

## **SELECTMEN'S MEETING SUMMARY**

### **September 26, 2012**

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel with Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue also present.

The summary of the September 19, 2012, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant of \$4,071.26 and an accounts payable warrant of \$20,237.74. As of September 26<sup>th</sup> there was \$116,294.57 in the operating account and \$688,763.35 in the interest bearing sweep account.

Jonathan Daniel., Road Commissioner, was absent but provided a written report of his activities Sep 16-22. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept his report. Duane reported that the computer sander on P-400 is inoperative. The truck will need to be taken to H.P. Fairfield for and analysis and cost estimate. Don reminded the selectmen that the annual inspection of the bucket loader needs to be completed before winter.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer was present and had no written report. Bob provided updates on the following issues:

- Bob met with Lawrence Nash and Martha Johnston-Nash on September 24 on the Nash's property on Washington Pond. Both parties have reached an agreement of discrepancies that need to be corrected and permits acquired. Bob will assist the Nash's in the permitting process.
- Bob reported that he had conducted a second dye test on the Mole septic system and again found no sign of effluent reaching the surface or any dye on the surface.
- Bob has completed 7 inspections of current mining operations and has 18 to go.

The selectmen voted unanimously to hire a grader and operator from the Town of Union at a rate of \$61.25 per hour. Dig safe will be contacted next week and grading of gravel roads is expected to occur sometime during the last two weeks of October.

The selectmen discussed the purchase of a 75 gallon skid tank to use for refueling the bucket loader and backhoe. No decision was reached.

The selectmen voted unanimously to contact with Heal Connections to administer the drug and alcohol testing program for eh road maintenance crew as is required by federal regulations.

Don will complete and file with MMA the annual LD-1 survey which seeks information on the property tax levy limit. The selectmen will meet in executive session at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, October 3 for the purpose of completing a job interview.

The selectmen voted unanimously to put out to bid the plowing of Lincoln Road, Cattle Pound Road, Albert Jones Road, Mitchell Hill Road. These roads are all short roads and the plow trucks have a difficult time turning around.

The selectmen completed their annual inspections of automobile graveyards and recycling facilities on September 26<sup>th</sup>. They voted unanimously to issue annual permits to Nettie Turner/David Turner, Route 17 Auto Sales, Jackson Salvage (at the new facility), and Midcoast Auto Sales. The permits were completed and signed for mailing.

With no additional business to come before the board, the selectmen adjourned at 7:48 pm.
