Road Foreman Report: Written by Frank Jones, Jr. and read by Tom Johnston:

3/14/2021: 6:30am to 7:30pm- Steven, Jason, Jimmy and Frank worked on Prescott Road it took 42 loads of stone.

3/15/2021: 6:30am to 5:30pm- Greg, Steven and Frank worked on Old County Road, it took 22 loads of stones.

3/16/2021: 6:00am to 5:30pm- Worked on Sprague Road, it took 16 loads of stone, Skidmore Road took 4 loads of stone.

3/17/2021: 6:30am to 5:30pm- Worked on the Mountain Road, it took 22 loads of stone, Lenfest Road took 4 loads of stone, Greg left at 4:30pm.

Town Clerk/Treasurer's Report: Mary Anderson stated that they presented the Boston Post cane to Elizabeth Grinnell, who is 96 and the oldest resident in Washington. She sent pictures of Betty receiving the Cane into the Kennebec Journal and Courier; We received a Revenue Share for \$9,279.04; Mary received proposals for a new copier and website upgrade-she is going to wait until after the Town Meeting to respond to the proposals. Mary stated that we are ready for the Town Election and Meeting.
