approved by Council in said ordinance.

SECTION 2: That the Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to appropriate an amount not to exceed _______ in 2023 to pay said compensation and amend the 2023 budget accordingly.

SECTION 3: That all formal actions of Council relating to the adoption of this ordinance, and all deliberations of Council and any of its committees leading to such action, were in meetings open to the public as required by R.C. 121.22.

SECTION 4: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare to expedite the changes; wherefore this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon receiving the affirmative

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILPERSON

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE FISCAL OFFICER OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH UNUM FOR DENTAL INSURANCE COVERAGE AND VSP VISION CARE FOR VISION FOR ALL ELIGIBLE VILLAGE EMPLOYEES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village of Walton Hills provides basic healthcare, dental, vision, and prescriptive drug insurance as a benefit to all eligible Village employees; and

WHEREAS, Oswald Companies, Third Party Administration for the Village of Walton Hills, has procured and reviewed proposals from various healthcare insurance providers and recommends renewal with Unum and VSP Vision Care.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WALTON HILLS, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Fiscal Officer of the Village of Walton Hills are hereby authorized and directed to enter into the agreement with UNUM and VSP Vision Care for dental and vision insurance coverage for all eligible Village employees.

SECTION 2. This Council finds and determines that all formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare for the reason stated in the preamble hereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Village Council and signature of the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
