

SELECTMEN'S MEETING SUMMARY
April 10, 2013

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel with Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue also present.

The selectmen accepted a check from John Medeika in the amount of 17,550.83 as approved at the annual town meeting for the sale of property foreclosed by the town for unpaid property taxes. They then signed a quitclaim deed for the property. This completes the action that has been going on for four years.

The summary of the April 3, 2013, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant of \$3,274.93 and an accounts payable warrant of \$15,928.15.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent but had a written report of his activities March 31 – April 6. The selectmen voted unanimously to accept Jonathan's report.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer, was present but had no written report. Bob briefed the selectmen on the status of the following open issues:

- 1) Bob met with Tim Jackson's attorney and reviewed the pictures of the land use violation at Mr. Jackson's previous business site.
- 2) Bob met with the surveyor and engineer representing Berkley and Nancy Linscott regarding their possible submission of an application for a gravel pit on McDowell Road.
- 3) It was noted that the Schroyer subdivision may also result in a gravel pit application.

Jeff Reed was present and asked where the letter was that was to stipulate what has to be done and the timeframe to get it done for Dorothy Reed's property on Calderwood Road. Bob will take care of it by Monday. If not, Duane will personally deliver the letter.

Duane is still gathering information for the paving bid packages to go out soon.

The selectmen voted unanimously to donate 20 green trash bags to Dave Eschel to clean up after his fire last winter. They also voted to donate bags to any organization that has a roadside cleanup program.

Henry Saino asked if anyone had ever considered placing Styrofoam under culverts so winter frost would have less effect on them. None of the selectmen had any idea if that was possible.

With no further business to come before the board, the selectmen adjourned at 8:15 pm.
