



## Selectmen's /Assessors Meeting Summary

August 12, 2020

7:00 P.M.

**Selectmen Present:** Wesley Daniel, Tom Johnston, Berkley Linscott,

**Others Present:** Mary Anderson-Town Clerk, Bob Temple, Peg Hobbs, Frank Jones, Jr. (Happy Birthday Frank)

Wesley Daniel called the Selectmen's Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**Approve Summary of August 5, 2020:** Motion to approve summary by Tom Johnston, Berkley Linscott 2<sup>nd</sup>, All in favor, Motion's carried.

### **Sign Treasurer's Warrant dated August 12, 2020:**

Payroll Warrant #65- \$3,555.22

A/P Vendor Warrant #66- \$191,360.67 (includes the School Payment and garage repair down payment)

### **Road Foreman Report:** Written by Frank Jones, Jr. and read by Wesley Daniel:

8/03/2020: 6:30am-4:30pm - We took the seat out of P-300 and took P-300 to Paul's; Unplugged culvert on Vanner Rd.

8/04/2020: 6:30am-4:30pm - We put seat back in P-200 and fix lights; Picked up trash at the lakes and the park.

8/05/2020: 6:30am-4:30pm - Down trees on Old Union, Old County and Mountain Roads; Worked on P-400 fuel tank.

8/06/2020: 6:00am-4:00pm - We put up 911 signs on Gee, Bonazzoli and Calderwood Road; Took the Z off Holt Lane; Opened up Culvert on Vanner Road.

Wesley Daniel stated that Frank Jones Jr. brought the P-300 to Paul's to have the heater cores cleaned out. They were cleaned out but are in bad shape and need to be replaced. It will cost \$1020 for new cores. They will be replaced toward the end of the year. Frank stated that the new truck is in at HP Fairfields; Tom Johnston asked if anyone had spoken to Hagar and no one has spoken to Hager regarding paving. It was decided that the paving will be postponed until next year due to budgetary issues.

**CEO Report:** Bob Temple stated the DEP and Forestry Departments are going to handle the situation regarding the land clearing that was done within 100' of Washington Pond on Prescott Road; He is working on a finding of fact for the Welch Solar Array project. They are hoping for a Planning Board meeting the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of September; Bob is going to send reminders to the pit owners regarding inspections and permit payments.

**Health Officer Report:** Not present.

**Town Clerk/Treasurer's Report:** Mary Anderson stated the bank balance is \$129,418.22; The garage loan closed and the Truck loans will close Tuesday August 18<sup>th</sup> at noon; The computer updates have been causing problems; Anne Dean was in town and stopped by the office to say hi, she's doing well.

**Other Agenda Items:**

-Peg Hobbs for Recreation Committee: Peg Hobbs stated that the cages need to be taken off of the old dugouts before the new one will be built; Frank Jones Jr. stated that since they are down a man, they may not have time to remove the cages and Peg stated that she and Leo would take them off. Frank Jones Jr. stated that they are going to take the dugout that is still standing over to the town garage to be used for storage. Soccer is still up in the air because of COVID-19. Peg is concerned and wants be sure that everyone is safe. Peg is going to continue to work on a plan.

-Wesley Daniel presented two estimates for tree removal at Maple Grove Cemetery:

Benner's- \$300- \$400+/- to clean up; \$1,500-\$1,800 to remove the whole tree

Green's- \$775 to clean up; \$2,950 to remove the whole tree

Ray Gushee- \$250 to clean up but he wouldn't feel comfortable removing the whole tree.

The Selectmen chose to go with Benner's to clean up for now and to remove the whole tree when there is room in the budget for it.

-Plowing the town grounds: The town is going to plow the boat launches and the rest will go out to bid next week.

**Questions and Comments:**

-Tom Johnston is going to speak to the Holly and George Stone regarding 911 addresses for the Medomak camps. He also plans on reaching out to Med-O-Lark.
