

SELECTMEN'S MEETING SUMMARY
July 3, 2013

The weekly selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Selectman Wesley Daniel with Selectmen Donald Grinnell and Duane Vigue also present.

The summary of the June 26, 2013, selectmen's meeting was approved as written.

The selectmen voted unanimously to approve a payroll warrant of \$3,898.64 and an accounts payable warrant of \$14,988.45. An online review of accounts at Machias Savings Bank showed \$99,030.13 in the operating account and \$155,837.65 in the interest bearing sweep account. The selectmen reviewed the TRIO expense report dated July 3rd. Tax bills are at the printer office and will be mailed shortly.

Jonathan Daniel, Road Commissioner, was absent but provided a report of his activities June 23-29. The selectmen voted unanimously to approve his report. Ditching and culvert replacement on the Bill Luce road have been completed in anticipation of this year's paving project.

Robert Temple, Code Enforcement Officer, was present but had no written report. Bob discussed the following items:

- 1) There is a pending cell tower application for 147 Liberty Road. He is working to ensure all application requirements are met before it is submitted to the planning board.
- 2) He will be investigating an unpermitted 5th wheel camper on Johnston Lane.

The selectmen must hold a public hearing for a revised Appendix A to the General Assistance Ordinance as a result recent action by the Maine State Legislature. The public hearing will be Wednesday, July 17, at 7:00 in the Bryant Room.

Wes has been informed that all the cars in the late Ruben Tuttle's automobile graveyard are being crushed and removed.

All were reminded of the special town meeting and a public hearing in the Bryant Room next Wednesday. It is posted online and around town. It was also posted in the Kennebec Journal

With no further business to come before the board, the selectmen adjourned at 7:30 pm.
