Estell Avenue Project, Core Samples, Field work, survey for second portion of Estell Avenue design to be completed, DOT App for 2024 due on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.  
Question from Henry Goldsmith to Engineer regarding sewer/water system in Oaks of Weymouth Fralinger stated wastewater treatment plants and wells was not their Engineering expertise.  
Concerns from Oaks Resident, Gregory Freelon with odor in the water and where might it be coming from. Susan Stiles noted that Capital Improvement is clarified better in other towns and Weymouth should update our ordinances with better language.  
Tom Parsons stated he does his best to inform Oaks Residents regarding Rent Control, etc. but sometimes information gets misinterpreted after others share. Mayor Haeser noted that there is a huge misconception that the Township is the Rent Control Board which they are **NOT**. The disconnect is prevalent. He attends meetings to give reports on township business only.
